WEATHER SUMMARY

Low pressure area along the west coast will help to keep temperatures cooler and humidity's higher for this time of year. The winds will end up being stronger than normal with afternoon ridgetop gusts between 15 and 20 mph. Other than a slight decrease in humidity's and increase in temperatures Thursday weather conditions will be similar the next two days.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: The fire is located in steep topography of the Mokelumne river drainage. The fire is burning in mainly grass and brush, with some oak and pine tree stands and standing dead snags. Overall, expect continued upcanyon fire spread with occasional spread upslope. Overnight downcanyon winds will limit inversions, allowing for continued activity until the early hours of the morning. Diurnal wind shifts are very predominant in this area and occur regularly just after sunset and again just after sunrise. When the winds are transitioning during these times, expect an inversion to settle in before lifting out again with the increase in winds and resulting increase in fire activity.

SPECIFIC:

Branches I, III, V: Expect continued activity to challenge the lines near the ridgetops and on the flank dropping into the canyon on the eastern portion. Short intense upslope runs are possible when winds and slope are in alignment, and could produce short range spotting, especially in the receptive grass fuel beds. Spotting distances are generally 100 to 300 feet.

Branches X, XII, XIV: Fire will make pushes out of the main canyon on the eastern portion with moderate intensity. Expect swirling winds near confluences of the main river and tributary drainages. Short range spotting is possible but should not be resistive to control efforts.

Air Operations: Smoke inversion will obscure the fire area during the transition in winds in the morning, but will lift out around 1000. Once the smoke clears, opportunities for air operations may present themselves on the ridges first then into the canyon itself.

SAFETY

- Be aware of diurnal wind shifts throughout the morning and evening.
- Short intense fire runs are possible. Make sure you know where your safety zone is at and the time it takes to get there.

It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera loses their situational awareness.

The Public Information Office would like copies of the video and pictures that you safely took while not in an emergency situation, fire suppression activity or in an overhead assignment. Bring your video and pictures to the Public Information trailer; they will be reviewed and possibly uploaded to our many CAL FIRE social media sites. Remember, we don't want photographs or videos that depict unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances, which are a serious breach of ethics.

LOST AND FOUND – The Information Section will manage lost and found items for the incident. If you have lost an item please leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information Section with your contact information as well.

MAIL SERVICE – The Information Section can assist you with sending and receiving mail.
