WEATHER DISCUSSION: An onshore/southwesterly flow pattern will remain over the fire through the operational period. Temperatures this afternoon will be a few degrees warmer with highs around 90 degrees with temperatures falling into the lower to mid 60s tonight. Relative humidity will drop to around 20 percent this afternoon with moderate recovery tonight. Ridgetop winds will generally remain light and southwesterly with typical diurnal winds at lower elevations.

On Saturday, persistence conditions are anticipated. However for Sunday into early next week, a warming and drying trend is expected.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY

Temperatures will increase slightly to near normal ranges, with humidity values dropping another 10 to 12%. Overnight humidity recovery decreases slightly from previous nights, but we will still see decent recovery. Winds will generally be terrain driven, strongest in the afternoon and evening.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: The fire is located in steep topography of the Mokelumne river drainage. The fire is burning in mainly grass and brush, with some oak and pine tree stands and standing dead snags from the 2015 Butte fire. With the higher temperatures and lower humidity's, expect activity in the islands and fingers due to the holdover heat. When alignment of slope and wind is not present, there is not enough convective heating for the brush to be receptive to burning.

SPECIFIC:

Branches I, III: Fire activity is primarily in the heavier fuels and drainages with oaks and pine trees but expect minimal fire activity in those areas. Residual heat in the unburned islands and smoldering edges of green fingers pose the biggest threat for producing short intense upslope runs when winds and slope are in alignment.

Branch V: Fire is in heavier fuels of brush and mixed timber with a grass understory. Expect more residual heat and higher chances of rollout from the recent firing operation. Be aware of fire weakened trees burning out and falling. The brush and timber are not at critical moisture levels, so firing operations will generally not result in complete consumption.

Branches X, XIV: Fire activity is primarily limited to unburned islands and smoldering edges of green fingers. Short range spotting could occur from slope runs, but shouldn't pose challenges to control. Expect erratic winds near confluences of the main river and tributary drainages, and along the leeside of spur ridges. Fire weakened snags may be an issue as crews work into the canyon.

Air Operations: Smoke inversion will obscure the fire area during the transition in winds in the morning but will lift out around 1000. Once the smoke clears, there will be opportunities for air operations on the ridges first then into the canyon itself.

SAFETY

- Be aware of diurnal wind shifts throughout the morning and evening.
- Watch out for rolling burning debris crossing firelines and starting fires below you!

ALL	FIRE AND DROUGHT WEAKENED TREES/SNAG HAZARDS	 Follow Hazard Tree Safety Guidelines (IRPG p. 20). Many of the trees within the fire area and along roadways are stressed due to previous fires and drought conditions.
ALL	STEEP TERRAIN	 Ensure proper footing and maintain spacing between crew members. Develop a plan for medical emergency extrication utilizing resources on your Branch.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	 Watch your speeds. Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Watch for road degradation, smokey and dusty conditions. Be aware of debris in the roadways from rollout and suppression operations.
ALL	FIRING OPERATIONS	 Ensure adequate personnel and resources are available for the operation. Validate LCES with all resources. Follow the Firing Operations checklist. Utilize Risk Management Process IRPG (p. 1).
ALL	BRIEFINGS	 Make sure everyone gets a briefing on the plan for the day. Document this on your ICS 214.
ALL	HYDRATION	 Drink water before, during and after each shift. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others.
ALL	HELICOPTER AWARENESS	 Be aware of rotor wash when working near helicopters. Understand that hazardous trees may react to helicopters overhead.
ALL	HEAVY EQUIPMENT	 Give ample space for heavy equipment to work (100ft in front, 50 feet behind) Avoid working downhill from equipment where rolling material could jeopardize your safety.
ALL	PERSONNEL SAFETY	 All personnel are responsible for their personal safety. Immediately report any suspicious activity. Be sure to wear all required PPE while on the fire line.
ALL	COMMUNICATIONS	 Check the communication plan for frequency assignments. Be clear and concise when talking on the radio. Use human repeaters as needed.
ALL	CIVILIAN PRESENCE	 Watch for civilian traffic. Be aware that civilians continue to occupy the fire area. Watch for residents in and around the area.
ALL	WEATHER	Maintain your situational awareness .Review the forecast for the operational period.

FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN: ELECTRA INCIDENT

Fire suppression repair is the repair of damage caused directly from fire suppression activities. It is <u>not</u> the repair of infrastructure or rehabilitation of burned areas that happened as a result of the fire.

Damaged facilities will be upgraded to functional status to mitigate future damage. Projects too large or complex to be completed by the Fire Suppression Repair Group shall be transferred to the Comp/Claims Unit or the local Unit. Repair work shall only occur in locations authorized by Operations and where fire suppression activities are complete. Fire Suppression Repair Group resources shall evaluate all Divisions for appropriate repair needs. This includes areas inside and outside the fire perimeter, provided the damage was caused by official fire suppression activities. Extra care will be exercised and equipment will be monitored when operating in locations where new fire starts are more likely to occur, such as rocky areas in dry grass. New fires will be reported following the instructions in the radio call plan.

Examples of items that may be repaired include, but are not limited to:

Infrastructure Damage	Natural Resource Damage
Fences and gates	Soil erosion
Culverts, bridges, and other watercourse crossings	Adverse impacts to air and water quality
Water sources	Adverse impacts to protected species of plants and
Utility distribution lines (above or below ground)	animals
Road barriers removed for fire access	Archaeological sites
Trash, debris, and supplies left by fire suppression resources	
Miscellaneous damage to residential property	

<u>Brush piles / windrows</u>: Within 100 feet of public roads or residences and along strategic fuel break areas, brush piles and windrows will be scattered, lopped, crushed, or masticated.


<u>Block access</u>: Where fireline crosses public roads, access will be blocked using slash, masticated material, tank traps, or other methods.


Dozer line and road repair

- Berms and push-piles shall be spread out to the extent feasible. This may be accomplished by back-blading and/or using ripper shanks or grapples. Debris piled against trees or perched above watercourses is especially important to remove or disperse.
- Waterbreaks shall be constructed at a 30-45 degree angle and shall be a minimum depth of 12 inches from the bottom of the cut to the top of the berm. Where feasible, the discharge from waterbreaks shall be directed into vegetated or rocked areas.
- Roads used in fire suppression activities shall be left in the same condition they were found or better. Gravel and soil-surfaced roads shall be watered to prevent excessive dust. Where fire suppression activities have damaged or rendered road drainage facilities non-functional, waterbreaks or drivable dips shall be installed for drainage.
- Where fire suppression activities have filled in or damaged inside ditches, the ditches shall be cleaned and left unobstructed.
- Spacing of waterbreaks shall be as follows:

Prevailing gradient	Maximum waterbreak spacing
0-10%	200 feet
11-25%	150 feet
26-50%	100 feet
>50%	75 feet

Spacing criteria is a general guide. Actual location of waterbreaks should be tailored to the topography and placement suited to the best dispersal of water flow.
