RED FLAG WARNING REMAINS IN EFFECT

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Strong high pressure will maintain extreme fire weather conditions across the region. A very dry and unstable atmosphere along with gusty southwest winds can be expected each day through the weekend. Monsoonal moisture and the threat of thunderstorms will remain east of the fire area but light cumulus and higher clouds can be expected. A better threat of thunderstorm activity will occur on Sun/Mon.

WEATHER FORECAST TONIGHT (FRIDAY NIGHT SHIFT):

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. MIN TEMP ERATURES: 62 – 66 MAX HUMIDITY: 20 – 25% WINDS (EYE LEVEL):

1800 - 2200 PDT: West and Southwest 6 to 11 mph...Gusts 16 – 21 mph.

2200 – 0600 PDT: Northwest 4 to 8 mph...Gusts to 15 mph. All wind diminishing to Variable 2 to 4 mph around 0300 PDT.

** Possible wind shift late tonight into early Sat. Winds possibly shifting to North and Northeast and gusty from around midnight to sunrise. Wind speeds ranging from 8 to 15 mph with gusts to 20 mph. If these winds materialize they should begin to diminish around sunrise. **

STABILITY / INVERSION: Very Unstable...Haines 5-6.

Strong high pressure will maintain extreme fire weather conditions across the region. A very dry and unstable atmosphere along with gusty southwest winds can be expected each day through the weekend.

Min. Temp: 62-66^o Max. RH: 20-25%

1900-2200: West and Southwest 6-11 mph, gusts 16-21

2200-0600: NW 4-8 mph with gusts to 15. Diminishing to variable 2-4 around 0300

Stability/inversion: Very unstable, Haines 5-6

FIRE BEHAVIOR

General Fire Behavior for the Lost:

For general sustained winds expected on the fire this evening (until around 2200) anticipate a ROS of 30-35 chains/hour with a flame length of 12-14 feet in drainages and in intermediate sagebrush. Worst-case fire behavior exhibited during anticipated wind gusts include a ROS of 75-80 chains/hour and flame length could exceed 20 feet.

In the sparse low sage areas expect a rate of spread 15-20 chains/hour with a flame length of 4-6 feet.

Probability of ignition will reach 90-100% during the evening. Spotting distance could be up to ½ mile.

After 2200 expect a decrease in fire behavior in intermediate sagebrush to a ROS of 15-25 chains/hour and flame length 9-10 feet decreasing further to a ROS to 10 chains/hour and flame length 2-5 feet after midnight. Probability of ignition 60%. Spotting distance short range less than 1/10 mile.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke should not impact air operations on the fire.
