A ridge of high pressure building into the region will bring warming and drying conditions through the week. Humidity recovery will be moderate, becoming poor on mid and upper slopes by Tuesday night.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

General Fire Behavior for the Lost:

For general winds expected on the fire today anticipate a ROS of 30-35 chains/hour with a flame length of 12-14 feet. Backing ROS will be around 2 chains/hour with a flame length up to 3 feet. Torching mahogany may have a flame length exceeding 40 feet.

Worst-case fire behavior exhibited during anticipated wind gusts include a ROS of 75-80 chains/hour and flame length could exceed 20 feet.

Probability of ignition will reach 90-100% during the afternoon.

Spotting distance could be as far as $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

POWER LINE SAFETY

Operating near or under power lines poses unique hazards and the following precautions should be followed to reduce potential equipment damage or injury:

- 1. If possible, the power company should deactivate lines in the fire area.
- 2. Don't operate heavy equipment under power lines.
- 3. Don't use right-of-ways as a jump or cargo drop spot.
- 4. Don't drive with long antennas under power lines.
- 5. Don't stand near power lines during retardant drops.
- 6. Don't park under power lines. The magnetic field around energized power lines induce an electrical charge in ungrounded vehicles or equipment. This charge can shock anyone who touches the vehicle.
- 7. Don't apply straight stream to power lines.
- 8. All personnel should be cautioned that smoke may become charged and conduct the electrical current. Deactivated transmission and distribution lines may continue to pose a hazard due to induction.
- 9. Heavy smoke and flames can cause arcs to ground. Direct attack must be abandoned within 100 feet of transmission lines.
- 10. Always maintain 35 feet distance from transmission towers.
- 11. Keep personnel 150 feet away from downed transmission lines.
- 12. If power lines fall on your vehicle, DON'T leave the vehicle until the power company arrives. If the vehicle is on fire or fire is near, jump clear, don't hang on, keep feet together, and bunny hop away.

- 2) On scene EMT, DIVS and Medical Unit Leader decide mode of transportation required.
- 3) Communications Unit contacts:
 - Medical Unit
 - **Transport Dispatch**
 - Safety
 - Helibase, if Air Ambulance in bound
- Operations and Medical Unit will manage medical emergency with Communications.

If a Medical/Medivac is needed be sure to

Know the lat. and long. of the closest helispot.

Contact Medical Unit with patient complaint/condition and location. Medical Staff will respond to stabilize incident:

TRIAGE CONSIDERATIONS (S.T.A.R.T)

Respirations:

Over 30/ Under 12 = Immediate

Capillary Refill

Over 2 seconds = Immediate

Mental Status

Disoriented = Immediate

Immediate = Air Evacuation if possible

PT. ASSESSMENT:

- Mental Status
- B.P.
- Pulse
- Skin signs
- Respirations
- Crew name and location.

Do not give patients name over radio.

WARNING SIGNS OF HEAT ILLNESS **INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING:**

- An extremely high body temperature (above 103°F).
- Red, hot and dry skin (no sweating).
- Rapid, irregular strong pulse
- Throbbing headache
- Dizziness, Nausea and Confusion
- Unconsciousness

HOW TO TREAT HEAT EMERGENCIES IN THE FIELD:

- Move the patient to the shade or provide shade for them
- Externally cool the patient.
- Fan them after getting them wet.
- Drink water constantly through the day and electrolyte sports drink/powder - 2/1 ratio.
