**WEATHER TODAY:**        **\*\*\*Red Flag Warning Today/Wednesday for Wind and RH\*\*\***

**WEATHER:** WSW winds increase today with continued warming and lowering RH. Smoke that drifted westward overnight, will drift back eastward over the fire. So visibility will be limited into early afternoon, especially on eastern flank.

**TEMPERATURES:**        74-79        *Trend: Up 2 – 3%*  
**RELATIVE HUMIDITY:**    22-28%        *Trend: Down 5%*

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Morning winds SE 5-7 with gusts to 15 mph through 0900, shifting WSW 10-15 mph with afternoon gusts to 25 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Downcanyon 3-7 mph and shift SW 5-10 with gusts 15 mph around 1400.

**LAL: 1.**        **STABILITY/INVERSION:** Inversions breaking in deep canyons by 1200.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** . SW winds and lowering RH over the fire. Stronger SW winds occur Wednesday into Thursday ahead of the upper level trough. Possible precipitation late Wednesday night, with greater chances on Thursday. Amounts still look to be less than 0.25 inch.

**WEATHER FOR TUESDAY NIGHT:** Clear with smoke settling downcanyon after 2200.

Low temperatures: Thermal belts/ridges 65-69... Valleys 59-64.

Max RH: Thermal belts/ridges 35-40%... Valleys 45-50%.


**20FT Winds:**

Ridge – WNW 3-9 with gusts to 15 mph shifting SE 6-10 mph after 2200 with gusts to 15-20 mph upper ridges after 2400.

Slope/valley – Transition to downslope 3-6 mph. Downcanyon wind gusts 5-10mph after.

**OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY:** SW ridge winds increase with lowering RH. High temps: 74-80. Min RH: 25-29%. Ridge winds: SW winds from 12-18 with afternoon gusts 25-30 mph. Valley/Slope winds: Downslope 3-8 mph shifting upslope/upcanyon 6-10 mph late morning with afternoon gusts 15-20 mph in aligned canyons.

## INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY - SEE ATTACHED FIRE WEATHER FORCAST \*\*\*Red Flag Warning Today/Wednesday for Wind and RH\*\*\*** WSW winds increase today with continued warming and lowering RH's.

**Temperatures:** 74-79 Up 2-3% **Relative Humidity:** 22-28% down 5%  
**Ridgetop Winds** – Morning winds SE 5-7 with gusts to 15 mph through 0900, shifting WSW 10-15 mph with afternoon gusts to 25 mph.

**Slope/Valley Winds** – Downcanyon 3-7 mph and shift SW 5-10 with gusts 15 mph around 1400.

**FUELS** –The primary vegetation in the fire area is timber. There is a diversity of open and closed canopies and understories of grass, regeneration and brush. There are also areas of brush and grass. *Live and dead fuel moistures are below critical thresholds!*

**FIRE DANGER INDICES**-Thresholds for Active Fire Behavior in the King Fire area (Eldorado NF PocketCard):  
\* 20ft Winds (over 5 mph), \*RH (under 22%), \*Temperature (over 84°) and \*1000hr FMC (under 9%).

## OUTPUTS

**DIV 1B/1D** – SW winds may create erratic winds in drainages. The slope over in the lower SW edge of the division will be in alignment with the afternoon winds. If the fire initiates in drainages, there will be alignment with fuels, topography and winds. Monitor for roll-outs that could initiate fire below you and make up slope runs.

**DIV 1F (Fire front between French Meadows Reservoir and Hell Hole Reservoir)** -. The afternoon SW winds will test control lines. If the fire spots over control lines it will burn to the NE towards the spot fire in DIV 1H. Monitor interior islands and unburned fuels adjacent to control lines. Unmitigated hot spots in these areas have the potential to create flare ups that can loft embers over control lines.

**DIV 1H** – Afternoon SW winds will test control lines on the spot fire located on the NE edge of French Meadows Reservoir. Monitor interior islands and unburned fuels adjacent to control lines. Unmitigated hot spots in these areas have the potential to create flare ups that can loft embers over control lines. Have contingencies in place if spot fires develop from the fire line between French Meadows Reservoir and Hell Hole Reservoir and moves up the Eastern aspect of Chipmonk Ridge.

**DIV 1W (Fire below Hell Hole Reservoir)** – The fire below Hell Hole Reservoir will be in alignment with afternoon SW winds. If the fire moves, it will continue to burn to the NE below Hell Hole Reservoir toward Buck Meadow and Bunker Hill. Expect single and group tree torching when fuels, winds and topography are in alignment.

**DIV 1Y** – SW winds will be in alignment with areas along the division. There are many areas in this division where fuels, topography and winds will be in alignment so expect moderate to high intensity runs.

### AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke will limit air operations until 1200 hrs.

**Sunrise - 0650 hours**

**Sunset 1900 hours**

### SAFETY

- Dead and live fuels are at critical levels. Alignment of fuels with topography or wind can initiate a rapid change in fire behavior.
- When developing strategies and tactics, safety zones and escape routes you should be evaluating potential fire behavior (worst case scenario), not just observed fire behavior.

6. Are you interactive with the **Standard Fire Orders** and **Watch Out Situations**?
7. Do you have the **Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones** system in place?
8. Do you understand that it's both your responsibility and your right to say **No** to orders that cannot be accomplished without compromising one or more of the **Standard Fire Orders** or without mitigating each of the **Watch Out Situations**?
9. Can you describe the fire environment you are going to operate in?
10. Are you prepared to engage; monitor the fire environment, be proactive, and make adjustments?


**BACK TO THE BASICS:** Size-Up; when does it start and when does it end? On our way to this fire we were sizing-up the weather, fuels, topography and the condition of our crew. Now that we have several shifts under our belts, are we still doing this? If not, we should be! Size-up is a continual and ongoing process that should last us through the incident and safely back home.

#### CIRCLE OF SAFETY:

- Walk around the vehicle.
- Check the windshield, wipers, and wiper fluid level
- Keep windows, mirrors, and lights clean to better see and be seen
- Check headlights, turn signals, tail lights, reflectors and running lights.
- Adjust mirrors.
- Check front and back tires (including wheels and lug nuts).
- Under the hood, check all fluid levels and especially the Air Filter



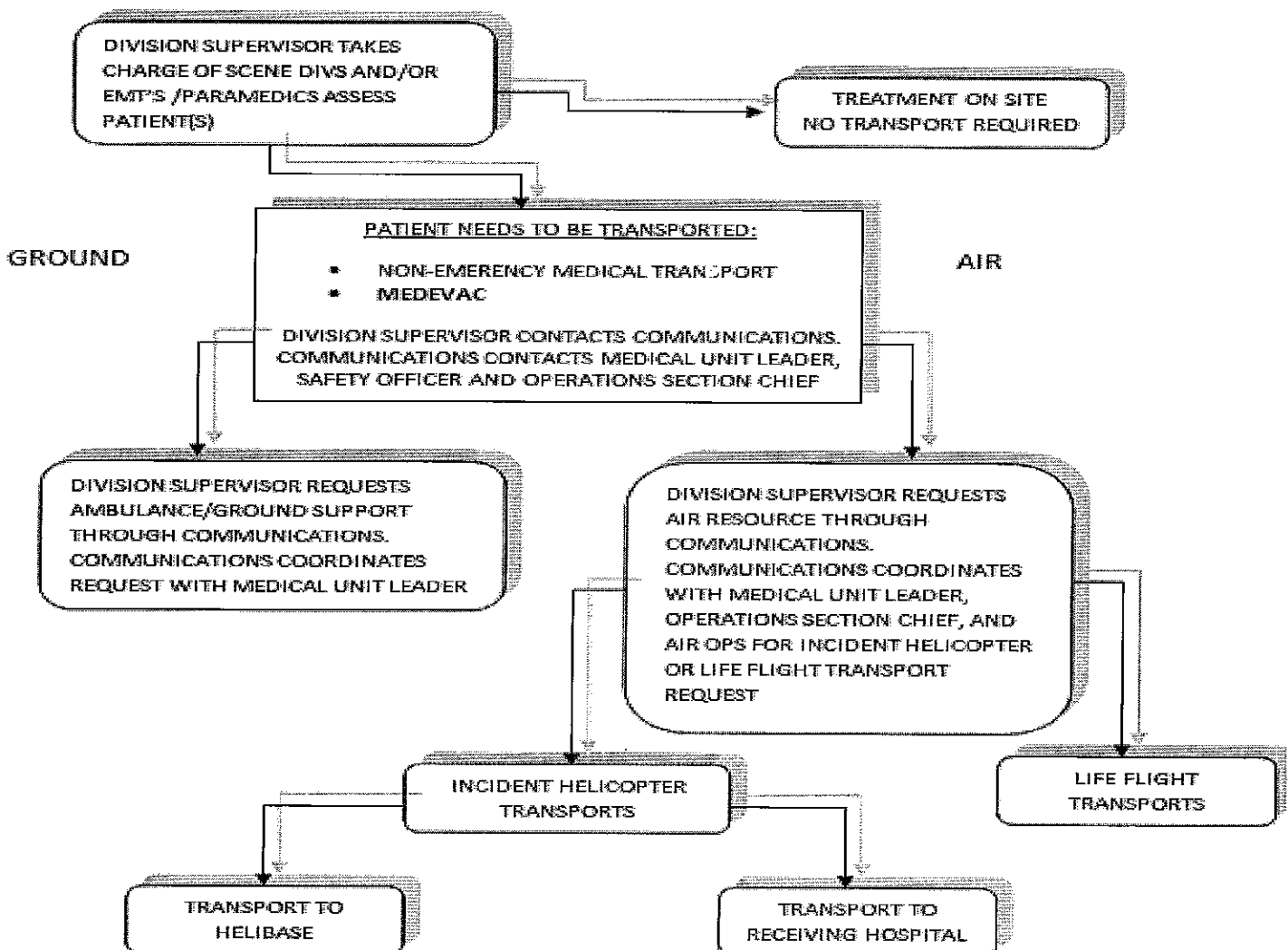

When an injury occurs, initiate care with available resources at scene and notify DIVS.

The DIVS shall coordinate the incident and direct necessary actions. The following steps shall be taken to mitigate the incident:

1. Determine the nature of the emergency.
2. If the emergency is a medical injury/illness, determine if the injury/illness is life threatening.
3. If the injury is life threatening, then clear designated frequency for emergency traffic.
4. Identify the on-scene point of contact by position.
5. Ensure that the Medical Unit Leader is contacted immediately.
6. Identify number injured, patient assessment(s) and location (geographic and/or GPS coordinates).
7. Identify on-scene medical personnel by position and last name (i.e. EMT Jones).
8. Identify preferred method of patient transport.
9. Determine any additional resources or equipment needed.

The Evacuation Plan should be continually evaluated, and contingencies developed in the event the first plan is not effective.

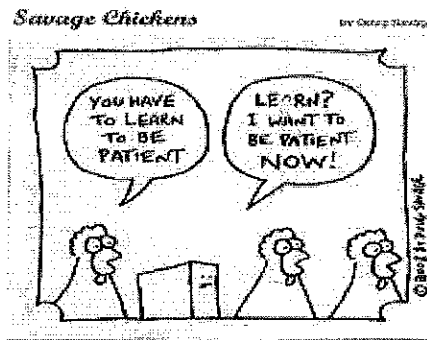

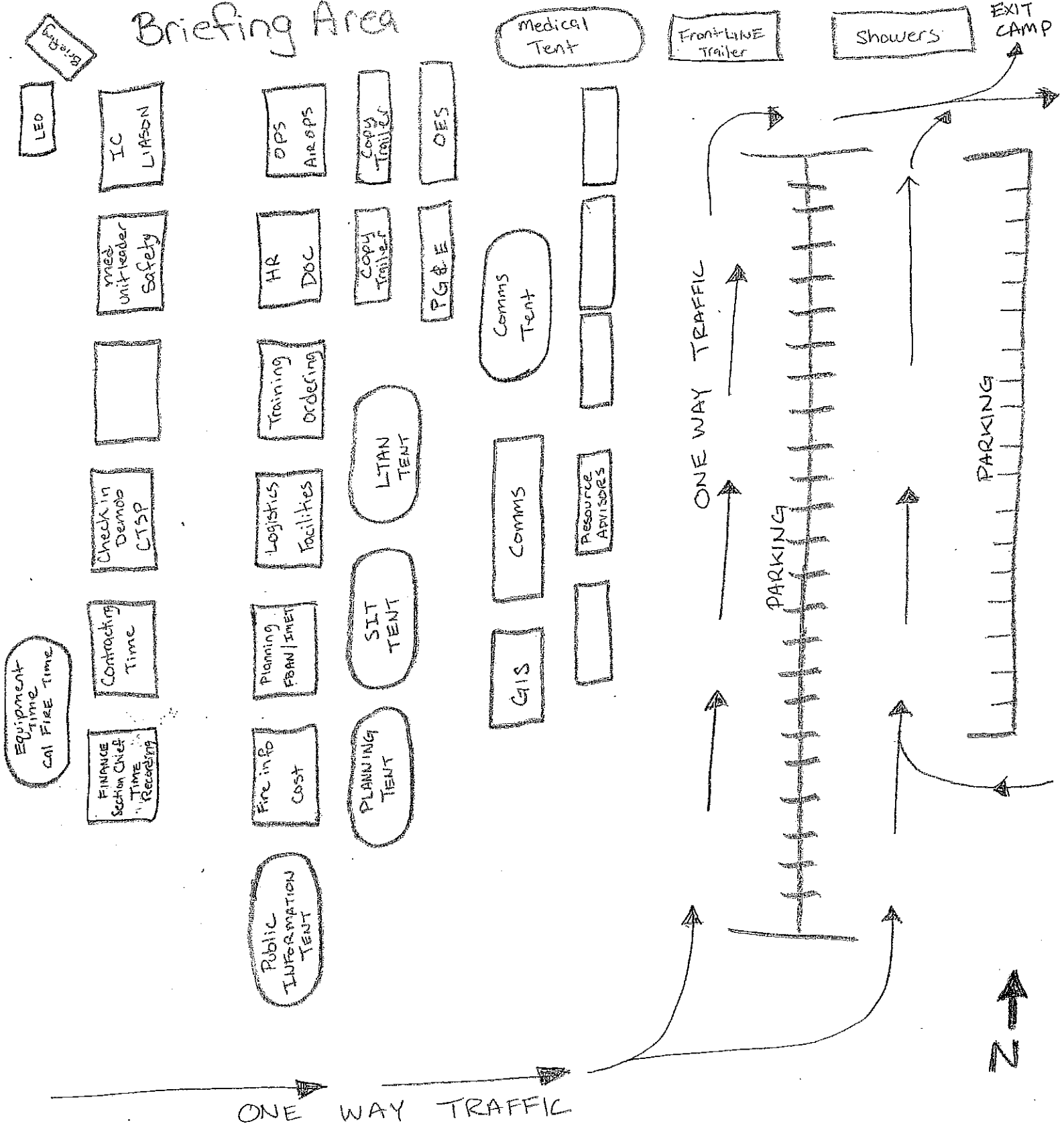
