Suppress the July Complex Fires using the full range of fire management tactics and strategies to minimize, to the extent feasible, exposure to firefighters, communities and other affected areas to reduce susceptibility to the consequences from the COVID-19.

- Protect natural & cultural resources, tribal lands, commercial timber, and utilities utilizing Resource Advisors and Agency Representatives.
- Foster and maintain good relationships with local cooperators, stakeholders and public while providing coordinated, accurate and timely information
- Foster & maintain good relationships with local cooperators, stakeholders & public while providing coordinated, accurate & timely information
- Keep cost commensurate to values at risk working with local unit and coordinating with Agency Administrator & IBA
- Initiate suppression repair utilizing July Complex Repair Plan

- Cascade Fire
  - Keep fire North of Hwy 97
  - Keep fire South of Tule Lake

- Keep all fires within existing perimeters

**General Situational Awareness:**

- Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.
- In the COVID-19 environment, high density populations or large groups are particularly at risk. To help protect yourself, your family and to ensure all employees return home safely, make sure to practice social distancing.

## GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

With Red Flag conditions over our fires all existing containment lines will be challenged. Torching with spotting will continue and with add to fire spread. Expect sustained crown runs in continuous stands of timber. As the fire moves into lighter fuel types expect dramatic increases in rates of spread where wind and slope align. Drought stressed fuels are holding heat for extended periods and the heavy dead and down logs are very receptive to spotting. ERC's are at or above 90<sup>th</sup> percentile at local stations. Expect the fire to remain active into the night until the winds die down and we get some RH recovery.

**Probability of Ignition** 90-100%

**Spotting distance** 400' to up to 1/2 mile

## SPECIFIC:

### Branch 5

Strong southwest winds have the potential scour out heat along the entire northern perimeter, challenging containment lines. Be heads up for long range spotting potential into receptive agricultural fields downwind to the north.

### Branch 3

Afternoon winds should be mostly favorable. Continued burn down of heavies and fire weakened snags.

### Allen and Dalton Fires

Another round of testing for these fires today. Drought stressed fuels will continue to hold heat that could threaten containment lines.

### Initial Attack New Fires

Anticipate FL 8-12'+, ROS 40-80 ch/hr, and spotting up to 1/2 mile in areas exposed to SW.

**Air Operations:** Smoke should clear out by 1100 today.

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## SAFETY:

**Any new ignitions have the potential to see rapid rates of spread.**



- N** - Natural fuels occur within 30 feet of the structures.
- K** - Known or suspected panicked publics are in the vicinity.
  
- S** - Structure windows are bulging, and the roof has not been vented.
- A** - Additional fuels can be found in open crawl spaces beneath the structures.
- F** - Firefighting is taking place in or near chimney or canyon situations.
- E** - Elevated fuel or propane tanks are present.

## **Look Up, Look Down, Look Around:**

**\*Look Up:** Check the sky for any weather changes such as building or approaching thunderstorms, wind shifts or increasing in speed. Watch for air operations and water drops. Look for snags.

**\*Look Down:** Watch your footing. Keep an eye out for loose rocks, rattlesnakes and wet or loose soil.

**\* Look All Around:** Check fuel loading in the area, general terrain, current fire behavior and ladder fuels, *and look in your IDP for weather forecasts and expected fire behavior.*

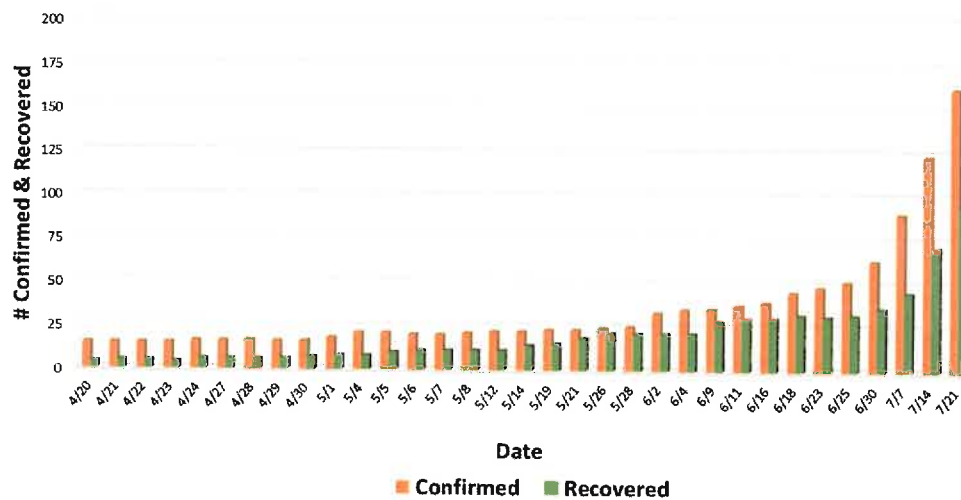
# SAFETY ADVISORY

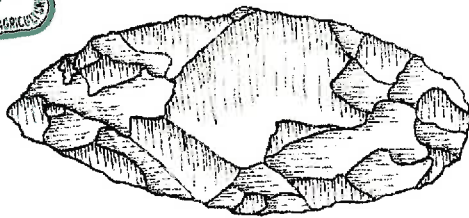
