

<p>Leaders Intent: Suppress the August Complex fires using management strategies and tactics that provide the highest likelihood of success given risks to responders.</p> <p>Management Objectives: Ensure the safety and well being of emergency responders and the public by making timely risk-informed decisions that align with the Agency values. Protect natural and cultural resources of Federal, State, and Local interest by engaging agency resource advisors, partners and community stakeholders in effective communication and planning. Foster good relationships with local cooperators, stakeholders and the public by providing coordinated, accurate and timely information. Keep costs commensurate with values at risk by working with the local unit and coordinating with the Agency Administrator and Incident Business Advisor. Coordinate with the Forest's COVID-19 Advisor to ensure COVID mitigation measures are in alignment with Agency expectations and adapt as necessary to changing conditions. Coordinate suppression efforts with California IMT 5 under area command.</p> <p>Control Objectives: Hold the Doe Fire south of the M2 road and Riley Ridge to Hull Canyon road to the 302 Road. Discussion:

Warm and dry conditions with a lot of smoke will last into the weekend. Daytime RH will remain low with poor overnight recoveries through the weekend, but with slight improvements. Terrain driven winds for the valleys and mid-slopes, ridge top winds generally Southeasterly which could be overpowered by terrain winds for Friday. The next weather system will bring strengthening winds Saturday and a shift to a southerly direction and then even stronger winds for Sunday.

FIRE BEHAVIOR OUTPUTS

GENERAL

Fuels are at critically dry levels and continue to dry each day. Relative humidity's were recorded at 12-25% yesterday. Smoke over the fire continues to impact fire spread and behavior.. Lighter winds should bring some relief but there is still the potential for rapid fire movement and moderate/extreme fire behavior should skies become clear. Terrain will pay a significant role in fire spread as well.



Restock/Replacement Procedures for Government Property

Gone is the old culture!

Gone are the days when we used fire suppression funds from project fires to repair and replenish our inventory and gear. No longer can we take advantage of project fires in this manner according to NWCG. They have told us that since most items are provided by home units using preparedness funds, we cannot use the project fire codes to replace or repair anything damaged due to normal wear and tear. We are told that the home unit needs to plan for and replace things that are wearing out, not the fires.

Specific Events:

If there is a specific event on our incident that causes more than normal wear and tear (such as a wind event destroying tents) we will work with you on getting the correct documentation so that it can be replaced or repaired. Be aware, however that further direction is that we cannot replace or repair non-standard cache items. In other words, if your tent is destroyed with a wind event we can give you another tent, but it will be one that is available from the cache and might not be exactly what you had before if you didn't carry the standard tent. This is true for such things as Kevlar pants (you'd get the standard greens from supply), sleeping bags (again-cache bags), packs (no Eagle Packs, just the standard), etc. **We can ensure that the correct documentation is done to turn in to your home unit for consideration of replacement of non-cache items from home.**

If equipment and supplies are available at the incident for replacement, the request is filled at the Incident Supply Unit.

If equipment and supplies are unavailable at the incident for replacement, and the requesting resource is not being immediately demobilized, the Supply Unit will place a resource order for the needed items through appropriate channels to the cache. The order will be shipped to the incident and replacement will take place at the Supply Unit.

If equipment and supplies are unavailable at the incident for replacement, and the requesting resource is being demobilized, an Incident Replacement Requisition will be completed and forwarded to the cache.

Getting questions from Supply about whether your needs are legitimate?

Good! This means they are doing the job that NWCG has asked them to do. However, we don't want to make this an ordeal for you, and they should be nice about it. You do need to submit your requests in writing on a General Message Form (213). Have your DIVS sign the 213 to verify that you did the work or were put in circumstances to create the need. This is how we determine what is fair. If you have questions, please don't hesitate to consult with the Logistics Chief.

How about the accountable stuff?

If you lose, damage or destroy a piece of government property on the incident, you have to go through the same hoops that you would back home to report it. First of all, do not wait to report it! Whether the property is assigned to you from the home (such as a radio) or whether it was assigned to you at the fire (such as a radio or pump or chainsaw) you are responsible for it and must do the same paperwork. As the person responsible for the property you must document the loss or damage on a Property Loss or Damage form. (We use an AD-112 or OF-289, available from supply). You and your supervisor (DIVS in most cases) and any witnesses must document facts and circumstances on the form, and turn in the damaged or destroyed items. The Incident Commander or Logistics Section Chief shall review, sign, and take any follow up action. Type I and Type II incident replacement approvals are limited to the Incident Supply Unit Leader, Logistics Section Chief, Incident Commander, Agency Administrator. Seldom will one of those folks approve anything that is not verified in writing by the DIVS or higher level of Operations overhead.

If you come to the end of the fire when everyone is demobing and say that your crew lost a couple of radios a few days ago and also damaged a GPS unit during IA, it's not going to look good and it will be difficult to round up people and witnesses necessary to get the paperwork done in a reasonable amount of time to demob. Please do not wait until the end to report such loss or damage. It must be taken care of when or shortly after it occurs in order to get the witness statements, etc. not at demob.

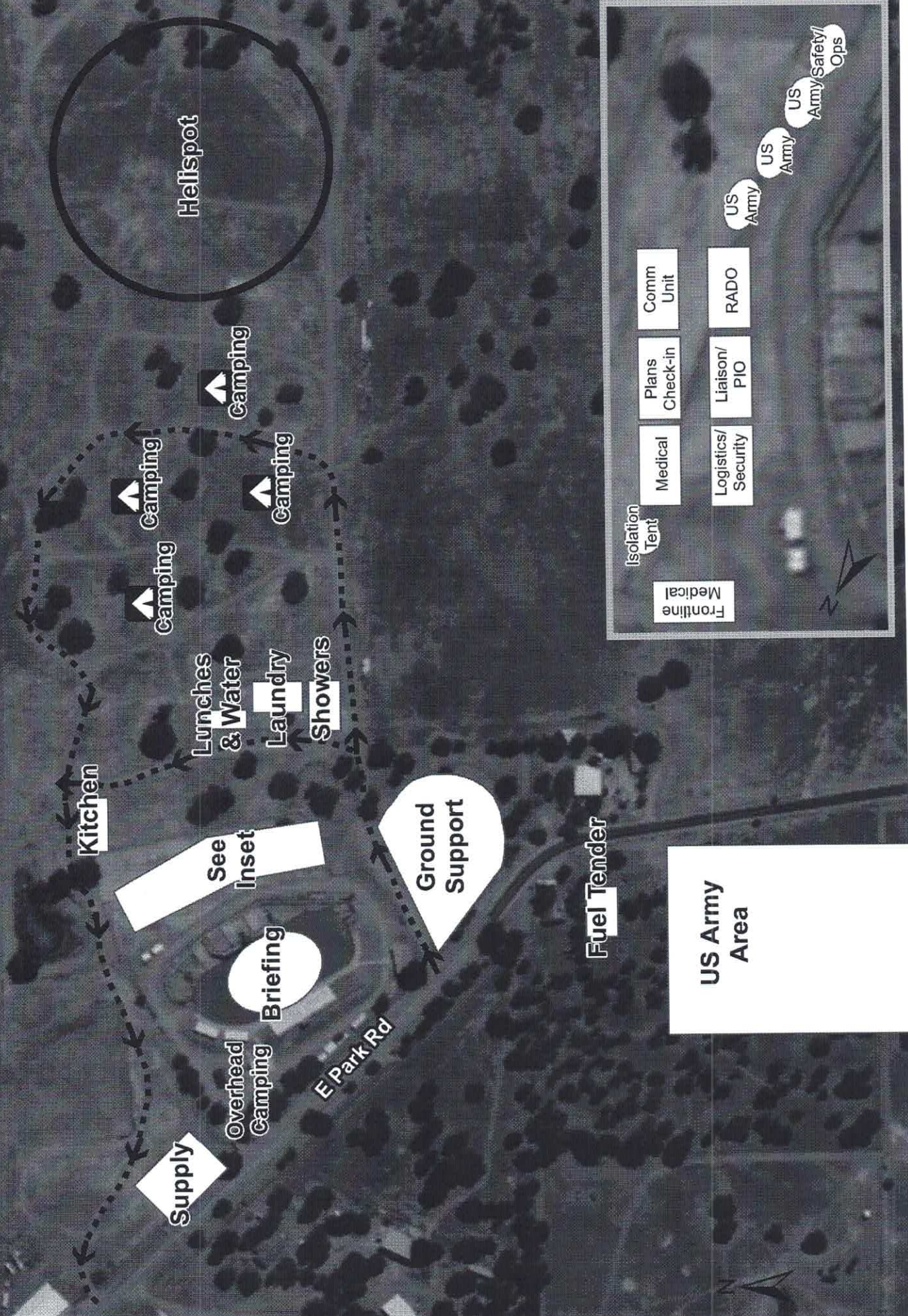

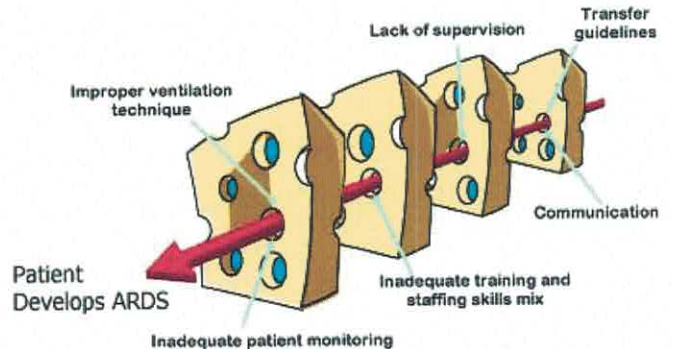

Transfer Of Command

Operational Engagement Category

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. There is a high potential for fatalities, serious injuries, or incidents (some have occurred in the past). Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES –Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:

- ◆ No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel.
- ◆ Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed.
- ◆ Communications; face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
- ◆ Initial attack resources may not have checked-in and the Incident Commander may not be aware of the number, type and location of all resources.
- ◆ Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.
- ◆ Not all Resources know who is in command.

Mitigation actions to take:

- ◆ Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- ◆ Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
- ◆ Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.
- ◆ Transition at the morning briefing.
- ◆ Utilize the [Incident Response Pocket Guide](#) transition checklist.

2020 COVID-19 Guidance

LEADERS INTENT:

- Incident responders have a **DUTY** to safeguard each other and the public we serve from hazards. It is through our **RESPECT** for everyone's health and safety that we follow these mitigations, and we rely on everyone's **INTEGRITY** to ensure that we do so and expect the same of others.
- All incident personnel are expected to conduct **self-screening** of their health on a daily basis. Individuals experiencing any of the symptoms should take precautions to self-isolate and immediately report symptoms to your supervisor and to the IMT's Medical Officer or MEDL for assessment.
- All incident personnel will adhere to the **Module of One concept** to the extent practical.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear **cloth face coverings** when six feet of social distancing cannot be maintained with others outside of their Module of One.
- All incident personnel and visitors are required to wear **cloth face coverings** when attending briefings or meetings in common use areas at ICP and camps.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear **cloth face coverings** whenever they enter an enclosed incident facility, such as yurt, tent, building, restroom facility, or other common-use areas regardless of proximity to other people.

ALL RESOURCES (IMT Members, Single Resource, Operational & Support resources):

- Each resource should arrive at the incident "self-sufficient" for 72 hours, including food, water, sanitizer or wipes, batteries, etc.

ICP AND CAMPS

- Access into ICP and some base camp facilities may be restricted to essential personnel only, i.e. module supervisors and trainees.
- To promote isolation and social distancing, operational resources will be assigned to camps and spike camps dispersed on the incident.
- Food will be individually packaged and delivered to drop points for distribution. Special dietary needs should be reported to your line supervisor.
- Daily operational briefings will be conducted via radio or virtually. Only supervisors and trainees should attend in-person briefings.

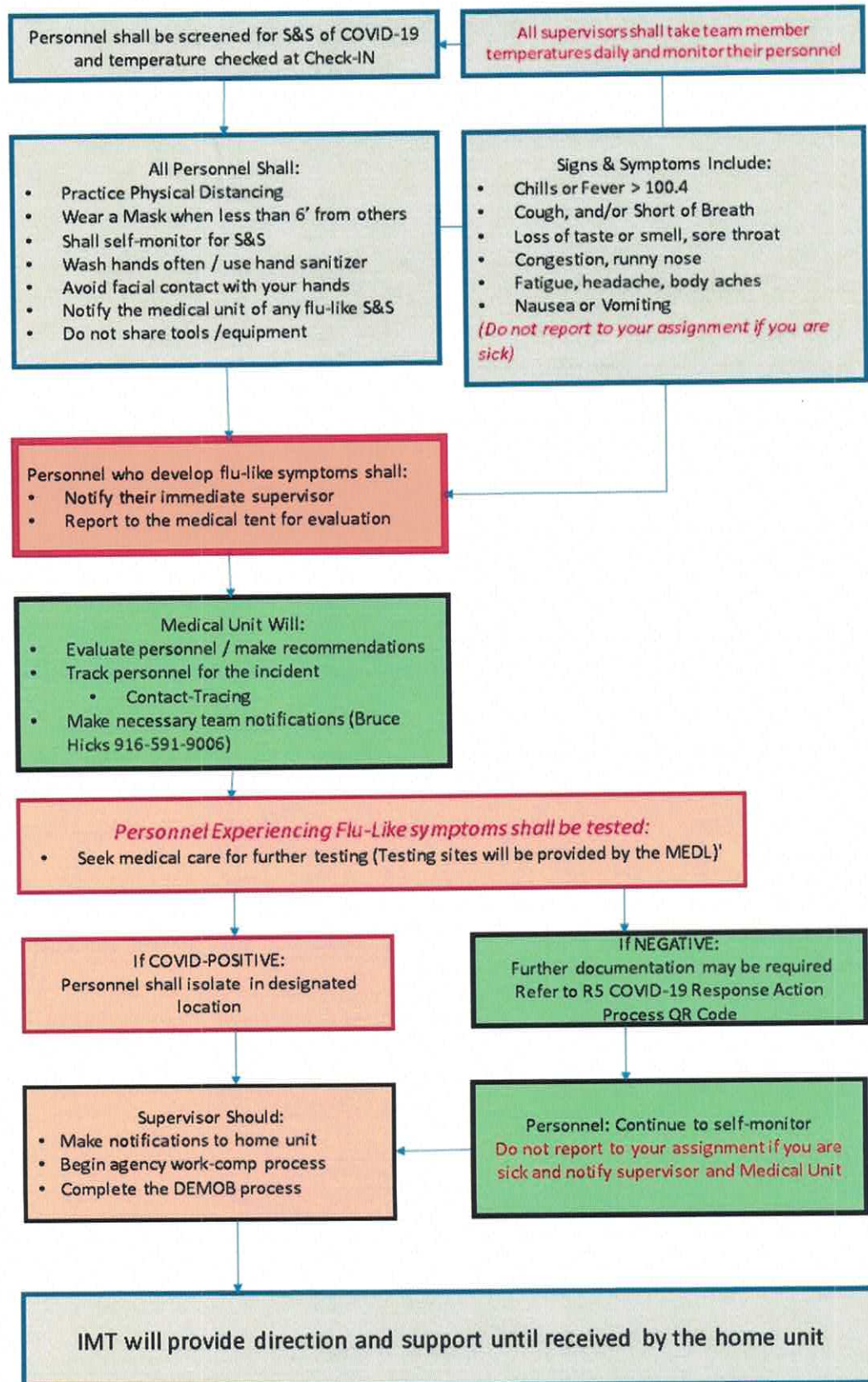

Steps to follow
Escort symptomatic individual to isolation area.
Isolation support personnel should begin documentation.
Have symptomatic individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
Notify public health officials.
Have individual transported as appropriate.
Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).


