GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR

Fuel moisture will decrease in response to hot and dry conditions. Winds will be sufficient to drive active fire behavior. Most surface fire with moderate intensity will likely have the ability to transition into the canopy, resulting in occasional torching. Upslope crown runs will be possible on moderate to steep slopes.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

Branch 41 – Infrared has shown no heat near the perimeter for the past week. Reburn or isolated pockets of heat cannot be completely ruled out, but no fire behavior issues are expected in Branch 41.

Branch 43 – Potential for very active fire behavior remains if fire gets established outside of control lines. With strong winds out of the NE today, becoming stronger and gusty tonight and tomorrow, control lines could be tested over the weekend from Mill Creek to Big Signal Peak just over the Zone Break.

AIR OPERATIONS

Conditions expected to be mostly favorable for air operations early, but winds will become gusty in the late afternoon.

SAFETY

Fire weakened trees and snags become exceptionally dangerous during strong and gusty winds.

- 1. Failing to pay attention "zoning out"
 - Stay relaxed but totally focused.
 - Concentrate on your journey not your pending issues.
- 2. Driving while drowsy
 - Take breaks frequently or as required.
 - Make sure to get adequate rest before long trips.
- 3. Becoming distracted inside car (cell phone, radio, passengers)
 - Do not use cell phones while driving
 - Plan your trip and study your trip prior to commencing
- 4. Failing to adjust to adverse weather conditions
 - Slow down in rain
 - Allow longer stopping distances
 - Adjust for poor visibility
- 5. Driving aggressively (tailgating, running red lights, and stop signs, etc.)
 - Allow yourself ample time to make the trip.
 - Remain calm and drive with a safety cushion.
- 6. Making assumptions about other drivers intentions
 - Drive defensively
 - Allow cushion for the unexpected
 - Make your intentions clear, use turn signals etc.
- 7. Speeding
 - Obey the traffic signs
 - Remember the speed limit is the legal limit in ideal conditions
- 8. Changing lanes without checking blinds spots
 - Signal, check mirrors, then use quick glance
 - Make lane changes gradually
- 9. Driving while upset
 - Avoid this, as it is comparable to driving intoxicated.
- 10. Ignoring essential auto maintenance (brake lights, bald tires, etc)
 - Do daily/weekly/monthly maintenance checks
- Check brake pads often Nothings more important than your cars ability to stop itself.




