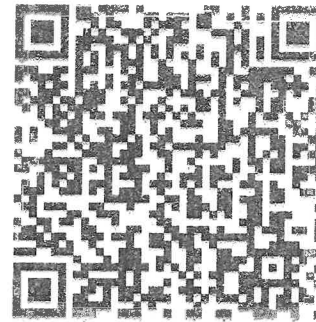
August Complex North Zone IAP



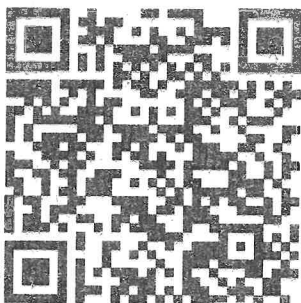
August Complex South Zone IAP

3. Objective(s):

Leaders Intent:
 Suppress the south zone of the August Complex using management strategies and tactics that provide the highest likelihood of success given risks to responders.

Management Objectives:

- Ensure the safety and well being of emergency responders and the public by making timely risk-informed decisions that align with the Agency values.
- Coordinate suppression efforts with Cal Fire Team 5 / Alaska Team 1 under the Coast Range Area Command.
- Protect natural and cultural resources of Federal, State, and Local/Private interest by engaging agency resource advisors, partners and community stakeholders in effective communication and planning.
- Foster good relationships with local cooperators, stakeholders and the public by providing coordinated, accurate and timely information.
- Keep cost commensurate with values at risk by working with the local unit and coordinating with the Agency Administrator and Incident Business Advisor.
- Coordinate with the COVID-19 Advisors to ensure COVID mitigation measures are in alignment with Agency expectations and adapt as necessary to changing conditions.

Control Objectives:

- Hold fire in the Sanhedrin Wilderness North of Mill Creek from Windy Gap to Garcia Ranch to protect values and infrastructure around Lake Pillsbury and Potter Valley areas.
- Limit westward fire growth where possible within the Sanhedrin Wilderness to protect resources values within forest boundary.
- Continue to hold fire west of current control lines in Division D to Division R to protect private property and critical infrastructure.

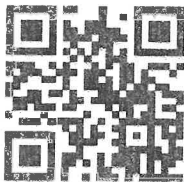

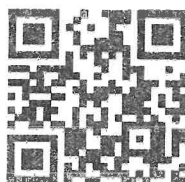

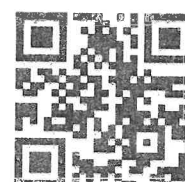

RED FLAG WARNING FOR HOT, DRY AND WINDY CONDITIONS TODAY AND TOMORROW

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR

Fuel moisture will be very low in response to hot and dry conditions with fine dead fuels as low as 3%. Winds will be sufficient to drive very active to extreme fire behavior. Crown runs in dense stands of timber are possible. Significant downslope/down drainage runs could be possible where topography aligns with northeast winds.

Grass – Surface rates of spread 80-100 chains per hour with flame lengths 8-12 feet

Shrub – Surface rates of spread 80-100 chains per hour with flame lengths 12-22 feet

Timber – Surface rates of spread 10-16 chains per hour with flame lengths 5-10 feet

Probability of Ignition 80-90%

Maximum spotting distance 0.8 to 1.0 mile

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

Branch 41 – Infrared has shown no heat near the perimeter for the past week. Reburn or isolated pockets of heat cannot be completely ruled out, but no fire behavior issues are expected in Branch 41.

Branch 43 – Potential for very active to extreme fire behavior exists if fire gets established outside of control lines. With strong and gusty winds out of the NE today, control lines could be tested in areas near the South Zone/West Zone break.

AIR OPERATIONS

Caution for gusty winds.

SAFETY

Fire weakened trees and snags become exceptionally dangerous during strong and gusty winds.
