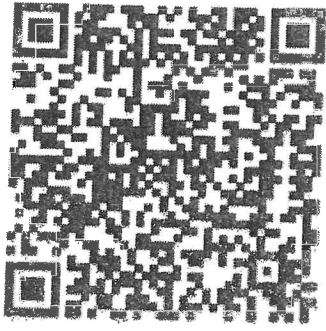

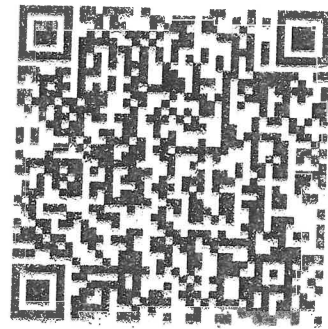
August Complex North Zone IAP



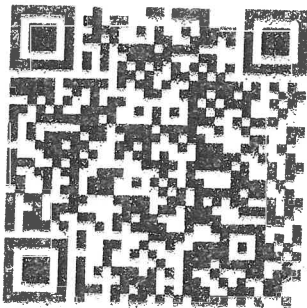
August Complex South Zone IAP

5. OBJECTIVES:

STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK

Suppress the south zone of the August Complex using management strategies and tactics that provide the highest likelihood of success given risks to responders.

MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES

- Ensure the safety and well being of emergency responders and the public by making timely risk-informed decisions that align with the Agency values.
- Coordinate suppression efforts with Cal Fire Team 5 / Alaska Team 1 under the Coast Range Area Command.
- Protect natural and cultural resources of Federal, State, and Local/Private interest by engaging agency resource advisors, partners and community stakeholders in effective communication and planning.
- Foster good relationships with local cooperators, stakeholders and the public by providing coordinated, accurate and timely information.
- Keep cost commensurate with values at risk by working with the local unit and coordinating with the Agency Administrator and Incident Business Advisor.
- Coordinate with the COVID-19 Advisors and Health Liaison to ensure COVID mitigation measures and COVID response are in alignment with Agency expectations and adapt as necessary to changing conditions.

CONTROL OBJECTIVES

- Keep the fire in it's current footprint through patrol and mop up where necessary.
- Assess suppression repair needs and implement when practical.
- Pull all excess water handling and logistical equipment back to supply.
- In Branch 7 DIVS S/N, U and Y assess fires edge in the Yolla Bolly Wilderness area with the intent to limit fire spread to the west outside of the Federal Response Area (FRA).



SE Quarter- No visible heat within ¼ mile of the perimeter. Several isolated stumps and root pockets emerged 10/02, expect to see more of the same as the ERC continues to climb.

SW Quarter- Small pockets of heat between Sanhedrin Cr and Elk Creek filled in the gaps 10/2, likely to continue creeping around in this area, filling in the unburnt island. Additional heat observed on the south side of Pothole Cr has the potential to make an uphill run today, especially when the wind/slope aligns. Opportunity for additional torching runs if the smoke layer is disturbed.

NW Quarter- Firing operations will continue to move the active edge along Crazy Bear pass towards DP-67. Interior of this location between Cardenas and Red Chert Creek will continue filling in that unburnt pocket. Scouting and division migration should be mindful of sustained runs and ¼ mile spotting near Zenia. This area is making counter-intuitive movement against the slope and wind directions. Similar fire movement is reported on the East side of Ruth Lake.

AIR OPERATIONS: Persistent weather pattern will limit flight windows again. Best opportunity for inversion lifting is after 1300.

SAFETY

This area of California has a significant amount of recent fire history (2015) Many areas of this fire contain heavy concentrations of fire killed timber. In many cases, these are very large trees. Don't forget to "look up" during suppression actions.

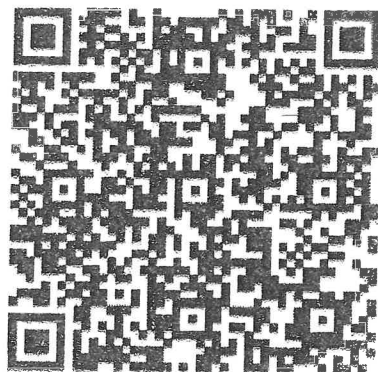

We refer to transfer of command, or transition, as a “Watch Out!” situation due to the hazards associated with this change.

Things to be aware of:

- **The timing of the event**
- **Maintain continuity of operations**
- **Maintain continuity of communications**
- **Give and receive clear and thorough briefings**
- **Account for all resources**
- **Convey current leaders intent, strategies, tactics, priorities and communication methods**
- **Clearly articulate leadership changes in the field**
- **Transfer of command must be announced and acknowledged by ALL resources.**

Over the next couple of days there will be transitions and a significant relocation of resources. Be flexible and ensure you have accountability of your people, know where you are going and who you are working for.
