#### Discussion: \*\*\*HOT AND DRY CONDITIONS TO CONTINUE THROUGH THE WEEKEND\*\*\*

Warm and dry conditions along with generally light wind will continue through the weekend. An approaching cold front pushes into the Pacific Northwest today and then stalls out near the California/Oregon border region Sunday and weakens. This region could see another brief shot of North to Northeast wind early Monday morning but then shift westerly by the afternoon. Otherwise, light winds aloft will be over the area. Therefore, generally terrain driven winds are expected in the lower drainages.

Max Temperature: Mid-80s higher elevation, except 95 to 100 lower valleys.

**GENERAL FUEL ASSUMPTIONS:** It has been over 100 days since much of the fire area has received over 0.10" of precipitation and all three groups are extremely dry and are burning readily. 10 Hr fuel moistures in the fire area were observed at 5-8% on August 28<sup>th</sup>.

#### **GENERAL**

Fuels continue to dry due to lack of precipitation combined with low humidity's (15-25%) yesterday. Smoke over the fire area is impacting fire spread and behavior, but the potential is still there for rapid fire movement and moderate/extreme fire behavior if the airshed clears out. Most of the fire spread is anticipated to be terrain driven except on exposed ridgetops.

#### SPECIFIC:

>Branch I: Anticipate continued Fire spread up the Willow Creek drainage towards the M2 Road closing the gap between the Doe and Glade Fires. These fires are likely to join during today/tomorrows operational period. Tatham fire is expected to continue to spread upslope/updrainage and move towards the Doe fire.

>Branch II: Active upslope fire spread on the Western edge of the Doe Fire. The pocket of unburned fuel in the 311 Road area will continue to fill in as the fire moves upslope along Bear Wallow Ridge.

>Branch III: Anticipate continued upslope fire spread in the Dutch Oven Creek/Deaty Ridge Area.

>Branch IV: Hull Fire, expect continued fire movement upslope to the NE along Panther Ridge towards Lee Logan Camp. Likely that the Hull and Doe fires will burn together during today/tomorrows operational period.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke will continue to impact air operations.

#### SAFETY

Fire behavior has been consistent for the last few days, but the hazards still exist. Do not get complacent and let your guard down. Maintain LCES.



# Air Resource Advisor Margaret Key

Uses air monitors, computer modeling, and information from the FBAN and IMET to forecast smoke conditions for surrounding communities. Daily smoke forecasts can be found at https://wildlandfiresmoke.net/outlooks

Can also forecast surface smoke at a location of concern, like where smoke might cross a highway and create visibility issues.

Work with air pollution control agencies to provide information about expected smoke levels, and communicate efforts the firefighters are taking to minimize the amount of smoke – such as trying to keep the fire footprint low.

Working with PIO, provide information to the public about health effects of smoke, ways to minimize smoke exposure, and who is especially at risk for health impacts from smoke. Can also provide information about interaction between wildfire smoke and Covid.



Major Hazards and Risks: Dusty Roads, Wildlife, Heat Related Injury

Incident Fire Behavior: Don't be deceived about fire behavior. Each day, fuels are drier and the fire perimeter expands, bringing it closer to work areas. Know where the main fire is and where spot fires ignite. Confirm lookouts, communications, escape routes and safety zones are acceptable as you move and conditions change.

**Firefighter Fatigue:** Working long hours will catch up to you quickly, **be sure to maintain your 2 to 1 rest/recovery hours.** Accumulated fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods, which results in decreased productivity, compromised immune function, and reduced alertness. Fatigued workers perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors and become inattentive. Chronic fatigue often results in increased stress, which may present itself through certain behavioral and physiological indicators, some of those behaviors indicators are:

- Decreased motivation and low morale
- Increased irritability and poor attention or concentration.

# Recommendations for chronic fatigue/stress are:

- Ensure that workers are adequately rested before they begin work shifts.
- Provide periodic rest breaks to allow physical and mental recovery.
- Maintain hydration.



# Important Notes:

- \* Recovered is defined as 10 days since symptoms first appeared AND 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medicines AND other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving.
- Symptoms of COVID-19 include cough, shortness of breath, trouble breathing, fever, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle or body aches, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.
- Contact Assessment should be conducted to help determine potential exposure of additional employees; conduct assessment for the 2-day period before illness onset or test date of sick employees, whichever came first.
- Close contact is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 1.5 minutes with or without face coverings/ masks. Casual contact is defined as less than 6 feet for less than 1.5 minutes or more than 6 feet for more than 1.5 minutes.
- Any employee in "close contact with someone who is sick" may return to the workplace if the sick person is tested for COVID-19 and the test is negative.
- Contact with exposed individuals is classified as secondary contact and does not typically require self-isolation unless the exposed individual tests positive.
- You do not need to self-isolate unless you meet one of the criteria identified.
- Always follow the advice of a medical provider, if given, including any need for isolation or clearance for return-to-duty.

This document is subject to change based on CDC guidance.

# PAUSE BEFORE POSTING IMAGES

- fireline personnel not wearing full PPE
- identifiable structures (i.e. addresses)
- burning / burned structures
- inmate crews
- faces of children
- accident or investigation scenes
- sensitive natural or cultural resources

(or QR codes to maps that identify them)

- whiteboards / flipcharts with passwords or internal contacts listed

# California Penal Code 409.5(d)

Nothing shall prevent a duly authorized representative of any news service, newspaper, radio or television station or network from entering the areas closed pursuant to this section. Exceptions are crime scenes or deliberately interfering with incident operations.

Only California and New Jersey have laws which allow unlimited access to emergency areas to legitimate press. Journalists do not have a general right to access private property. Consent is between the journalists and persons having control of the property; not the public safety agency.

The California Penal Code allows media access to scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance, but not to crime scenes. Media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede firefighting operations. If entering a location is hazardous, they should be advised of the situation.


