<u>Discussion:</u> ***HOT AND DRY CONDITIONS TO CONTINUE THROUGH THE WEEKEND***

The region will remain between the main jet stream (well to the north) and a weak upper trough across Southern California for one more day. As a result, light winds are expected across the fire area this afternoon. A weak dry cold front drops into the northern portions of the Great Basin Sunday night and into Monday. Slight cooling is possible along with a brief shift of winds from the NE. This may bring battling winds to the east side of the fire where normal down drainage winds typically are from the west. A strong upper ridge re-builds over the region for the first part of the week bringing once again well above normal temperatures.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

SKY/WEATHER: Mostly sunny.

Max Temperature: 80 to 85 higher elevation, except mid 90s lower valleys.

Min RH: 18 to 28 percent.

-20 ft Level WINDS:

Lower Valleys/Lower Slopes Down drainage wind in the morning up to 10 mph, becoming up drainage by noon. **Upper Ridges:** East 10 mph shifting South to Southwest around 10 mph by early afternoon. Afternoon gusts to 15 mph

GENERAL FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: It has been over 100 days since much of the fire area has received over 0.10" of precipitation and all three groups are extremely dry and are burning readily. 10 Hr fuel moistures in the fire area were again observed at 5-8% on August 29th.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

Fuels continue to dry due to lack of precipitation combined with low humidity's (18-28%) yesterday. Smoke over the fire area is impacting fire spread and behavior, but the potential is still there for rapid fire movement and moderate/extreme fire behavior if the airshed clears out. Most of the fire spread is anticipated to be terrain driven except on exposed ridgetops.

SPECIFIC:

- >Branch I: Anticipate continued Fire spread up the Willow Creek drainage towards the M2 Road closing the gap between the Doe and Glade Fires. Post lookouts and monitor the situation developing on the Elkhorn Fire to the N/NE.
- >Branch II: Active upslope fire spread on the Western edge of the Doe Fire. The pocket of unburned fuel in the 311 Road area will continue to fill in as the fire moves upslope along Bear Wallow Ridge.
- >Branch III: Anticipate continued terrain influenced fire spread along Brushy Camp Ridge.
- >Branch IV: Hull Fire, the NE portion of the fire is beginning to curve to the NW towards Pole Point/Goat Rock. Maintain SA during the firing operations on the Southern portion of the fire.
- >Branch V: Hopkins fire, IR indicates significant heat along the Northern half of the fire perimeter. Expect continued fire movement to the north following terrain and fuels. Willow Basin fire, some heat detected on SE corner of the fire. Does not appear to be significant perimeter growth over the last few operational periods. Continue to monitor fire spread.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke will continue to impact air operations.

SAFETY

Accurate situational awareness (SA) requires constant reassessment of conditions (existing or potential) that may impact the safety and effectiveness of tactics. Monitoring for the 18 Watchout Situations and establishing operational / environmental limits ("trigger points") ahead of time can help to focus SA, prompt reassessment, and help you re-evaluate the risk of current actions.



Major Hazards and Risks: Dusty Roads, Night Operations, Burn Operations

Dusty Roads: Driving to your work assignments may take you on new roads with hazards you have not seen before. Some of the incident roads are narrow with limited visibility and few pull-outs. Increased fire traffic and residents should be expected around homes. Adjust your driving for smoke, dust and night operations. *Watch for degraded areas in the road on between drop point 10 & drop point 11.*

Night Operations: Be sure to get a good briefing before you start your assignment. Identify whom you might get additional information from and can you meet up with the departing overhead/resource leaders? Travel your escape route before the sun sets if possible, stay alert by staying engaged with your assignment.

Burn Out Operations: All burning operations must be approved through operations, fire should be applied slowly and strategically in order to the maximize benefits of the indirect firefighting approach. After the operation is complete, be sure to monitor the area, looking for areas that are still holding heat and could threaten to jump over the containment line.



Safety Zones

In an area where a firefighter can survive without a fire shelter? IRPG p.8

- Take advantage of hear barriers such as lee side of ridges, rocks, or solid structures.
- When possible, burn out safety zones prior to arrival of the fire front.
- Avoid locations that are upslope or downwind from the fire, chimneys, saddles, or narrow canyons, and steep uphill escape routes.
- Not intended for structure protection.





Important Notes:

- * Recovered is defined as 10 days since symptoms first appeared AND 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever-reducing medicines AND other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving.

 Symptoms of COVID-19 include cough, shortness of breath, trouble breathing, fever, chills,
 - Symptoms of COVID-19 include cough, shortness of breath, trouble breathing, fever, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle or body aches, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.
- Contact Assessment should be conducted to help determine potential exposure of additional employees; conduct assessment for the 2-day period before illness onset or test date of sick employees, whichever came first.
- Close contact is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 1.5 minutes with or without face coverings/ masks. Casual contact is defined as less than 6 feet for less than 1.5 minutes or more than 6 feet for more than 1.5 minutes.
- Any employee in "close contact with someone who is sick" may return to the workplace if the sick person is tested for COVID-19 and the test is negative.
- Contact with exposed individuals is classified as secondary contact and does not typically require selfsiolation unless the exposed individual tests positive.
- You do not need to self-isolate unless you meet one of the criteria identified.
- Always follow the advice of a medical provider, if given, including any need for isolation or clearance for return-to-duty.


