Excessive Heat Warning For The Weekend

Fire Weather Watch Monday Evening through Wednesday Morning

The strong upper ridge over the Great Basin will produce dangerously hot and dry weather for the fire area through the Labor Day holiday weekend. These conditions will produce single digit RHs with mainly terrain driven winds and southwesterly ridge top winds. A dry backdoor front is expected to move into the region early next week with breezy north to northeasterly winds likely Monday evening through Wednesday morning.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

SKY/WEATHER: Sunny, hot and hazy.

Max Temperature: 88 to 93 higher elevation and smoked filled valleys, except 100 to 105 lower valleys.

Min RH: 7 to 13 percent

GENERAL FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: It has been over 100-150 days since much of the fire area has received over 0.10" of precipitation and fuels are extremely dry and are burning readily. 10 Hr fuel moistures in the fire area were observed at 5-6% on September 4th. This is down 2-3 % from September 3rd. Smoke has moderated fire behavior for several days. Be mindful if visibility improves over the fire area as this will bring elevated fire behavior. **This is likely to occur around 1100-1200 today.**

FIRE BEHAVIOR OUTPUTS

GENERAL

Fuels continue to dry due to lack of precipitation combined with low humidity's (7-20%) yesterday. Smoke over the fire continues to impact fire spread and behavior, but the potential is still there for rapid fire movement and moderate/extreme fire behavior if the airshed clears out. Most of the fire spread is anticipated to be terrain driven except on exposed ridgetops.

SPECIFIC: Clearer sky's beginning around 1100-1200 today.

>Branch I: Anticipate continued Fire spread up slope/up drainage during the day and down drainage/downslope at night with diurnal wind patterns. Post lookouts and monitor the situation on the Elkhorn Fire to the N/NE. Movement on the spot fire on Boswell Ridge is expected to spread up the ridgeline with backing and flanking down the ridge edges.

>Branch II: Active upslope fire spread on the Western edge of the Doe Fire. Maintain SA on fire moving into Panther Creek near the Archer Cabin area. If fire moves into the bottom of the drainage expect fire spread up drainage to the SW towards Smith Camp.

>Branch III/IV: Anticipate pockets of unburned fuel especially along Brushy Camp Ridge to clean up. Hull Fire, the NE portion of the fire has aligned with terrain and is in more favorable terrain for fire spread to the N/NW. This area of fire has reached the M1 Road. Maintain SA during the firing operations on the Southern portion of the fire.

>Branch V: Hopkins fire, IR indicates significant heat along the Northern half of the fire perimeter. Expect continued fire movement to the north following terrain and fuels. Willow Basin fire, some heat detected on SE corner of the fire. Does not appear to be significant perimeter growth over the last few operational periods. Continue to monitor fire spread.

The mixing of the airmass that has kept fire spread and behavior moderated the last few days will increase today and strengthen through Monday/Tuesday. This wx could support conditions for more active fire behavior than we have seen the last few days. Think about securing those identified weak spots along control lines now to set us up for success. Winds are forecasted out of the S/SW today, transitioning to NE by Monday/Tuesday. **ElkHorn fire: Continue to maintain SA on this developing situation. **

AIR OPERATIONS:

Periods of clear sky may allow for utilization of aircraft today.

SAFETY

The success of a firefighter's mission depends upon the crew's ability to alter behavior and dynamically manage resources to meet situational demands. Adaptability/flexibility allows firefighters to alter a course of action based on new information, maintain constructive behavior under pressure and adapt to internal (body) and external (e.g., fire behavior, new assignment and crew experience levels) changes that occur on the fire ground.

Major Hazards & Risks: Driving, Hydration, and Fire Behavior

Driving: Much of the work on the fire is moving into the west side concentrating the amount of traffic on the same roads. This also means the roads we are using will deteriorate much more quickly. Keep headlights on at all times, expect to meet another vehicle at all times, and don't follow another vehicle so closely that you cannot see due to the dust.

The Heat Is On! The next few days the temperature will be rising. It will be important to stay hydrated beginning the first thing in the morning. While working drink at least 1 quart of fluid per hour. Use page 109 in the IRPG to review the symptoms of heat related injuries.

Fire Behavior: Temps are getting hotter this week. This will cause an increase in fire behavior. Keep your situational awareness up, if the smoke or cloud cover breaks, the fire will take this opportunity to make aggressive runs. Fuels are cured and available to burn when conditions are favorable. The terrain is the major influence at this time on the fire behavior. Watch for winds increases in the fire weather forecast as this will increase the fire activity.

- MEDL and Incident Safety Officer will assist with the coordination of further medical care and mode of transportation.
- Ambulance and/or air resources will be coordinated through MEDL and SOF1.

Contact MEDL and SOF1 with patient complaint/condition and location.

Notify Medical Unit of any injury/illness being transported to Medical Unit prior to transport.





HATCH ACT

The purpose of the Act is to maintain a federal workforce that is free from partisan political influence or coercion. Including overhead, Federal and non-federal, and contractors are subject to the Hatch Act at all locations, to include the Incident Command Post and all base and spike camps, while assigned to a Federal Incident. Personal service contractors are covered by the Hatch Act.

The Hatch Act imposes limited restrictions on employee conduct, including those assigned to a Federal Incident as noted above, related to issue-based advocacy and organizations. Specifically, employees who are on duty or in the workplace may not associate their issue-based advocacy with the success or failure of a political party, a partisan political group, or a candidate for partisan political office.

Employees also may not knowingly solicit, accept, or receive political contributions, i.e., contributions made for the purpose of promoting or opposing a political party, a partisan political group, or a candidate for partisan political office, even if such conduct is done on behalf of an issue-based organization.

In other words, while purely issue-based conduct is not prohibited by the Hatch Act, if an employee's issue-based conduct includes some element of political activity or political fundraising then the relevant Hatch Act prohibitions will apply. Included, but not limited to, are political symbols or other graphics on headwear, T-shirts, coffee mugs, bumper stickers, buttons, in locations covered above. Failure and/or refusal to adhere to the above is grounds for release from the incident.




