Excessive Heat Warning Through Tuesday

Fire Weather Watch Monday Evening through Wednesday Morning

The extremely dangerous heatwave will continue with strong upper ridging over the region producing near record hot and dry weather for the fire area through Tuesday. These conditions will produce single digit RHs with mainly terrain driven winds and southwesterly ridge top winds. A dry backdoor front is expected to move into the region Monday evening with breezy north to northeasterly winds and critically low RHs likely Monday night through Wednesday morning.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

SKY/WEATHER: Sunny, hot and hazy.

Max Temperature: 88 to 94 higher elevation and smoked filled valleys, except 102 to 108 lower valleys.

Min RH: 6 to 12 percent

-20 ft Level WINDS:

Lower Valleys/Lower Slopes Down drainage 5 to 10 mph, becoming up drainage around 10 mph by noon.

Upper Ridges: Southwest wind 10 to 15 mph.

GENERAL FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: It has been over 100-150 days since much of the fire area has received over 0.10" of precipitation and fuels are extremely dry and burning readily. 10 Hr fuel moistures in the fire area were observed at 4-6% on September 5th. This is down 1-2% from September 4th. Smoke has moderated fire behavior for several days but that will continue to change over the next few days. Be mindful if visibility improves over the fire area as this will bring elevated fire behavior. **This is likely to occur around 1100-1200 today.**

FIRE BEHAVIOR OUTPUTS

GENERAL

Fuels continue to dry due to lack of precipitation combined with low humidity's (5-22%) yesterday. Smoke over the fire continues to impact fire spread and behavior, but the potential is still there for rapid fire movement and moderate/extreme fire behavior if the airshed clears out. Most of the fire spread is anticipated to be terrain driven except on exposed ridgetops.

SPECIFIC: Clearer sky's beginning around 1100-1200 today.

>Branch I: Anticipate continued Fire spread up slope/up drainage during the day and down drainage/downslope at night with diurnal wind patterns. Post lookouts and monitor the situation on the Elkhorn Fire to the N/NE. Movement on the spot fire on Boswell Ridge is expected to spread up the ridgeline with backing and flanking down the ridge edges.

>Branch II: Active upslope fire spread on the Western edge of the Doe Fire. Maintain SA on fire moving into Panther Creek near the Archer Cabin area. If fire moves into the bottom of the drainage expect fire spread up drainage to the SW towards Smith Camp.

>Branch III/IV: Anticipate pockets of unburned fuel especially along Brushy Camp Ridge to clean up. Hull Fire, the NE portion of the fire has aligned with terrain and is in more favorable terrain for fire spread to the N/NW. This area of fire has reached the M1 Road. Maintain Spread W. Henking fire 10 to 10 to

>Branch V: Hopkins fire, IR indicates significant heat along the Northern half of the fire perimeter. Expect continued fire movement to the north following terrain and fuels. Willow Basin fire, some heat detected on SE corner of the fire. This area has aligned in a NE/SW chute and may move to the NE as is burns upslope.

The mixing of the airmass that has kept fire spread and behavior moderated the last few days will increase today and strengthen through Monday/Tuesday. This wx could support conditions for more active fire behavior than we have seen the last few days. Think about securing those identified weak spots along control lines now to set us up for success. Winds are forecasted out of the SW today, transitioning to NE by Monday/Tuesday. **ElkHorn fire: Continue to maintain SA on this developing situation. **

AIR OPERATIONS:

Periods of clear sky may allow for utilization of aircraft today.

SAFETY

Areas of the fire that burned previously are beginning to reburn and snags are starting to fall across the roads. Continue to monitor these areas and maintain your SA. Scout and confirm the black if you are considering it for a safety zone.


Major Hazards & Risks: Air Operations, Drop Zones, Flight Hazards

Air Operations: Be aware of the location and flight patterns of aircraft during drop operations. Be sure you have positive contact with the pilot before the drop. Clear all persons and vehicles from the drop zone prior to the arrival of the aircraft. Be aware of streamers or parachutes that don't open.

Drop Zones: If caught in a drop zone do the following: hold your hand tool away from your body, lie face down with hard hat on and head toward the oncoming aircraft, grasp something firm to prevent being carried or rolled about by dropped liquid, don't run unless escape is ensured, get clear of dead sags and tops, be aware of rolling debris below the drop site in steep terrain.

Flight Hazards: Should the operation or the flight be stopped due to a change in conditions? Consider the following: radio communications, environmental conditions-weather, visibility, terrain, elevation, temperature, mission priorities, successful mission completion probabilities. Is there a better way to do it? Is there pressure to complete a mission at all costs? Can you justify your actions? Is the mission airspace confined or congested? Multiple aircraft, Mixed types of aircraft, Poor visibility.






Human Resource Message




