Breezy northeasterly winds are still likely this morning into this afternoon combined with low RHs for critical fire weather conditions. High pressure will slowly weaken over the region tonight. The weakened high pressure center will move out of the region later in the week with warm and dry conditions continuing as winds become light and mainly terrain driven into the weekend.

**GENERAL FUEL ASSUMPTIONS:** It has been well over 100 days since much of the fire area has received over 0.10" of precipitation and fuels are extremely dry and burning readily. 10 Hr fuel moistures in the fire area were observed at 3-4% on September 8th. The airshed was most likely cleared out over a good portion of the fire area yesterday so expect clear skies on some areas of the fire.

#### **FIRE BEHAVIOR OUTPUTS**

#### **GENERAL**

Fuels continue to dry every day and humidity's over the fire area were recorded at 04-33% yesterday. Expect less smoke over the fire area today as yesterday's high winds cleared the airshed to some extent. High winds may still be experienced over the upper ridges; however, most of the fire spread should be terrain/diurnal wind influenced. The fire area has changed since yesterdays operational period so maintain your SA and re-establish your escape routes and safety zones.

# **Planning using PACE**

**PACE** is an acronym (Primary, Alternate, Contingency and Emergency) used initially for military communication system planning but has benefits relative to operational planning. Planning for the worst case scenario allows wildfire operations personnel to be prepared for any eventuality even though things might go exactly as planned. Defined, PACE is:

- Primary the routine and most effective operational approach. (anchor, flank, pinch, secure)
- Alternate anther common method of wildfire strategy/tactics with minimal or no additional impact. May
  be used along with the primary under normal circumstances. (Supporting crews and engines with aviation,
  heavy equipment, etc.)
- Contingency This method will normally not be as convenient or efficient as the first two methods, but is
  capable of achieving objectives when necessary. (Emergency Equipment Rental Agreements, out of GACC
  resources, etc.)
- **Emergency** This is a method of last resort that probably has significant negative impacts or will create significant delays. (Transitioning to a higher complexity team)

#### **Leaders Intent**


All leaders of firefighters have the responsibility to provide complete briefings and ensure that their subordinates have a clear understanding of their intent for the assignment:

- TASK = What is to be done
- PURPOSE = Why is it to be done
- END STATE = How it should look when done

The Risk Management Process assists in ensuring that critical factors and risks of the fireline work environment are considered during decision-making. Good risk management utilizes a six-step process:

### New Collector Map Released - August Complex 2020 Collector Map v2


We are releasing a new version of the Collector map for Operations on the August Complex fire.

We made some changes to the Collector map to streamline data collection and to reduce the size of the basemaps, as we recognize that internet/cell coverage is sparse and syncing the maps has been problematic in some areas.

Releasing a new map makes it easier for field personnel to get the new functionality than updating the existing map. The old map will be retired at noon 9/9/2020. The new map is available now.

You can sync any existing edits from the previous map before removing the offline area and map in Collector. If there are errors with the sync, back out of the map and switch to the new v2 map.

Open the new v2 map and select the offline area (basemap) that covers the area where you will be working. The image below shows the extents of the new offline areas.



We have posted a help document for removing map areas (it is easy) and a Collector Field Guide to the QR folder that is linked on all our maps and below.

# Creating a Personal Hygiene Routine: Tips and Benefits




