Discussion:

Warm and dry conditions with a lot of smoke will last into the weekend. Daytime RH will remain low with poor overnight recoveries through the weekend. Winds will become light and mainly terrain driven for the valleys and mid-slopes today and Friday. Ridge top winds will see a generally weak Southeasterly flow that could become overpowered by local terrain winds.

FIRE BEHAVIOR OUTPUTS

GENERAL

Fuels are at critically dry levels and continue to dry each and every day. Relative humidity's were recorded at 4-29% yesterday. Smoke over the fire continues to impact fire spread and behavior, but less than what was experienced prior to the wind event. Lighter winds should bring some relief but there is still the potential for rapid fire movement and moderate/extreme fire behavior. Terrain should play a greater role in fire spread and direction than yesterday.


HEALTH AND SAFETY MESSAGE

"Working safely may get old but so do the folks that practice it."

Major Hazards & Risks: Complacency

All humans are faced with making decisions. Some decisions have minimal consequence while others are momentous with serious consequences. Regardless of the outcome the process by which we make decisions is the same. Our expectation of our decision's end result is always a combination two things: the chances of a bad outcome and the amount of value we will receive (risk vs. reward). Expectations need to be founded in factual, analytic processes but are often affected by emotion, hope and outside influences. Repetitive exposure to risk can create a sense of false security and as a result what should be scary becomes commonplace. It is extremely difficult to stay alert when you are inside your comfort zone. The truth is, there is no fire environment that does not have an inherent element of risk and fire line personnel are always in danger of injury or worse. In fire suppression we might consider a high risk tactic, for instance helicopter rappelling, for the opportunity to place firefighters on a small fire with growth potential in inaccessible terrain. In some instances, the risk is worth the reward. It is vitally important to separate the emotion, hope and outside influences from decision making. Objective risk management, sound strategy and tested tactics are the only way to effectively minimize bad decisions.

Human Factor Watch Outs

Watching out for yourself, coworkers, subordinates and your boss is a primary responsibility for everyone involved in high risk activities. Watch outs are not just for the tactical environment. The Human Factor Watch Outs are designed to create an opportunity for you to take a tactical pause and re-evaluate your situation. If any of the following occur:

- Your briefing was unclear.
- You are not getting answers to your questions.
- You are not getting clear acknowledgement of your message.
- You are encountering hazards that are not mentioned in your brief.
- Your team is not debriefing.
- Your tempo is too high to maintain command and control.
