## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY

High Pressure returns – Warm, Dry and Gusty winds.  
See attached Weather Forecast in IAP

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

Fuels range from annual grasses, light to heavy brush and timber. This area of California is under a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory (dated 9/29/20) for extremely dry fuels and resulting increases in fire behavior.

The week of October 5<sup>th</sup> begins with above average temperatures and lower than average RH's and the month of September was warmer than average. Fuels have responded by shedding what little moisture they had left. 100-hr fuels in the fire area are now at 7% which is extremely dry and half of the seasonal normal. 1000-hr fuels are at 9% which are also extremely dry and above the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile. All of this is to tell you what you are seeing in the field – fuels are critically dry and completely available to the fire environment. Much less heat is required to drive moisture out of the fuels which means more of that heat is available to continue the flaming front. Torching and spotting should be expected every burn period and likely continuing to be active through the night. Few natural barriers will hold fire spread and the dominating factor in fire spread will be shading from smoke, and this will only keep it stoved up until it can get a breath of fresh air.

October looks to be warmer and drier than average with a continuation of active burning conditions through the month and likely into November. In the last week much of Northern California including the Mendocino region was elevated from severe to extreme drought.

#### SPECIFIC:

##### Branch – 7

High humidities yesterday moderated fire behavior in light fuels. Today will be a day of drying and at times gusty winds. Heavy fuels, and interior islands will continue to consume. Smoldering heat near control lines is still possible. Gusty Northwest winds in the afternoon will be in opposition to control lines in T and U.

##### Branch – 11

In Div. KK interior heat may still be found in heavy fuels within the slop over. If firing operations continue, the fine fuels will not likely carry fire until late in the day. 10, 100- and 1000-hour fuels will still carry fire. Gusty Northwest wind this afternoon can carry spots from the B1 burn across the line.

#### AIR OPERATION:

Nighttime inversion lifting 1000 hrs.

#### SAFETY

Gusty winds today could shake dry leaves and needles onto recently burned areas. Needle cast fires can threaten control lines.

### HAZARD TREES AND SNAGS – FATIGUE – WEATHER/FUELS - DRIVING

#### HAZARD TREES AND SNAGS

##### EVERY DIVISION POTENTIAL FOR ROLLOUT AND WIND STRESSED TREES

**Watch Out** - The Great Basin team on the North East section had a major injury tree vs vehicle a few days ago. Today's shift will see an increase in winds. Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fireline. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazard trees. Numerous incidents in the last few months of snags and falling trees have cause damage and or injury to firefighters.

**Mitigation** - Watch where you are walking, working, parked and driving. Eliminate the hazards with qualified sawyers or heavy equipment. Avoid hazards by designating "No Work Zones" (flag and map), limit nighttime operations. Modify suppression tactics or fireline location to avoid high risk trees. Post lookouts to help secure high-risk areas. Provide feedback regarding hazard trees. **Keep clear of bucket drops near trees/snags.**

#### FATIGUE

##### TREAT TODAY'S SHIFT as if it WAS YOUR FIRST SHIFT

**Watch Out** - Everyone has been working for a long period of time. Decreased motivation and low morale. Increased irritability. Confused, poor decision solving. Extreme emotional responses. Dehydrated personnel. Driving while fatigued.

**Mitigation** - Take longer periods of rest and recovery. Alternate between heavy and light tasks. Eat well balanced meals and hydrate regularly. Get a relief driver if needed or pull over to get rest. Stay in Covelo to get rest before heading down the hill. Stay hydrated for today and pre-hydrate for tomorrow.

#### WEATHER/FUELS

##### INCREASED WINDS and WIND SHIFTS IN FIRE AREA

**Watch Out** - Erratic Fire Behavior due to WIND changing of direction. Live and dead fuels are extremely dry across Northern California. Extreme fire behavior and rapid rates of spread are occurring in these areas, even when winds are light. Fire behavior changes due to current fire weather indices resulting in explosive fuels. Working in and around above normal fine fuel loading. Expect slope reversal anytime fire is backing into a drainage. Fire behavior will remain elevated across the mountains across the region, until significant rainfall occurs. Weather will be getting hotter and dryer.

**Mitigation** - All local and visiting firefighters need to remain aware of current and expected weather and burning conditions and consider such information while making strategic and tactical decisions. **Fight fire aggressively, but provide for safety first.**

#### DRIVING

##### ROAD CONDIONS MAY CHANGE DURING THE DAY

**Watch Out** - Don't assume the road is in the same condition as you least were on it. Rain and cooler temperatures were on the fireline yesterday. Increased stopping distances. Oils surfacing on asphalt. Animals in the roadway. Last shift we had a deer strike causing considerable damage to the vehicle.

**Mitigation** - Drive the roads with extreme caution. Give yourself an increased stopping buffer zone. Expect the unexpected from oncoming vehicles to animals entering the roadway. **DRIVE DEFENSIVELY**




## FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN: AUGUST WEST INCIDENT

Fire suppression repair is the repair of damage caused directly from fire suppression activities. It is not the repair of infrastructure or rehabilitation of burned areas that happened as a result of the fire itself.

Damaged facilities will be upgraded to functional status to mitigate future damage. Projects too large or complex to be completed by the Fire Suppression Repair Group shall be transferred to the Comp/Claims Unit or the local Unit. Repair work shall only occur in locations authorized by the Operations Division and where fire suppression activities are complete. Fire Suppression Repair Group resources shall evaluate all Divisions for appropriate repair needs. This includes areas inside and outside the fire perimeter, provided the damage was caused by official fire suppression activities. Extra care will be exercised and equipment will be monitored when operating in locations where new fire starts are more likely to occur, such as rocky areas in dry grass. New fires will be reported following the instructions in the radio call plan.

Examples of items that may be repaired include, but are not limited to:

Infrastructure Damage	Natural Resource Damage
Fences and gates	Soil erosion
Culverts, bridges, and other watercourse crossings	Adverse impacts to air and water quality
Water sources	Adverse impacts to protected species of plants and animals
Utility distribution lines (above or below ground)	
Road barriers removed for fire access	
Trash, debris, and supplies left by fire suppression resources	
Miscellaneous damage to residential property	

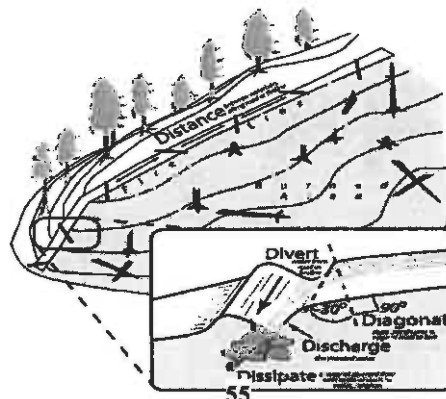
### Dozer Line Repair

Dozers construct both fire and contingency lines. Dozer line width varies greatly. The following measures shall be implemented for constructed dozer line:

- Berms and push-piles shall be spread out to the extent feasible. This may be accomplished by back-blading and/or using ripper shanks or grapples. Debris piled against trees or perched above watercourses is especially important to remove or disperse.
- Waterbreaks shall be constructed at a 30-45 degree angle and shall be a minimum depth of 12 inches from the bottom of the cut to the top of the berm. Where feasible, the discharge from waterbreaks shall be directed into vegetated or rocked areas.
- Where slopes exceed the range at which a tractor can effectively work, waterbreaks shall be constructed with hand tools.
- Roads used in fire suppression activities shall be left in the same condition they were found or better. Gravel and soil-surfaced roads shall be watered to prevent excessive dust. Where fire suppression activities have damaged or rendered road drainage facilities non-functional, waterbreaks or drivable dips shall be installed for drainage.
- Where fire suppression activities have filled in or damaged inside ditches, the ditches shall be cleaned and left unobstructed.
- Spacing of waterbreaks shall be as follows:

Prevailing gradient	Maximum waterbreak spacing
0-10%	200 feet
11-25%	150 feet
26-50%	100 feet
>50%	75 feet

*Spacing criteria is a general guide. Actual location of waterbreaks should be tailored to the topography and placement suited to the best dispersal of water flow.*
