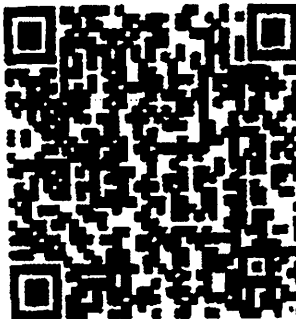

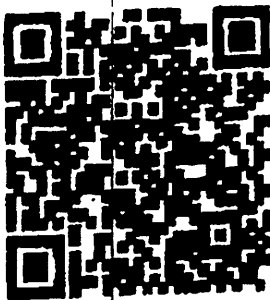

Ensure all resources have a clear understanding of assignments and associated hazards. • Protect homes, businesses, communities, utility infrastructure, transportation corridors, county watersheds and timber values from immediate and long-term threats. Contain the fire where it is safe to do so. Have contingency plans for uncontained fire edge. • Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated. • Ensure coordination and communication is taking place between South Zone, West Zone, and Area Command to ensure unified strategic direction, efficient resource use, and common public messaging across all three zones. • Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread. • Treat all personnel with dignity and respect by providing a harassment free, zero-tolerance work environment. • Ensure financial and documentation packages are prepared in accordance with agency requirements and agreements are closed out when no longer necessary.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: *****Warmer and Drier*****
Temp: Max. 3,000': 74-79, 5,000': 63-67; Min. 3,000': 45-50, 5,000': 49-54.
RH: Min. 3,000': 24-29%, 5,000': 30-35%; Max. 3,000': 60-70%, 5,000': 50-55%.
Wind: 3,000' down slope in the morning becoming upslope 3-5 in the afternoon.
 5,000' NE 3-5 mph in the morning increasing to NNW 6-9 mph in the afternoon.

FUELS & FUEL MOISTURE:

- Fuels vary greatly based on elevation and aspect but are primarily timber with patches of open grass and areas of brush.
- At all elevations, fuels are critically dry and in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Heavy fuels are supporting fire spread even when weather conditions are not conducive for large fire growth.

Fine Fuels: 4-7% based on shading; 1000-hr 8%; ERCg Friend Mountain 71 (73rd percentile); PIG 70%

GENERAL:

The following fire behavior outputs are based on eind and slope alignment.

SPECIFIC:

Branch XXI – The fire will be pushed back onto itself minimizing the potential for spotting outside the current perimeter. Slope and fuel alignment will lead to increased fire behavior where heavy fuel concentrations are found.

Branch XXXI – Fire will continue to slowly back down Rattlesnake Ridge to the north. Spotting potential is reduced due to forecast wind direction. Rollout is always a concern on slopes but will run up the slope back towards the existing spots. Fire that is checked in drainage bottom will not be affected by the general winds and minimal spread is expected.

Branch IV - Minimal threats to the line are expected. Interior fuels will continue to burn out especially in areas that have heavy fuel concentrations to support combustion.

Structure Protection – Fire is not expected to impact structures in either Ruth Valley or Post Mountain. Forecast wind will and higher humidity will minimize the ability or fire to spread in lighter fuels and lower the probability for fire to move rapidly toward structures.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0654 Sunset 1910. Light winds will lead to smoky conditions over the fire limiting opportunities for aviation usage.

SAFETY: Fire weakened trees will continue to be an issue as fuels burn out. Assessing work areas for fresh hazards will minimize the chance of surprise outcomes.



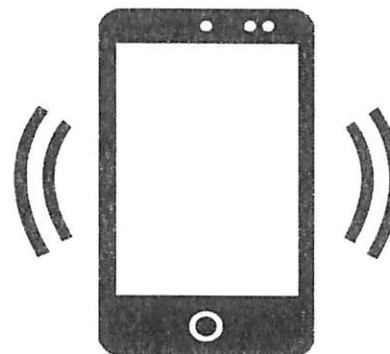

Transfer of Command

Operational Engagement:

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. There is a high potential for fatalities, serious injuries, or incidents (some have occurred in the past). Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:

- No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel.
- Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed.
- Communications: face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.
- Not all Resources know who is in command.

Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
- Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.
- Transition supervision at the morning briefing.
- Utilize the *Incident Response Pocket Guide*, PMS 461 Briefing Checklist (inside back cover).

If in doubt about any of these symptoms, consult a Physician.

In the past 14 days, have you had contact with a person known to be infected with the coronavirus (COVID-19)?

Take temperature with touchless thermometer if available

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SCREENING

- If resource is positive for any symptoms prior to mobilization **DO NOT MOBILIZE.**
- At Entries – Consider the adequate number of personnel needed for screening. Although medical personnel are ideal, screeners do not have to be medically trained.
 - o If resource is positive for any symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry **DO NOT ANNOUNCE-** ask to step aside.
 - o Escort sick individual to isolation area.
 - o Isolation support personnel should begin documentation. Have sick individual contact Supervisor for further direction.
 - o Notify public health officials.
 - o Have individual transported as appropriate.
 - o Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information or Personal Health Information.

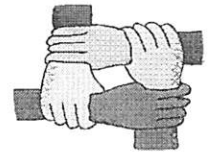



