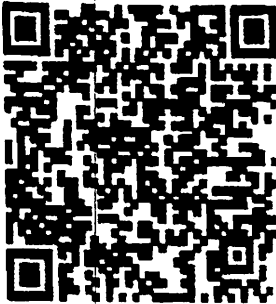

3. Objective(s): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety by assessing and mitigating risk in order to develop and implement sound tactical operations. Ensure all resources have a clear understanding of assignments and associated hazards. • Protect homes, businesses, communities, utility infrastructure, transportation corridors, county watersheds and timber values from immediate and long-term threats. Contain the fire where it is safe to do so. Have contingency plans for uncontained fire edge. • Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated. • Ensure coordination and communication is taking place between South Zone, West Zone, and Area Command to ensure unified strategic direction, efficient resource use, and common public messaging across all three zones. • Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread. • Treat all personnel with dignity and respect by providing a harassment free, zero-tolerance work environment. • Ensure financial and documentation packages are prepared in accordance with agency requirements and agreements are closed out when no longer necessary. 													
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis: Current and projected weather may result in fire impacting the Highway 36 corridor in the next 24-48 hours. Ensure cooperator contacts and road closure processes are shared and understood. Review roadside response safety procedures found in your IRPG.													
5. General Situational Awareness: Situational awareness is critical for firefighter safety during frontal passages Ensure LCES is in place prior to engaging your resources All firefighters have five communication responsibilities: • Brief others as needed • Debrief your actions • Communicate hazards to others • Acknowledge messages • Ask if you don't know

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: ***Slightly Cooler with Lighter Winds***
Temp: Max. 3,000': 69-74°, 5,000': 64-70°; Min. 3,000': 41-46°, 5,000': 46-51°.
RH: Min. 3,000': 32-37%, 5,000': 24-29%; Max. 3,000': 85-95%, 5,000': 40-50%.
Wind: 3,000' SW 4-8 mph with localized gusts to 12 mph.
 5,000' SW 9-14 mph becoming W 4-6 mph in the afternoon.

FUELS & FUEL MOISTURE:

- Fuels vary greatly based on elevation and aspect but are primarily timber with patches of open grass and areas of brush.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Heavy fuels are supporting fire spread even when weather conditions are not conducive for large fire growth.
- Significant grass load can support rapid rates of spread under favorable weather conditions.

Fine Fuels: 5-8% based on shading; 1000-hr 9%; ERCg Friend Mountain 54 (51st percentile); PIG 60%

GENERAL: The following fire behavior outputs are based on wind and slope alignment.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 21 – Heavy fuel concentrations will result in single and group tree torching. Fire spread will be reduced in the drainage bottoms but still backing down the slopes above. Upper slopes could become more active in afternoon with the drop in RH and afternoon heating.

Branch 31 – Fire will continue to back down Rattlesnake Ridge to the north. Continued activity in SW to NE aligned ridges especially in higher elevations. Areas above East Fork of Smoky Creek will continue to be active in the afternoon. Deeper drainages will have much less fire activity than upper ridges.

North Structure Group – The threat to Post Mountain will be decreased as the winds lessen. Fire location below the 36 road will need to be monitored throughout the day.

Branch 40 - Minimal threats to the line are expected. Interior fuels will continue to burn out especially in areas that have heavy fuel concentrations to support combustion. The Buck fire scare will continue to check fire spread.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0659 Sunset 1902. Lower elevations will have poor visibility through most of the day. At higher elevations there is a chance for better air in the afternoon.

SAFETY: Winds and drier RHs will persist at the upper elevations. Evaluate weather conditions throughout the day. Fire behavior will vary greatly on location and elevation.

- Know **what your fire is doing** at all times, post lookouts and stay in communications

- **Risk Management** is a continuous process. Stay focused on your surroundings and the strategy and tactics of the day.

Situational Awareness

- **Speak up if you see something that looks wrong!!!**
- **Get a good briefing prior to beginning task**
- **Ask if you don't understand!!!!**



Human Factor Watch Outs

Watching out for yourself, coworkers, subordinates and your boss is a primary responsibility for everyone involved in high risk activities. Watch outs are not just for the tactical environment. The Human Factor Watch Outs are designed to create an opportunity for you to take a tactical pause and re-evaluate your situation.

If any of the following occur:

- Your briefing was unclear.
- You don't remember what took place in the last hour.
- You are not getting answers to your questions.
- You are not getting clear acknowledgement of your message.
- You are encountering hazards that are not mentioned in your brief.
- Your team is not debriefing.
- Your tempo is too high to maintain command and control.
- Your leaders intent is vague.
- Your supervisor's expectation is unrealistic.

From the Alaska Safety Team

IMT COVID-19 INTENT for the AUGUST NORTH COMPLEX

All wildland firefighters must take COVID-19 messaging seriously and demonstrate consistent, preventative measures known to be effective in limiting viral spread. The Alaska IMT is reminding firefighters to apply the core values of wildland fire management community of “Duty, Respect, and Integrity” and apply these values to the COVID mitigation requirements:

- **Duty:** To provide a workforce safe from known hazards such as disease transmission, and keep us, our fellow firefighters, and the public safe, on and off the clock.
- **Respect:** To demonstrate respect to oneself and to each other by taking routine precautions as guided, such as wearing a mask and social distancing.
- **Integrity:** To do the right thing when at home, while travelling, or on assignment. Undertake the precautions to keep ourselves and the rest of the workforce healthy and able to respond, then we are not the source of an outbreak within the public we are assigned to protect.

Concept of “Module as One:”

Team members, crews, and other resources should use a “Module as One” approach to insulate as one unit and reduce exposure to the public and other crews. If each member within a unit is monitored, screened, and healthy, then proximity, when necessary, is not an issue.

By insulating as a unit, crews and modules can limit outside viral exposure and may safely complete operational tasks in closer proximity, and ride in vehicles without face coverings when working within their “Module as One” concept:

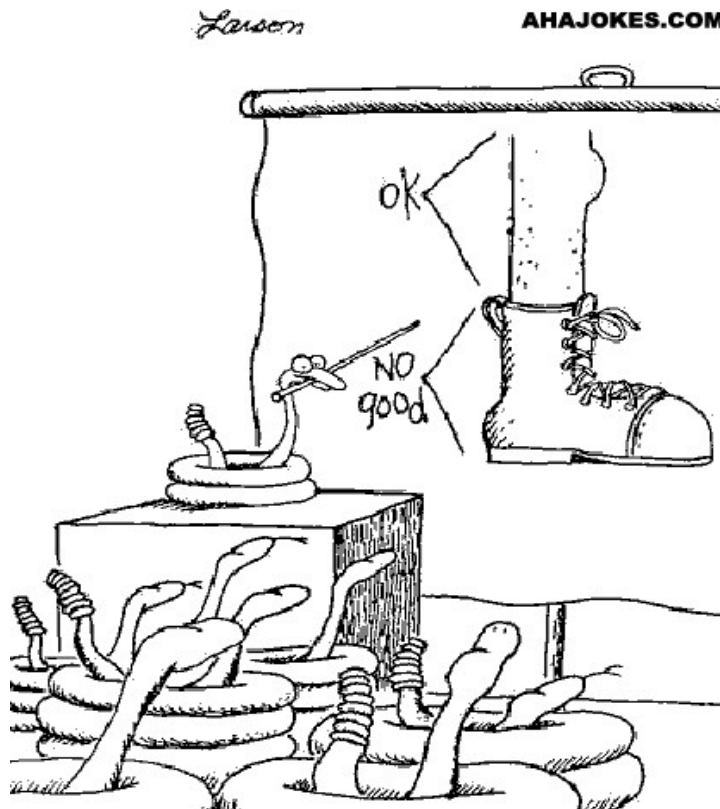
- As often as practical, the same team members should travel in the same vehicle, work together in the same space, and ensure module members are conscientious regrading mitigations.
- Identify select individuals on a crew or module that will interact with the public, ensuring this person relies on social distancing, wears a cloth face covering, and practices hand hygiene during or after every interaction.
- When the “Module as One” has been established, minimize contact with public and outside community. This is to protect every crew member, their family, and the community we serve.

Essential Mitigations:

- **Pre-Screening and Regular Monitoring:** Individuals should measure temperature and assess symptoms each day prior to starting work. Ideally, temperature checks should happen before the individual enters the facility or interacts with others on staff or the crew.
- **Social/Physical Distance:** The employee should maintain 6 feet and practice social distancing as work duties permit in the workplace.
- **Wearing a Mask:** Employees should always wear a facemask or face covering when social distancing cannot be maintained. When facemasks cannot be worn during arduous work tasks, social distancing practices should be implemented.
- **Disinfect and Clean:** Clean and disinfect all areas, particularly “high touch surfaces” such as engine compartments, bathrooms, common areas and shared electronic equipment routinely.
- **Empower** all individuals to ask co-workers to follow social distancing guidelines.

HUMAN RESOURCE MESSAGE

We all know basecamp and fires in general can be stressful. People react to stress in different ways – some joke, some get quiet and some may get grouchy. As we get farther into this extended detail, signs of stress may begin to appear. Try to be sensitive if you notice someone has had a sudden mood swing. Talk if they want to – also that’s what I am here for – contact me with any questions or concerns!
