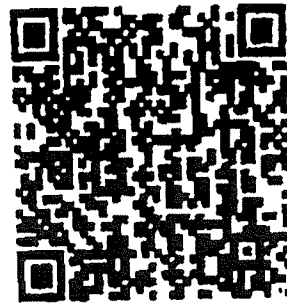

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety by assessing and mitigating risk in order to develop and implement sound tactical operations. Ensure all resources have a clear understanding of assignments and associated hazards. • Protect homes, businesses, communities, utility infrastructure, transportation corridors, county watersheds and timber values from immediate and long-term threats. Contain the fire where it is safe to do so. Have contingency plans for uncontained fire edge. • Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated. • Ensure coordination and communication is taking place between South Zone, West Zone, and Area Command to ensure unified strategic direction, efficient resource use, and common public messaging across all three zones. • Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread. • Treat all personnel with dignity and respect by providing a harassment free, zero-tolerance work environment. • Ensure financial and documentation packages are prepared in accordance with agency requirements and agreements are closed out when no longer necessary. 	
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:	
Continue to promote an increased awareness of the changing weather conditions and potential impacts to specific sections of the incident over the coming shifts. Ensure effort is focused on reenforcing lines and securing perimeter to withstand the predicted winds and fire conditions.	
5. General Situational Awareness:	
Pressure to accomplish the mission creates anxiety and stress which can lead to hasty decision-making. Leaders should provide an environment that reduces mission related pressure, and allow their employees to focus on the task at hand.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: ***Morning Clouds Becoming Partly Sunny***
Temp: Max. 3,000': 74-80°, 5,000': 66-73°; Min. 3,000': 47-52°, 5,000': 53-58°.
RH: Min. 3,000': 26-31%, 5,000': 28-36%; Max. 3,000': 60-71%, 5,000': 28-40%.
Wind: 3,000' Downslope/down valley 3-6 mph becoming NW 4-8 g 13 mph in the afternoon.
 5,000' NW 10-15 mph gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon.

FUELS & FUEL MOISTURE:

- Fuels vary greatly based on elevation and aspect but are primarily timber with patches of open grass and areas of brush.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Heavy fuels are supporting fire spread even when weather conditions are not conducive for large fire growth.
- Significant grass load can support rapid rates of spread under favorable weather conditions.

Fine Fuels: 5-8% based on shading; 1000-hr 10%; ERCg Friend Mountain 54 (51st percentile); PIG 60%

GENERAL: The following fire behavior outputs are based on wind and slope alignment.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 21 – Heavy fuel concentrations will result in single and group tree torching. Fire spread will continue to actively back down the slope. Flanking fire is possible when afternoon wind surfaces. Upper slopes will become active earlier than lower in the drainage.

Branch 31 – Winds will be favorable for continuing firing operations. Fine Dead Fuel Moistures between 5-10% will be the most conducive for firing. Fire will continue to back down Rattlesnake Ridge to the north. Areas around Red Mountain and below the 73 road will continue to be active in the afternoon especially on aligned ridges.

North Structure Group – The threat to Post Mountain will decrease slightly as the winds turn more NW. Fire progression below Highway 36 as well as firing will need to be monitored throughout the day.

Branch 40 - Minimal threats to the line are expected. Interior fuels will continue to burn out especially in areas that have heavy fuel concentrations to support combustion. The Buck fire scar will continue to check fire spread.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0701 Sunset 1858. Lower elevations will have poor visibility in the morning but clearing through the day. At higher elevations there is a chance for better air in the afternoon.

SAFETY: Approaching weather systems can be viewed as a transition period for fire behavior. What you have experienced in the past may not be what you get during today's shift. Current and expected are important adjectives.

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Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones.

Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.

Base all actions on current and expected fire behavior.

**Look Up, Look Down,
Look Around**

- ***Fuel Characteristics** – Assess prior to beginning operations.
- ***Fuel Moisture** – Read daily shift plan and assess on site.
- ***Fuel Temperature** – Varies with exposure to direct sunlight.
- ***Terrain & Fuel Accumulations** – Scout prior to beginning operations and continuously during operations.
- ***Wind** – Measure, observe, feel and notice changes.
- ***Atmospheric Stability** – Observe.
- ***Fire Behavior** – Monitor constantly prior to and during operations.
- ***Safety** – Ask questions in unfamiliar situations. The only dumb question is the one you did not ask.

**Common Denominators of Fire
Behavior On Tragedy Fires**

- *Most incidents happen on the smaller fires or on Isolated portions of larger fires.
- *Most fires are innocent in appearance before the “Flare-ups” or “Blow-ups”. In some cases, tragedies occur in the mop-up stage.
- *Flare-ups generally occur in deceptively light fuels.
- *Fires run uphill surprisingly fast in chimneys, gullies, chutes and on steep slopes.
- *Some suppression tools, such as helicopters or air tankers, can adversely affect fire behavior. The blasts of air from low flying helicopters and air tankers have been known to cause flare-ups.

From the Alaska Safety Team

IMT COVID-19 INTENT for the AUGUST NORTH COMPLEX

All wildland firefighters must take COVID-19 messaging seriously and demonstrate consistent, preventative measures known to be effective in limiting viral spread. The Alaska IMT is reminding firefighters to apply the core values of wildland fire management community of “Duty, Respect, and Integrity” and apply these values to the COVID mitigation requirements:

- **Duty:** To provide a workforce safe from known hazards such as disease transmission, and keep us, our fellow firefighters, and the public safe, on and off the clock.
- **Respect:** To demonstrate respect to oneself and to each other by taking routine precautions as guided, such as wearing a mask and social distancing.
- **Integrity:** To do the right thing when at home, while travelling, or on assignment. Undertake the precautions to keep ourselves and the rest of the workforce healthy and able to respond, then we are not the source of an outbreak within the public we are assigned to protect.

Concept of “Module as One:”

Team members, crews, and other resources should use a “Module as One” approach to insulate as one unit and reduce exposure to the public and other crews. If each member within a unit is monitored, screened, and healthy, then proximity, when necessary, is not an issue.

By insulating as a unit, crews and modules can limit outside viral exposure and may safely complete operational tasks in closer proximity, and ride in vehicles without face coverings when working within their “Module as One” concept:

- As often as practical, the same team members should travel in the same vehicle, work together in the same space, and ensure module members are conscientious regarding mitigations.
- Identify select individuals on a crew or module that will interact with the public, ensuring this person relies on social distancing, wears a cloth face covering, and practices hand hygiene during or after every interaction.
- When the “Module as One” has been established, minimize contact with public and outside community. This is to protect every crew member, their family, and the community we serve.

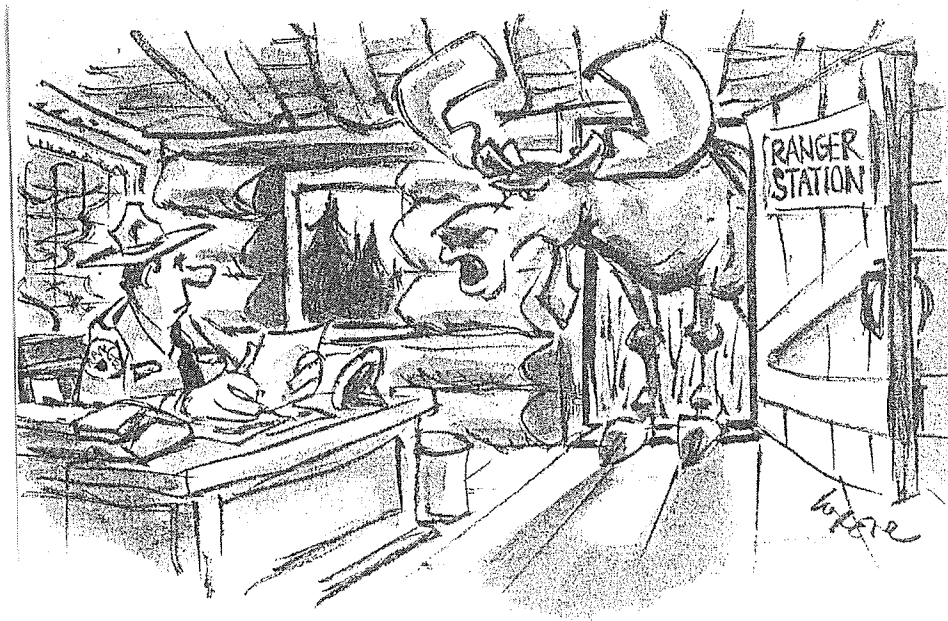
Essential Mitigations:

- **Pre-Screening and Regular Monitoring:** Individuals should measure temperature and assess symptoms each day prior to starting work. Ideally, temperature checks should happen before the individual enters the facility or interacts with others on staff or the crew.
- **Social/Physical Distance:** The employee should maintain 6 feet and practice social distancing as work duties permit in the workplace.
- **Wearing a Mask:** Employees should always wear a facemask or face covering when social distancing cannot be maintained. When facemasks cannot be worn during arduous work tasks, social distancing practices should be implemented.
- **Disinfect and Clean:** Clean and disinfect all areas, particularly “high touch surfaces” such as engine compartments, bathrooms, common areas and shared electronic equipment routinely.
- **Empower** all individuals to ask co-workers to follow social distancing guidelines.
