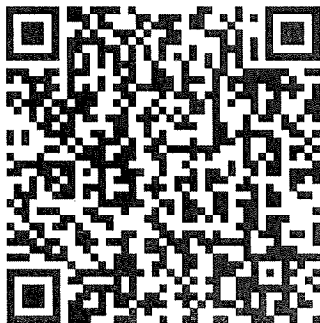

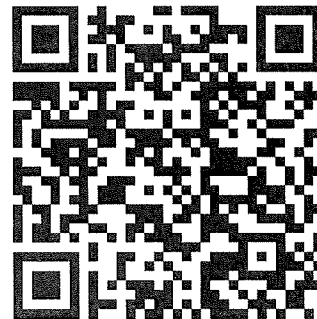

3. Objective(s): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety by assessing and mitigating risk in order to develop and implement sound tactical operations. Ensure all resources have a clear understanding of assignments and associated hazards. • Provide for point protection within the fire area where it is safe to do so. Develop and implement direct and indirect contingency lines to protect communities, utility infrastructure, transportation corridors, county watersheds and timber values from immediate and long-term threats. • Prepare for a well-planned, efficient, and orderly transfer of command by ensuring pertinent organizational information is collected and conveyed to incoming Incident Management Team. • Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated. • Ensure coordination and communication is taking place between South Zone, West Zone, Northwest Zone, and Area Command to provide unified strategic direction, efficient resource use, and common public messaging. • Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread. • Treat all personnel with dignity and respect by providing a harassment free, zero-tolerance work environment. • Ensure financial and documentation packages are prepared in accordance with agency requirements and agreements are closed out when no longer necessary. 													
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis: Working long hours in intense environments for extended periods of time can lead to stress and short tempers. Take time today to ensure your communication methods are clear and tactful. Be situationally aware of who you are communicating with and how you may need to adjust your delivery.													
5. General Situational Awareness Simply paying attention is an important part of maintaining good situational awareness, even more important is determining what to pay attention to. All perceptions are subject to filtering and focusing. People constantly filter information and shift focus. They also produce a lot of internal inputs such as; thoughts about what to do next, stress, memories of similar experiences and fears. Those with more experience in an environment, often can more easily filter out distractions and unimportant details and focus on the most important information.

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Most noticeable change to the weather from the past couple of days will be winds along the midslopes and ridges today. Winds will be from the east and southeast, but at speeds under 10 mph. Nevertheless it is a change from what we have been seeing. However, lower elevation winds will be dictated by terrain with morning downslope/downvalley and afternoon upslope/upvalley. The east to southeast winds will help to bring slightly warmer temperatures to the fire area along with slightly lower relative humidities. Temperatures are running as much as 15 degrees above normal and with poor humidity recoveries early this morning, afternoon relative humidities will lower into the ten percent range. Look for smoke to once again impact the weather. Deeper valleys will see smoke all day along with poor visibilities. Remember, any clearing of the smoke will allow heat and low humidities to interact with the very dry fuels. The eastern portions of the fire area will have the best chance to see some clearing. Monday night will see another night of poor humidity recoveries along the mid slopes and ridges and Tuesday's temperature and humidity values will be very similar to today. Winds aloft will trend more to the south and southwest with smoke once again impacting the fire.

WEATHER: Sunny with areas of dense smoke, especially in the deeper valleys.

MIXING HEIGHT: Rising to 5000 feet by 1400.

TRANSPORT WIND: East at 3 to 5 mph.

VISIBILITY: 2 to 4 miles, localized below 1 mile in the deeper valleys.

WEATHER: Clear with areas of thick smoke resulting in very low visibility.

MIN TEMP: 3000 feet: 48-52° **MAX RH:** 3000 feet: 40-45%

WINDS: 3000 feet: Downvalley/downslope winds 2 to 4 mph.

INVERSION: Strong inversion develops after 2100.



EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Wednesday through Sunday: Wednesday should be the last day of very warm temperatures and low humidities as the pattern begins to change. Cooler temperatures and higher humidities move in Thursday and especially Friday into Saturday as an upper level trough of low pressure approaches. This feature should bring some precipitation to northern California.

Low relative humidities, diurnally varying winds and warm daytime temperatures will prevail through Tuesday. Conditions should start to moderate with slight cooling and higher RH's late on Wednesday.

FUELS & FUEL MOISTURE:

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic Area

- Fuels vary greatly based on elevation and aspect but are primarily timber with heavy loads of grass and areas of thick brush.
- At all elevations, fuels are **critically dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even under an inversion.

Fine Fuels: 3% and 6% shaded; 1000-hr 9%; ERC-G Aug. SIG 67 (Just below 90th percentile); PIG 60-90%

OUTPUTS - FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

With poor RH recovery overnight, lower RH's and increased temperatures, fire behavior for Monday could see a slight increase over that observed on Sunday. Fuels are at critical levels and when smoke clears, resulting in greater solar radiation, the fuels become more available and expect active fire behavior. This is compounded with winds typically involved with the clearing of the smoke, also contributing to increased fire behavior. As seen on Saturday, when slope and fuels are in alignment, major advances in fire movement can occur anywhere on the Northeast Zone of the August Complex. Any spots outside of control lines could be problematic based upon location of spots and resources available to respond.

Fire behavior predictions are for surface fire during the hottest and driest period of the day.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 31 – Smoky conditions will limit fire spread. Higher elevations aligned with winds will have the most potential for spread. Fire north of the Highway 36 will continue to spread based on topography with influences from the Trinity River. On the south side of Highway 36, fire will continue to back down slope. The threat to Trinity Pines/Post Mountain will remain as the fire continues to spread on both sides of Highway 36.

Branch 40 – Smoky conditions will initially limit fire spread, but if clearing occurs, expect increase in fire behavior. Fire in the headwaters of the Beegum Creek will continue to be active with backing and potential for uphill runs, especially if smoke clears. Interior fuels will continue to consume.

Night Operations – Be aware of potential down canyon/down drainage influences on fire behavior. Poor RH recovery will allow fire to burn into the evening. Thick smoke can develop in low lying areas.

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise 0710 Sunset 1843. Smoky conditions will persist in the valley/canyon bottoms, with only ridges on the eastern perimeter potentially clearing out for air operations.

SAFETY: A number of resources are involved with contingency operations and not directly on the fireline – Keep in mind of Watch Out Situation #11 - **Unburned fuels between you and the main fire.**

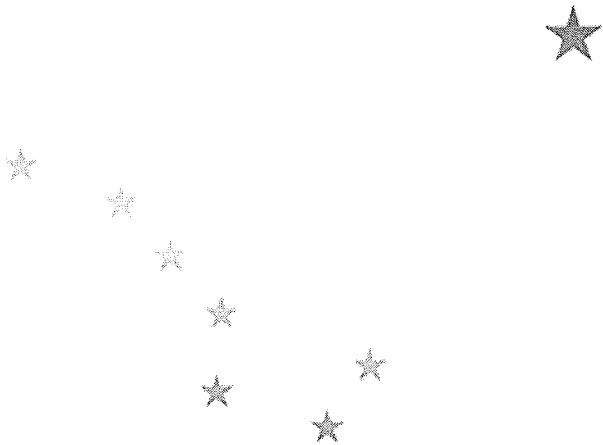

NARRATIVE:

Transfer of Command

Operational Engagement

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. There is a high potential for fatalities, serious injuries, or incidents (some have occurred in the past). Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:

- No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel.
- Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed.
- Communications: face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
- Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.
- Not all Resources know who is in command.

Mitigation actions to take:

- Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
- Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
- Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.
- Transition at the morning briefing.
- Utilize the *Incident Response Pocket Guide*, PMS 461 Briefing Checklist (inside back cover).

From the Alaska Safety Team

IMT COVID-19 INTENT for the AUGUST NORTH COMPLEX

All wildland firefighters must take COVID-19 messaging seriously and demonstrate consistent, preventative measures known to be effective in limiting viral spread. The Alaska IMT is reminding firefighters to apply the core values of wildland fire management community of “Duty, Respect, and Integrity” and apply these values to the COVID mitigation requirements:

- **Duty:** To provide a workforce safe from known hazards such as disease transmission, and keep us, our fellow firefighters, and the public safe, on and off the clock.
- **Respect:** To demonstrate respect to oneself and to each other by taking routine precautions as guided, such as wearing a mask and social distancing.
- **Integrity:** To do the right thing when at home, while travelling, or on assignment. Undertake the precautions to keep ourselves and the rest of the workforce healthy and able to respond, then we are not the source of an outbreak within the public we are assigned to protect.

Concept of “Module as One:”

Team members, crews, and other resources should use a “Module as One” approach to insulate as one unit and reduce exposure to the public and other crews. If each member within a unit is monitored, screened, and healthy, then proximity, when necessary, is not an issue.

By insulating as a unit, crews and modules can limit outside viral exposure and may safely complete operational tasks in closer proximity, and ride in vehicles without face coverings when working within their “**Module as One**” concept:

- As often as practical, the same team members should travel in the same vehicle, work together in the same space, and ensure module members are conscientious regarding mitigations.
- Identify select individuals on a crew or module that will interact with the public, ensuring this person relies on social distancing, wears a cloth face covering, and practices hand hygiene during or after every interaction.
- When the “Module as One” has been established, minimize contact with public and outside community. This is to protect every crew member, their family, and the community we serve.

Essential Mitigations:

- **Pre-Screening and Regular Monitoring:** Individuals should measure temperature and assess symptoms each day prior to starting work. Ideally, temperature checks should happen before the individual enters the facility or interacts with others on staff or the crew.
- **Social/Physical Distance:** The employee should maintain 6 feet and practice social distancing as work duties permit in the workplace.
- **Wearing a Mask:** Employees should always wear a facemask or face covering when social distancing cannot be maintained. When facemasks cannot be worn during arduous work tasks, social distancing practices should be implemented.
- **Disinfect and Clean:** Clean and disinfect all areas, particularly “high touch surfaces” such as engine compartments, bathrooms, common areas and shared electronic equipment routinely.
- **Empower** all individuals to ask co-workers to follow social distancing guidelines.

COVID-19 REPORTING , TRANSPORT AND TESTING

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness.

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

This list does not include all possible symptoms. The CDC will continue to update this list as we learn more about COVID-19.

All personnel should be encouraged to self-monitor for symptoms before they come to work. Fire personnel who have symptoms of COVID-19 should immediately notify their supervisor, safety officer and self-isolate. If symptoms are severe contact medical personnel. Personnel in the symptomatic patient's group or module should be monitored for signs and symptoms. Contact the the COVID Coordinator for testing arrangements.

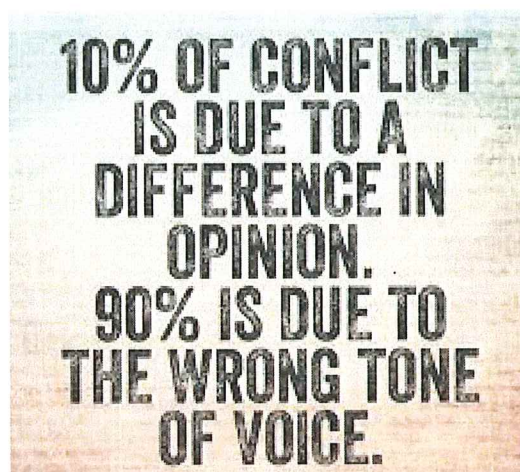


Human Resources Message

- A "New Collection" folder will be created. You can tap the  to rename the folder.

Add New Maps to a Collection Folder

- When you are in the Collection Folder, tap 
- Choose the route to get your map.

Move Existing Maps to the Collection Folder

- From main screen tap EDIT
- Select all the maps you would like added to the new folder.
- Tap move icon .
- Select the new collection folder you created.

**** Unless you delete out old maps, make a new collection folder for each operational period. Do not add the same map extent from different days into the same folder.**



When you access a single map from a collection folder, you will easily be able to pan between map and tap the extent window to switch between all maps in the folder without having to back out of the map view.
