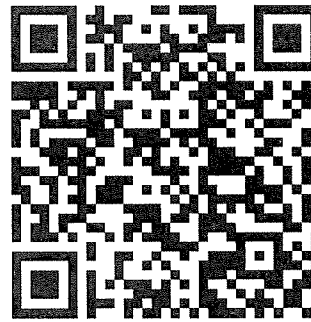

# Fire Weather Forecast

### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

One more day of poor humidity recoveries over the midslopes and ridges will start the operational shift. As smoke thins out over this area in the morning relative humidities will lower into the teens during the afternoon hours once again. Sunshine will warm temperatures to similar levels as Wednesday and will also have an impact on exposed fuels. Some high level clouds may begin to move into the area during the afternoon hours. Winds will generally remain light through the morning, then increase from the south and southwest along the midslopes and ridges in the afternoon. This may help clear out some of the smoke, which could give air operations an opportunity to fly. However, smoke will remain thick in the deeper valleys with visibilities remaining under a mile. Winds along the midslopes and ridges could gust in the 10 to 14 mph range. We will finally transition to a night of slightly better humidity recoveries tonight along with cooler temperatures. This trend will continue into Friday as well.

### TODAY:

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny with areas of dense smoke, especially in the deeper valleys.

**MAX TEMP:** 3000 feet: 76-80°                      **MIN RH:** 3000 feet: 16-20%  
 5000 feet: 73-77°    5000 feet: 15-19%

**CHC WTG RAIN:** 0%                                      **Haines Index:** 5

**WINDS:** 3000 feet: Downvalley/downslope 2 to 4 mph, becoming upslope/upvalley 3 to 6 mph after 1200.  
 (20 FEET) 5000 feet: South-Southwest 3 to 5 mph until 1200, then 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 14 mph.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** Rising to 5000 feet by 1500.  
**TRANSPORT WIND:** South-Southwest at 4 to 8 mph.  
**VISIBILITY:** 2 to 4 miles, but below 1 mile in the deeper valleys.

### TONIGHT:

**WEATHER:** Mostly clear with areas of thick smoke resulting in very low visibility.

**MIN TEMP:** 3000 feet: 41-45°                      **MAX RH:** 3000 feet: 55-60%  
 5000 feet: 48-52°    5000 feet: 40-45%

**CHC WTG RAIN:** 0%                                      **Haines Index:** 4

**WINDS:** 3000 feet: Downvalley/downslope winds 2 to 4 mph.  
 5000 feet: South-Southwest 5 to 9 mph with gusts to 12 mph until 2200, then 3 to 6 mph.

**TRANSPORT WIND:** Southwest 3 to 6 mph.  
**INVERSION:** Inversion develops after 2100.

**EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Friday through Monday:** Friday will begin a more noticeable trend of cooler temperatures and higher humidities. A cold front is expected to move into the region later on Saturday and impact the fire area. Winds will increase from the southwest along the midslopes and ridges and could align with drainages to enhance wind speeds. At this time rainfall is expected late Saturday/Saturday night with amounts in generally a third of an inch or less. Gusty northwest winds are expected on Sunday.

### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** See fire weather forecast for details

Poor overnight humidity recovery on the midslopes and ridges. Afternoon relative humidities will lower into the teens. Gusts along the ridges 10-14 mph. Cooler temperatures and better humidity recoveries tonight.

**Fuels: \*\*Fuels and Fire behavior Advisory in effect for Northern California Geographic area.**

- Fuels vary greatly based on elevation and aspect but are primarily timber with heavy grass loadings and areas of thick brush.
- At all elevations, fuels are **Critically Dry** in all size classes, both live and dead.
- Fuels driven spread is possible when terrain is favorable even under inversion.

Fine fuels: 3%-exposed and 6%-shaded; 1000hr 9%, ERC-G Aug SIG 68 (90<sup>th</sup> percentile); PIG 60-90%

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

### OUTPUTS

**GENERAL:** With current the fuel conditions, low RH's, wind/slope alignment, the opportunity for active fire behavior and large fire growth tends to occur with increased solar radiation from smoke clearing such as was seen on Saturday and previous days of large fire growth. Any spotting outside of control lines could be problematic depending on location of spots and resources available to respond.

**Spotting distance:** Up to .2 miles.

**Probability of Ignition:** 60-90%

**Timber-Shrub:** ROS-8-11 ch/hr, FL-7-8 ft.

**Shrub:** ROS-36-42 ch/hr, FL 12-13 ft.

**Grass:** ROS-36-55 ch/hr, FL 4-5 ft.

### SPECIFIC:

**Branch 31-** Smoky conditions will persist and limit fire spread. Higher elevations aligned with winds will have the most potential for spread if smoke clearing occurs. Fire north of Highway 36 will continue to spread if unchecked based on topography with influences from the Trinity River. On the south side of Highway 36, fire will continue to back down slope. The threat to Trinity Pines/Post Mountain will remain as the fire continues to back down to Highway 36. Fire will continue to back in to Little Bear Wallow creek.

**Branch 40-** Smoky conditions will limit fire spread, unless clearing occurs resulting in increased fire behavior. Fire in the upper areas of the North Fork of Beegum, Middle Fork Beegum, Texas Chow, Dark Canyon creeks, and the East Fork of the South Fork of the Trinity River will continue to be active with backing and increased fire behavior if smoke clears. Interior pockets of fuel will continue to consume.

**Night Operations-** Be aware of potential down canyon/ down drainage influences on fire behavior. RH recoveries should be better than previous shifts and moderate fire behavior in the evening compared to previous shifts. Thick smoke can develop in low lying areas reducing visibility.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

**Sunrise:** 0714    **Sunset:** 1841

Strong inversions especially in deep canyons, expect poor visibility until winds begin to clear smoke from some mid-slope and ridge areas in the afternoon.

### SAFETY

Firefighter safety requires constant monitoring of environmental and fire behavior factors.

The Team is committed to identifying clear Task, Purpose, and End State that achieves the Agency Administrator's direction and objectives in a timely and cost effective manner.

The Team provides every person associated with the incident a safe, productive, and supportive work environment.

The Team operates in a transparent manner, facilitating open communication and dialogue up, down, and across the chain of command, with active listening and opportunity for discussion and collaboration.

Here are a few ways you can help the Team create an atmosphere of **Duty, Respect, and Integrity** as outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG):

**If you Need to Leave the Incident Environment when Off Duty:**

Notify your supervisor of destination and estimated time of return in the event you are needed for duty prior to expected time.

**Alcohol /Illegal Drugs / Fitness for Duty**

Alcohol and illegal drugs are not permitted within the incident environment. Be ready, willing, and able to perform your duties. If you are unable to perform your duties, you may be released from the incident with the home unit or employer being notified of the circumstances.

**Work Environment/Human Relations:**

Conduct yourselves as professionals and maintain a positive, non-hostile work environment with mutual respect. Sexual harassment, discrimination, acts of reprisal or any inappropriate behavior that violates human rights, the provisions of equal employment opportunity (EEO), or ethics and conduct standards will not be tolerated. If you need clarification of these expectations, contact the Human Resource Specialist.

Your actions in the community outside of the incident environment must also conform to these standards while assigned to this incident. Your integrity is shown by obeying the law and following local rules and ordinances. Non-compliance with these expectations could result in your being released from the incident with the home unit or employer being notified of the circumstances.

**Work / Rest Guidelines:**

Any shift times over 16 hours require written justification and approval by the appropriate Section Chief on the Crew Time Report, and will be reviewed by the Incident Commander.

**Performance Evaluations:**

Performance Evaluations will be completed for all trainees and contractors (including ADs). Any unsatisfactory performance will be documented on an evaluation. It is your responsibility to ensure that your supervisor has completed an evaluation.

**Use of Social Media on Wildland Fire Assignments:**

Firefighters and Incident Management Team (IMT) members should be aware that existing agency-specific ethics and conduct regulations and restrictions governing the use of social media by federal employees on fire assignments apply.

Only authorized employees designated by the hosting unit may represent the government on public social media websites. If you choose to post to a social media website you should have a disclaimer that clearly states the views or opinions that you express are yours alone and do not represent the views of your agency or the IMT.

However, anything that you do post regarding wildland firefighting and the agency you work for reflects on that agency, the IMT you are assigned to and all wildland firefighters.

Social media sites are regularly monitored by federal agencies and employees may be held accountable for inappropriate conduct or ethics. When in doubt, don't post!

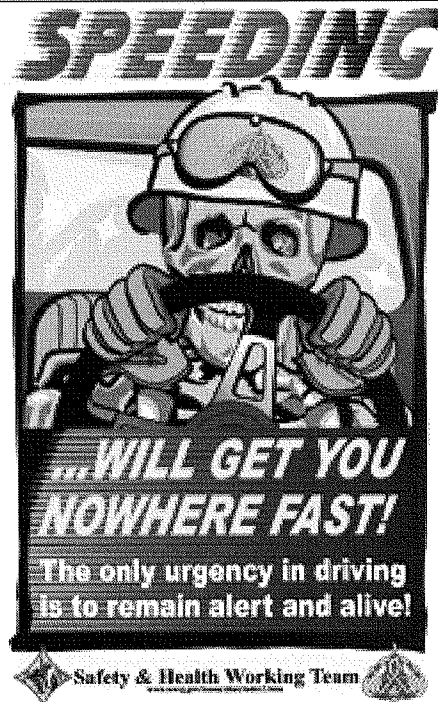

## Uninformed on Strategy, Tactics, or Hazards

*Operational Engagement*

Firefighters who are uninformed on strategy, tactics, or hazards are in conflict with Watchout Situation #5. Before going to the fireline, it is imperative that firefighters obtain information about strategies, tactics, or hazards by asking themselves the following questions:

- Can communications be established to find out strategy, tactics, or hazards? Discuss ways you might establish communications; for example, contacting someone who is already on the fire and asking them what tactics and strategies are working or not working, what hazards they have witnessed, etc.
- Can scouting safely identify potential hazards? Talk about different methods of scouting a fire (e.g., using a lookout from your crew or sending a line scout ahead, utilizing air attack or the spotter on a smokejumper airplane). Discuss what types of hazards you might come across and ways you would mitigate them. For example, arriving at a fire after dark and being instructed to dig line downhill with the fire below. How could you make this a safe situation?
- Have strategies, tactics, or hazards changed since last informed? Discuss situations that might alter the way you are fighting a fire (e.g., wind shifts, resources you expected don't arrive, etc.). Also, think about what new hazards can develop while you are on the fireline (e.g., roots burning out and trees coming down, winds shifting direction and speed, etc.).
- Can you get a briefing from your supervisor? Talk about the importance of constant communications and ensuring firefighters are on the same page with strategies and tactics. For example, if one crew decides to do a burnout, but doesn't let the crew at the other end of the line know what they are doing, then what can happen?
- To reduce the risks:
  - Post lookouts.
  - Determine escape routes and establish safety zones.
  - Consider retreating until you are informed.
  - Don't leave a staging area or operational briefing until you have all the pertinent information. Emphasize ways to inform firefighters about strategies, tactics, and hazards. Tell a story about when you were uninformed and what you did to correct the situation so that you were safe.
  - Use the *Incident Response Pocket Guide*, PMS 461 (back inside cover) Briefing Checklist.

## 2020 COVID-19 Guidance

### LEADERS INTENT:

- Incident responders have a **DUTY** to safeguard each other and the public we serve from hazards. It is through our **RESPECT** for everyone's health and safety that we follow these mitigations, and we rely on everyone's **INTEGRITY** to ensure that we do so and expect the same of others.
- All incident personnel are expected to conduct **self-screening** of their health on a daily basis. Individuals experiencing any of the symptoms should take precautions to self-isolate and immediately report symptoms to your supervisor and to the IMT's Medical Officer or MEDL for assessment.
- All incident personnel will adhere to the **Module of One** concept to the extent practical.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear **cloth face coverings** when six feet of social distancing cannot be maintained with others outside of their Module of One.
- All incident personnel and visitors are required to wear **cloth face coverings** when attending briefings or meetings in common use areas at ICP and camps.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear **cloth face coverings** whenever they enter an enclosed incident facility, such as yurt, tent, building, restroom facility, or other common-use areas regardless of proximity to other people.

### ALL RESOURCES (IMT Members, Single Resource, Operational & Support resources):

- Each resource should arrive at the incident "self-sufficient" for 72 hours, including food, water, sanitizer or wipes, batteries, etc.

### ICP AND CAMPS

- Access into ICP and some base camp facilities may be restricted to essential personnel only, i.e. module supervisors and trainees.
- To promote isolation and social distancing, operational resources will be assigned to camps and spike camps dispersed on the incident.
- Food will be individually packaged and delivered to drop points for distribution. Special dietary needs should be reported to your line supervisor.
- Daily operational briefings will be conducted via radio or virtually. Only supervisors and trainees should attend in-person briefings.

Have individual transported as appropriate.
Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).


