WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Expect subtle changes to the weather today over much of the fire area. We start with better humidity recoveries along the midslopes and ridges than the past few days and thus minimum relative humidities will not be as low as the past few days. Temperatures will be a couple of degrees cooler than yesterday as well. We are still not looking at any strong midslope/ridgetop winds with south-southwest winds across Branch 31 and south-southeast over Branch 40. There will be more sun in the morning, but an increase in high clouds during the afternoon. Smoke will persist over the fire, especially in the deeper valleys, but will likely thin across the midslopes and ridges. If fires get active over the West Zone, that smoke would move up across the fire area. As a result air operations may be impacted once again. Even better humidity recoveries are expected tonight across the area with smoke settling back in over much of the fire area.

TODAY:

Mostly sunny in the morning, then partly cloudy in the afternoon. Areas of dense smoke, especially in the WEATHER:

deeper valleys.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Saturday through Wednesday: A cold front moves across the fire Saturday afternoon/evening. Cooler temperatures, higher humidities, and a tenth of an inch of less of rain is possible. Gusty west to southwest winds are expected along the ridges, then gusty northwest winds along the ridges are forecast for Sunday. Warming and drying trend develops early next week with more noticeable warming/drying for back half of next week.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: See fire weather forecast for details

Overnight humidity recovery was better overnight on the midslopes and ridges and is anticipated to improve during tonight's shift with cooler temperatures.

Fuels: At all elevations, fuels are <u>Critically Dry</u> in all size classes, both live and dead. Fine fuels: 3%-exposed and 6%-shaded; 1000hr 9%, ERC-G Aug SIG 68 (90th percentile); PIG 60-90%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

OUTPUTS

GENERAL: Fire activity is expected moderate to active with the most potential for spread in the higher elevations when wind/slope alignment and any smoke clearing midslope to the ridge tops occurs. With the high probability of ignition spotting could be problematic depending on distance from resources and the availability of aircraft due to smoke impacts. Smoky conditions are forecasted to persist and limit fire spread.

**Rates of spread and flame lengths were calculated with 50% shading. These numbers could be greater than this if smoke clears and solar heating reaches the fuels. **

Spotting distance: Up to .2 miles. Probability of Ignition: 60-90%

Timber-Shrub: Head fire ROS-7-10 ch/hr, FL-7-8 ft. **Shrub:** Head fire ROS-23-38 ch/hr, FL 11-14 ft. **Grass:** Head fire ROS-26-47 ch/hr, FL 4-5 ft.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 31-. Fire will continue to be active in the Little Bear Wallow creek area. With SW winds the drainage will be sheltered until the fire moves beyond the midslope on the northside of Little Bear Wallow Creek where it will be exposed to those winds and could push to the NE causing potential issues along the 14 road. Between mile posts 66 & 68 in the Rattlesnake creek area along Highway 36 there is still scattered heat and potential for the fire threaten Post Mountain if spots where to occur upslope to the north and align with winds.

Branch 40- Fire activity in the upper areas of the North Fork of Beegum, Middle Fork Beegum, Texas Chow, Dark Canyon creeks, and the East Fork of the South Fork of the Trinity River will continue to be active with pockets of fuel cleaning up NW of the Buck fire scar. Any SW winds should be sheltered between DP-137 and DP-123 and activity is expected to be driven by diurnal flows pushing fire spread to north of DP-145 and southeast of DP-123. Fire activity from DP-145 to DP-135 is expected to be minimal.

Night Operations-Fire behavior is expected to be moderate overnight with RH recoveries forecasted to be higher than previous shifts accompanied by lower temperatures Thick smoke can develop in low lying areas reducing visibility. Down slope down canyon winds have the potential to push fire spread down the drainage of Beegum creek even with the presence of smoke inversions.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise: 0715 **Sunset:**1839

Expect poor visibility again today with the weaker flows forecasted to not clear as much smoke out as in previous shifts.

SAFETY

Even with the slight weather change fuels are still critically dry and there is still potential for active fire behavior beneath the smoke inversions.

The Team is committed to identifying clear Task, Purpose, and End State that achieves the Agency Administrator's direction and objectives in a timely and cost effective manner.

The Team provides every person associated with the incident a safe, productive, and supportive work environment.

The Team operates in a transparent manner, facilitating open communication and dialogue up, down, and across the chain of command, with active listening and opportunity for discussion and collaboration.

Here are a few ways you can help the Team create an atmosphere of **Duty**, **Respect**, and **Integrity** as outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG):

If you Need to Leave the Incident Environment when Off Duty:

Notify your supervisor of destination and estimated time of return in the event you are needed for duty prior to expected time.

Alcohol /Illegal Drugs / Fitness for Duty

Alcohol and illegal drugs are not permitted within the incident environment. Be ready, willing, and able to perform your duties. If you are unable to perform your duties, you may be released from the incident with the home unit or employer being notified of the circumstances.

Work Environment/Human Relations:

Conduct yourselves as professionals and maintain a positive, non-hostile work environment with mutual respect. Sexual harassment, discrimination, acts of reprisal or any inappropriate behavior that violates human rights, the provisions of equal employment opportunity (EEO), or ethics and conduct standards will not be tolerated. If you need clarification of these expectations, contact the Human Resource Specialist.

Your actions in the community outside of the incident environment must also conform to these standards while assigned to this incident. Your integrity is shown by obeying the law and following local rules and ordinances. Non-compliance with these expectations could result in your being released from the incident with the home unit or employer being notified of the circumstances.

Work / Rest Guidelines:

Any shift times over 16 hours require written justification and approval by the appropriate Section Chief on the Crew Time Report, and will be reviewed by the Incident Commander.

Performance Evaluations:

Performance Evaluations will be completed for all trainees and contractors (including ADs). Any unsatisfactory performance will be documented on an evaluation. It is your responsibility to ensure that your supervisor has completed an evaluation.

Use of Social Media on Wildland Fire Assignments:

Firefighters and Incident Management Team (IMT) members should be aware that existing agency-specific ethics and conduct regulations and restrictions governing the use of social media by federal employees on fire assignments apply.

Only authorized employees designated by the hosting unit may represent the government on public social media websites. If you choose to post to a social media website you should have a disclaimer that clearly states the views or opinions that you express are yours alone and do not represent the views of your agency or the IMT.

However, anything that you do post regarding wildland firefighting and the agency you work for reflects on that agency, the IMT you are assigned to and all wildland firefighters.

Social media sites are regularly monitored by federal agencies and employees may be held accountable for inappropriate conduct or ethics. When in doubt, don't post!

There are many long days being worked. Some crews are about to time out.

- Make sure you are getting your rest when you can! ...and sticking to work/rest guidelines.

Fatigue can cause us to mentally stray from the driving task.

It only takes a second of distraction to lose control of our vehicle. The faster you are traveling, the faster you get in trouble.

- Make sure you recognize when you are too tired to drive!
- Don't tough it out and put yourself and crew at risk!
- Slow down, take breaks, talk to your passengers.
- Be a Hero ... know your limits and stay out of trouble.

Human Factor Watch Outs

Watching out for yourself, coworkers, subordinates and your boss is a primary responsibility for everyone involved in high risk activities. Watch outs are not just for the tactical environment. The Human Factor Watch Outs are designed to create an opportunity for you to take a tactical pause and re-evaluate your situation.

If any of the following occur:

- Your briefing was unclear.
- You are not getting answers to your questions.
- You are not getting clear acknowledgement of your message.
- You are encountering hazards that are not mentioned in your brief.
- Your team is not debriefing.
- Your tempo is too high to maintain command and control.

Take moment to re-assess your situation.

Firefighter Health & First Aid

The COVID pandemic has caused a lot of ripples in our lives and many of us simply want to return to normal. We may never go back completely to our past business practices, but there are some things we can do to ease the transition.

Relying on the familiar to help us frame our new environment can make change easier – and communicating that change easier too! With all the talk of what we need to do differently with COVID, let's see how it actually compliments what we know and do:

- Lookouts. We know how to establish lookouts: find a good spot, know the lay of the land and the fire environment, pay attention to changes, and communicate.
 - **COVID lookouts**: Learn local factors we may be stepping into What is the current number of cases in the area? Where are the adjoining resources? Where will we be able to operate safely without exposing ourselves to unacceptable risk? Being your own lookout means conducting your daily personal health screening for COVID symptoms and sharing if you might be exposed.
- Communication. This includes having a good system in place and sharing info early to all parties.
 - **COVID Commo:** We must speak up if we see something even to remind people to wear their PPE or not shake hands. It means finding gaps in our systems of virtual information exchange and plugging them BEFORE it impacts our situational awareness on the operational ground. We need to confirm everyone (top-down and bottom-up) is comfortable with the assignment and the environment we are being asked to work in.
- Escape Routes. Having an exit strategy and a timeline to use it, including a backup plan.
 - COVID Escape Routes: Set trigger points for when to back out of a situation and expand your personal space or wear PPE to increase safety from exposure. Set these early before things heat up What mitigations (PPE, physical distancing, etc.) will be used when? How long will these mechanisms be viable (clean PPE, upgrading PPE, etc.)? How can we make sure it's used consistently and we don't get too focused on operations? Don't get complacent time the route, practice the route!
- Safety Zones. Survivable areas that are appropriately sized so we don't need to use additional protection.
 - **COVID Safety Zones:** Buffer areas we create for ourselves using Module as One concepts to limit our environmental exposure. This also includes cleaning and hygiene protocols that ensure the space created with physical distancing remains viable and secure from the virus. It can also mean quarantines (at the start of the season, between assignments, etc.) to create safe areas to work in giving ourselves the time and space to validate we haven't been exposed.
 - COVID Deployment Zones: Deployment zones are the fallback in case safety zones aren't
 available. A fire shelter and/or PPE (gloves and cloth masks) can give us added protection. It
 may even mean isolating ourselves if we become sick so that we don't further impact our friends
 and family.

We don't engage without Lookouts, Communication, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones (LCES) being in place. How about your COVID LCES?

- 1. How will you understand the changing environment so you know what you're getting into?
- 2. Does everyone involved feel good about how you're conducting business with the added COVID hazard?
- 3. Do you have all the information for your assignment and have you been given a solid briefing?
- 4. Set up your COVID escape routes and safety zones. What are your trigger points for today's work?
- 5. What will your team do if LCES becomes compromised? Plan ahead!

Have an idea? Have feedback? Share it.

2020 COVID-19 Guidance

LEADERS INTENT:

- Incident responders have a DUTY to safeguard each other and the public we serve from hazards. It is through our RESPECT for everyone's health and safety that we follow these mitigations, and we rely on everyone's INTEGRITY to ensure that we do so and expect the same of others.
- All incident personnel are expected to conduct self-screening of their health on a daily basis. Individuals experiencing any of the
 symptoms should take precautions to self-isolate and immediately report symptoms to your supervisor and to the IMT's Medical
 Officer or MEDL for assessment.
- All incident personnel will adhere to the Module of One concept to the extent practical.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear cloth face coverings when six feet of social distancing cannot be maintained with others outside of their Module of One.
- All incident personnel and visitors are required to wear cloth face coverings when attending briefings or meetings in common use areas at ICP and camps.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear cloth face coverings whenever they enter an enclosed incident facility, such as yurt, tent, building, restroom facility, or other common-use areas regardless of proximity to other people.

ALL RESOURCES (IMT Members, Single Resource, Operational & Support resources):

• Each resource should arrive at the incident "self-sufficient" for 72 hours, including food, water, sanitizer or wipes, batteries, etc.

ICP AND CAMPS

- Access into ICP and some base camp facilities may be restricted to essential personnel only, i.e. module supervisors and trainees
- To promote isolation and social distancing, operational resources will be assigned to camps and spike camps dispersed on the incident.
- Food will be individually packaged and delivered to drop points for distribution. Special dietary needs should be reported to your line supervisor.
- Daily operational briefings will be conducted via radio or virtually. Only supervisors and trainees should attend in-person briefings.
