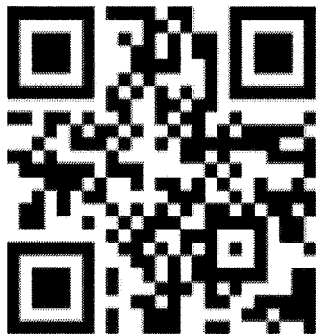

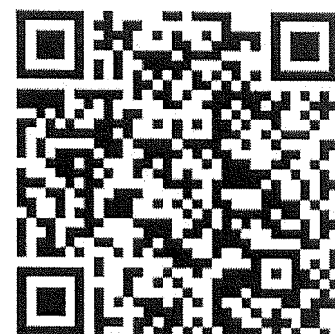

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

The cold front that moved through the area yesterday has shifted off to the east and somewhat drier air will be moving in on northwest winds. Temperatures will be several degrees warmer than yesterday and afternoon minimum relative humidities will approach 30 percent. Winds will mainly be from the northwest and this may help scour some of the smoke out in the deeper valleys. Along the midslopes and ridges expect gusts from the northwest in the 10 to 15 mph range. Good humidity recoveries are expected tonight and winds will be slowly tapering off later tonight. The warming and drying trend will continue into Monday with north to northwest winds along the midslopes and ridges at speeds similar to today.

WEATHER: Partly cloudy.

MAX TEMP: 3000 feet: 64-68°

MIN RH: 3000 feet: 28-32%
5000 feet: 31-55%

TRANSPORT WIND: Northwest at 5 to 9 mph.

VISIBILITY: Smoke possible in the deeper valleys in the morning with reduced visibilities. Good visibility in afternoon as smoke mixes out of the valleys.

INVERSION: Inversion develops after 2300.



EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Monday Through Friday: Expect a warming and drying trend through the week with the most noticeable warming and drying taking place Wednesday through Friday. During this period there will be a return to poor humidity recoveries at night and low relative humidity values during the day. The potential for gusty north to northeast winds will also exist, especially Thursday into Friday.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: See fire weather forecast for details

***Drier air moving in today out of the Northwest .*

Cooler temperatures and higher humidities.

Fuels: At all elevations, fuels are **Critically Dry** in all size classes, both live and dead. Fine fuels: 6%-exposed and 6-9%-shaded; 1000hr 9%, ERC's just below the 90th percentile.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

OUTPUTS

GENERAL: Fire activity is expected to be moderate with recent precipitation and good overnight RH recovery. Surface spread is most likely on exposed slopes with wind alignment. Less cloud cover today, lower RH's, and winds in the mid-teens will dry fuels out quickly today and provide an opportunity of surface spread and some spotting associated with isolated torching in places.

Spotting distance: (.1 to .2) miles.

Probability of Ignition: 30-50%

Timber-Shrub: Head fire ROS-(3-7 ch/hr), FL(5-7 ft)

Shrub: Head fire ROS-(17-34) ch/hr, FL(10-13 ft)

Grass: Head fire ROS-(4-10) ch/hr, FL (1-2 ft)

SPECIFIC:

Branch 31- Moderate potential for surface fire spread in the upper portion of Little Bear Wallow creek area. NW winds should be more favorable to control actions in this branch. In the Rattlesnake creek area along on the FS57 road there is still scattered heat and moderate potential for the fire threaten containment line with NW winds pushing fire behavior back into the fire away from the line.

Branch 40- Fire activity in the upper areas of the North Fork of Beegum, Middle Fork Beegum, Texas Chow, Dark Canyon creeks, and the East Fork of the South Fork of the Trinity River will continue to be active as pockets of fuel clean up. NW winds could continue to push the fire into the Buck fire scar to the southeast. NW winds have the potential to push the fire on the south side the Middle Fork Beegum Creek drainage towards North Star and Round Mountains. Fire activity from DP-145 to DP-135 is expected to be minimal with scattered heat.

Night Operations-Fire behavior is expected to be low-moderate overnight as temperatures stay low and humidities high. There's potential for down slope down canyon winds to push fire spread down the drainage of Beegum creek even with the presence of smoke inversions. Night time diurnal winds should be favorable for both Little Bear Wallow and Rattlesnake Creek areas pulling smoke back down drainage.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise: 0717 **Sunset:** 1836

Expect visibility to be poor in the deeper valleys until the afternoon when winds increase and start to clear some of the smoke out. Visibility should be fair or better across the ridge tops as smoke mixes out sooner than in the valleys.

SAFETY

Don't let the weather change make you think the fire doesn't still have potential. There is still a lot of heat remaining in heavy fuels.

Radio Cloning Procedures:

- At operational briefings, one representative from each module should be cloned by Communications Unit, then subsequently share the radio code plug/program with the module.
- Cloning procedure:
 1. COMT puts on gloves and face covering.
 2. COMT clones radio (COMT is only person that handles cloning cable and cloner).
 3. COMT wipes down customer radio with appropriate disinfecting solution or wipes and returns the radio.
 4. COMT wipes down cloner, cable, and gloves.
 5. Move on to the next radio.
- Module representatives, single resources, and cooperators will maintain social distancing as they line up for service.
- As practical, cloning areas should be set up outdoors in well-ventilated areas with enough space for social distancing.

If you have equipment or an engine that has a secondary rate for mileage, additional operators (i.e., crew) and/or a lowboy (or other transport), please ensure your shift tickets reflect the necessary justification for both the start and stop odometer readings, any additional operator names, and "transport attached" if applicable. Also enter your "current" E# in the upper right corner of the ticket.

If you are a contractor who is purchasing fuel in the field, please make sure and keep a copy of your fuel ticket to turn in to finance during your demob so that the fuel deduction can be made on your final invoice.

CTR Requirements:

Any shift times that exceed 16 hours unless already authorized by the incident, must have a shift justification form attached.

Please ensure you have accurately notated any travel time, hazard pay, or meal breaks with justifications as needed.

Safety is the Team's Number One Priority
Everyone is a safety officer—See It, Say It, and Fix It!

The Team is committed to identifying clear Task, Purpose, and End State that achieves the Agency Administrator's direction and objectives in a timely and cost effective manner.

The Team provides every person associated with the incident a safe, productive, and supportive work environment.

The Team operates in a transparent manner, facilitating open communication and dialogue up, down, and across the chain of command, with active listening and opportunity for discussion and collaboration.

Here are a few ways you can help the Team create an atmosphere of **Duty, Respect, and Integrity** as outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG):

If you Need to Leave the Incident Environment when Off Duty:

Notify your supervisor of destination and estimated time of return in the event you are needed for duty prior to expected time.

Alcohol /Illegal Drugs / Fitness for Duty

Alcohol and illegal drugs are not permitted within the incident environment. Be ready, willing, and able to perform your duties. If you are unable to perform your duties, you may be released from the incident with the home unit or employer being notified of the circumstances.

Work Environment/Human Relations:

Conduct yourselves as professionals and maintain a positive, non-hostile work environment with mutual respect. Sexual harassment, discrimination, acts of reprisal or any inappropriate behavior that violates human rights, the provisions of equal employment opportunity (EEO), or ethics and conduct standards will not be tolerated. If you need clarification of these expectations, contact the Human Resource Specialist.

Your actions in the community outside of the incident environment must also conform to these standards while assigned to this incident. Your integrity is shown by obeying the law and following local rules and ordinances. Non-compliance with these expectations could result in your being released from the incident with the home unit or employer being notified of the circumstances.

Work / Rest Guidelines:

Any shift times over 16 hours require written justification and approval by the appropriate Section Chief on the Crew Time Report, and will be reviewed by the Incident Commander.

Performance Evaluations:

Performance Evaluations will be completed for all trainees and contractors (including ADs). Any unsatisfactory performance will be documented on an evaluation. It is your responsibility to ensure that your supervisor has completed an evaluation.

Use of Social Media on Wildland Fire Assignments:

Firefighters and Incident Management Team (IMT) members should be aware that existing agency-specific ethics and conduct regulations and restrictions governing the use of social media by federal employees on fire assignments apply.

Only authorized employees designated by the hosting unit may represent the government on public social media websites. If you choose to post to a social media website you should have a disclaimer that clearly states the views or opinions that you express are yours alone and do not represent the views of your agency or the IMT.

However, anything that you do post regarding wildland firefighting and the agency you work for reflects on that agency, the IMT you are assigned to and all wildland firefighters.

Social media sites are regularly monitored by federal agencies and employees may be held accountable for inappropriate conduct or ethics. When in doubt, don't post!

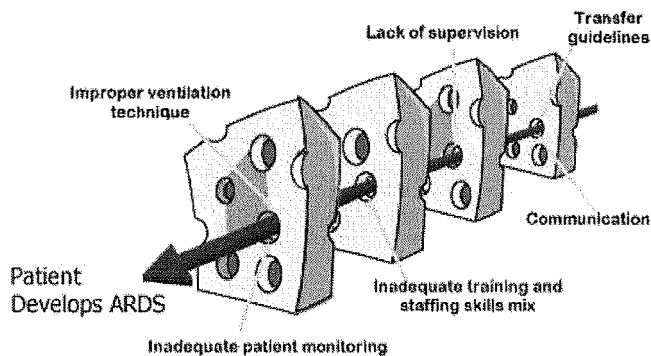

Hazard Tree - Risk Management

Felling Safety Category

Consider the **severity, probability, and exposure** of **hazard tree** problems continually as you perform duties in forested communities. Remember to look for hazard tree risks at staging areas, parking areas and camping areas.

● Environmental Element:

- Existing winds and forecast.
- Night operations or low visibility situations limiting your view of surroundings.
- Steep slopes.
- Diseased or bug-kill areas with high densities of dead or dying trees.
- Number, density, and height of hazard trees.
- Amount of time the area has been burning – burn down time.
- Potential for domino effect to surrounding trees.

● Hazard Tree Indicators:

- Trees burning for any period of time.
- High risk tree species (rot and shallow roots).
- Numerous downed trees in the area.
- Dead, broken, or burning tops and limbs overhead.
- Accumulation of downed limbs.
- Fungus or growth of decay species on the tree.
- Cavities or evidence of woodpecker damage.
- Forked tops, multiple tops, and/or uneven branch distribution.
- Absence of needles, bark or limbs.
- Leaning or hung-up.

● Hazard Control:

- Eliminate the hazards with qualified sawyers, blasters/explosives, or heavy equipment.
- Avoid hazards by designating “No Work Zones” (NWZ) – (flag, sign, and map).
- Modify suppression tactics or fireline location to avoid extreme/high risk rated area.
- Post lookouts to help maintain a secure area.
- Fire proof potential hazard trees to prevent ignition.
- Initiate road/traffic control and area closure.
- Keep clear of bucket drops near trees/snags.
- Establish trigger points for reposition to secure areas in response to high winds.
- Minimize exposure time in hazard tree areas using efficient felling techniques and limiting numbers of personnel in hazardous areas.

2020 COVID-19 Guidance

LEADERS INTENT:

- Incident responders have a **DUTY** to safeguard each other and the public we serve from hazards. It is through our **RESPECT** for everyone's health and safety that we follow these mitigations, and we rely on everyone's **INTEGRITY** to ensure that we do so and expect the same of others.
- All incident personnel are expected to conduct **self-screening** of their health on a daily basis. Individuals experiencing any of the symptoms should take precautions to self-isolate and immediately report symptoms to your supervisor and to the IMT's Medical Officer or MEDL for assessment.
- All incident personnel will adhere to the **Module of One** concept to the extent practical.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear **cloth face coverings** when six feet of social distancing cannot be maintained with others outside of their Module of One.
- All incident personnel and visitors are required to wear **cloth face coverings** when attending briefings or meetings in common use areas at ICP and camps.
- All incident personnel and visitors will wear **cloth face coverings** whenever they enter an enclosed incident facility, such as a yurt, tent, building, restroom facility, or other common-use areas regardless of proximity to other people.

ALL RESOURCES (IMT Members, Single Resource, Operational & Support resources):

- Each resource should arrive at the incident "self-sufficient" for 72 hours, including food, water, sanitizer or wipes, batteries, etc.

ICP AND CAMPS

- Access into ICP and some base camp facilities may be restricted to essential personnel only, i.e. module supervisors and trainees.
- To promote isolation and social distancing, operational resources will be assigned to camps and spike camps dispersed on the incident.
- Food will be individually packaged and delivered to drop points for distribution. Special dietary needs should be reported to your line supervisor.
- Daily operational briefings will be conducted via radio or virtually. Only supervisors and trainees should attend in-person briefings.

Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).
