

... Very dry with well above normal daytime temperatures...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Very dry and unseasonably warm conditions will continue with afternoon temperatures 10-15 degrees above normal for this time of year. Afternoon humidity will fall into the single digits again in some areas with poor overnight recovery over higher elevations. Winds will remain fairly light with a small uptick over the higher elevations.

WEATHER FORECAST for FRIDAY:

WEATHER: Sunny. Very dry.

TEMPERATURES: 77-84 below 3000 feet: 67-77 above 3000 feet

HUMIDITY: 7-14%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West northwest 4-8 mph with gusts around 12 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope/upvalley 3-9 mph

WEATHER FORECAST for FRIDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Clear. Continued poor humidity recovery over ridges/upper slopes.

TEMPERATURES: 35-45 below 3000 feet; 45-53 above 3000 feet

HUMIDITY: 15-25% ridges and upper slopes; 41-51% valleys and lower slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Northwest 5-10 mph with gusts around 15 mph in the evening decreasing to

4-8 mph after midnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downvalley 2-8 mph.

OUTLOOK for Saturday and Sunday: A very dry air mass will remain over the fire area through the weekend. Poor humidity recovery over the higher elevations will be followed by very low afternoon RH. Well above normal temperatures and light terrain driven winds will continue.

WEATHER: Little change from yesterday, Sunny, very dry,

MAX TEMP: 67-84° MIN RH: 7-14%

20 FOOT WINDS: Ridges: Variable 4-8 mph w/ gusts around 12 mph;

Slope/Valley: Upslope/upvalley 3-9 mph

Chance of Wetting Rain: 0%

FUELS: The fire is burning in mixed fuels, i.e. grasses, duff, brush, and conifer at the lower elevations with mixed conifer in the upper elevations. Fuels remain extraordinarily dry for this dime of year.

Ignition Receptiveness: Probability of Ignition @ peak of the burn period: Below 3000': 86-88% unshaded/80-82%

shaded, Above 3000': 83-86% unshaded/77-80% shaded

<u>Dryness:</u> Dead and down fuel moistures :1-hour 3%, 10-hour 3-4%, 100-hour 4-8%, and 1000-hour <10%.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

No perimeter growth is expected. Dry conditions will continue to encourage emergent hot spots in dozer berms, logs, standing snags, and a even a thin layer of litter from scorched needles that have been recently blown off the standing trees. This smoldering fire behavior will continue in the Hell Hole Canyon area (Division S). The fuels outside of the fire perimeter will remain dry and highly receptive to fire. Any escaped fire would likely only exhibit short-range spotting. Probability of ignition will continue to decline with a gradual increase in fine fuel moisture later in the week, as onshore flow returns.

SPECIFIC: Division S: Smoldering within the perimeter in stumps, logs, and in aerial fuels (candles). Watch for newly available fuel from needlecast and freezing temperatures. Any fire moving into new fuels will exhibit active fire behavior w/ short-range (< ½ mile) spotting.

All Other Divisions: Interior smoldering.

Vehicles & Roads Category

Dozers/tractor plows provide suppression and support capability for fire operations. When working on or around dozers on the fireline, it is important to respect the following guidelines:

- Load/unload equipment from the transport in a safe manner on a level, stable surface.
- Park transport in an area free of fuel. Clear an area if needed to protect parked equipment.
- Do not sit or bed down near equipment. Walk around the equipment before starting or moving it.
- Lower the dozer blade and/or fire plow to the ground when the equipment is idling or stopped.
- When working a dozer or tractor plow, stay at least 100 feet in front or 50 feet behind the equipment.
- Allow no one but the operator to ride on the equipment.
- Never get on or off equipment while it is moving.
- Provide front and rear lights for equipment working at night or in heavy smoke.
- Provide lights and fluorescent vests to personnel working with dozer/tractor plow units.
- Use hand signals for direction and safety.
- Do not use a dozer or tractor plow without a canopy or brush guard and radio communications.
- Operators will wear required PPE and carry a fire shelter.
- Be aware of different fuel types, rates of spread, and flammability.
- Watch for wetlands, steep slopes, rocks, ditches, and other obstacles that might stop the equipment.
- Do not get too far ahead of a firing crew during firing operations.
- Anchor the line to a secure firebreak and create a black line (burn out) until the fire is completely enclosed.
- Tractor plow operators should wear headgear protection for head, face, eyes, and ears while also providing radio reception and ventilation capabilities.
- Tractor plow crews should consist of a minimum of two people.
- When the dozer or tractor plow is equipped with a hand-clutch lever, always take equipment out of gear when mounting and dismounting.

To order crews, overhead, equipment, supplies and S# requests

Please email your requests to <u>2020.augustcomplex.ordering.south@firenet.gov</u> using an electronic fillable ICS-213 based on Word document so the ordering manager can add an identifying number and make edits as necessary.

If you don't have a Word based ICS-213 email the above email and I can email a form to you. They are also available online from NWCG, FEMA and other sources.

Any issues just ask, I will work with you.

Some helpful tips to speed up the ordering process

Like orders can be combined on a single 213, but Overhead, Equipment, Crew and Supply orders need to be on separate 213s. These go to different people at dispatch when ordered.

At this time North Ops is requiring a minimum of 72 hours for date and time needed on resource requests. Providing a longer period of time increases the chances of getting a fill on your order. You may say will take sooner to ensure a resource does not wait until the date and time listed.

Local resources dispatched by CA-MNF can have shorter report times since they are handled at the forest level. Supply orders should allow at least 24 hours for delivery.

Name Requests

Name requests require a clear and defensible justification. Most California state and local government employees require an additional name request form.

Check the spelling of the name, and how they are listed in IROC (first and last only, middle initial, middle name, full name or shortened name (Dave or David) etc.

Ensure they are qualified for the position they are being requested to fill, that they are available and have checked with their supervisor before placing an order. Including the home dispatch and a contact phone number for the individual can speed up ordering.

Other considerations

Overhead - Approval for rental vehicle, laptop, cell phone, special equipment?

Equipment – 12 or 24 hour operational period? Will the transport stay with heavy equipment?

Supplies – Many requests for brand name items are no longer being accepted by the buying team, but you may suggest "like" Pilot G2 pen.



Appendix A: Effective Waterbars


When locating and building water bars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fireline, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable, and that soil does **not block** the water bar outlet. Waterbars should be dug as dips, not constructed from fill.


Recommended spacing for waterbars on firelines.

Waterbars constructed by hand on hand line should be at least two Pulaski widths (4-6 inches) wide and 6-12 inches high.

Waterbars constructed by heavy equipment on dozer lines should be at least 12 inches wide and 12-18 inches high.
