OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Throughout most of the South Zone area little to no fire behavior is expected. Smoldering fire behavior will continue in the Hell Hole Canyon area (Division S). The fuels outside of the fire perimeter will remain dry and receptive to fire. If fire is established outside of the perimeter in receptive fuels expect to see very active fire behavior, including group torching, short crown runs and long-range spotting in excess of a mile.

SPECIFIC:

Division S: Smoldering within the perimeter in the stumps and logs. Winds will increase through the saddle above Hellhole Canyon. Any fire moving into new fuels will exhibit very active fire behavior.

All Other Divisions: Interior smoldering increasing with winds throughout the day.

AIR OPERATIONS: No visibility issues, though high winds may restrict some aircraft.

SAFETY

Keep an eye out for pockets of heat in dozer berms, and watch for overhead hazards, especially fireweakened snags as the winds increase.

- Communicate with READs for priority repair assignments.
- Consult READs on the repair standards.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS:

- Utilize Risk Assessment Tool before tactical engagement.
- Do not deviate from planned travel route to and from worksite. Remain in spike camp after 2100. Disengage all resource in localized threat areas. Complete logistical duties, such as fueling, in the morning outside of spike camp.

Follow CDC guidance and established local, state and national guidance to ensure a healthy work environment. Adhere to the "module of one" concept to reduce physical exposure and transmission of COVID 19. Resources with symptoms notify COVID coordinator at 530-551-1729.

- Contact DIVS for initiating resource extension or crew swaps.
- Resources returning from R&R or swapping crew members MUST CALL CHECK-IN prior to shift.
- Communicate radio dead spots to DIVS.
- Ensure communication with divisions on adjacent Zones.

Safety Thought

Fatigued workers perform poorly, behave carelessly, tolerate greater errors and become inattentive. Driving is a hazard on this incident.

Fatigue—A sense of tiredness, either mental or physical, brought on by stress (lack of sleep, physical work, nutritional inadequacies, or mental stresses). Fatigue following work or sleep deprivation is a normal state and can be reversed with adequate recovery or rest.

Accumulated (Chronic) Fatigue—Fatigue from which normal rest does not produce recovery. Accumulated fatigue is often caused by extended periods of stress with inadequate recovery periods.

Behavioral Indicators of Accumulative Fatigue

- ► Decreased motivation and low morale
- ► Increased irritability and changes in mood
- ► Decreased ability to problem solve
- ► Poor concentration and reaction time
- ► Decreased attention and memory

Common Stressors that Cause Accumulative Fatigue

- ➤ Smoke
- Nutrition and dehydration
- ▶ Physical exertion
- ▶ Stress work/life
- ► Sleep deprivation

Recommendations for Accumulative Fatigue

- ► Take longer periods of rest/recovery
- ► Slow the work pace to a moderate level on physically demanding tasks
- ▶ Provide periodic rest breaks to allow physical and mental recovery
- ► Change assignments to prevent boredom
- ► Eat well-balanced meals regularly, with energy supplements during periods of high exertion.
- ► Ensure workers maintain good personal hygiene
- ► Seek medical attention when in doubt of symptoms

Driving

Speeding- Speeding means less time to react to road conditions and other vehicles. On this incident, going 25 mph may be speeding. Narrow, steep and rough roads can be very unforgiving. Steep drop offs mean potentially severe consequences.

Inattentive Drivers- Many things can distract drivers such as fatigue, eating, drinking, reading directions, maps, and cell phones. Avoid these distractions yourself and drive defensively. Practice situational awareness; be aware of what is happening in front, behind, and on both sides of your vehicle.

Driving conditions- In the early morning and late evening you may have the sun distracting your vision. It may also be happening to the driver in front of you. Remember to use caution when this happens. Keep your spacing on dusty roads. Drive with clean windshields.

Narrow Roads- The roads on and off the fire are steep, winding and extremely narrow. Slow down, expect a vehicle around every corner. Know where the nearest pull off is behind you in case you have to back up on unpaved roads
