

18 Watch Out Situations

The Incident Command System (ICS) relies on interagency communications between firefighting resources for collaborative fire suppression. This Standard Firefighting Order shows a variety of firefighting resources working together to effectively suppress a wildland fire.

Known radio frequencies and channels enable instant communication within and between firefighting resources. This Watch Out shows a crew physically separated without any obvious method for communication among crew members or their supervisor.

... Very dry with well above normal daytime temperatures ...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure remains over the west coast providing unseasonably warm and very dry conditions across the fire area. Afternoon temperatures will top out near 15 degrees above normal again. Minimum relative humidity will fall into the lower teens with some upper single digits followed by poor overnight recovery in the higher elevations. Light terrain driven winds will prevail.

WEATHER FORECAST for MONDAY:

WEATHER: Sunny. Very dry.

TEMPERATURES: 77-85 below 3000 feet; 69-77 above 3000 feet

HUMIDITY: 9-15%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 4-8 mph with afternoon gusts around 12 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope/upvalley 3-9 mph

WEATHER FORECAST for MONDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Clear. Continued poor humidity recovery over ridges/upper slopes.

TEMPERATURES: 32-42 below 3000 feet: 45-55 above 3000 feet

HUMIDITY: 20-30% ridges and upper slopes; 40-60% valleys and lower slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West southwest 4-8 mph with gusts around 12 mph in the early evening decreasing

to easterly 3-7 mph after midnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downvalley 2-8 mph.

OUTLOOK for Tuesday and Wednesday: Some high clouds are possible on Tuesday but conditions will still be warm and very dry. A push of low level marine air is expected to bring some higher humidity Tuesday night and Wednesday. Terrain driven winds will continue to prevail with a slight nudge upwards in westerly ridge winds. A significant pattern change is expected by Friday with much cooler weather.

WEATHER: Little change from yesterday. Sunny, very dry.

MAX TEMP: 69-85° MIN RH: 9-15%

20 FOOT WINDS: Ridges: Southwest 4-8 mph w/ gusts around 12 mph;

Slope/Valley: Upslope/upvalley 3-9 mph

Chance of Wetting Rain: 0%

FUELS: The fire is burning in mixed fuels, i.e. grasses, duff, brush, and conifer at the lower elevations with mixed conifer in the upper elevations. Fuels remain extraordinarily dry for this dime of year.

Ignition Receptiveness: Probability of Ignition @ peak of the burn period: Below 3000': 65-88% unshaded/60-82% shaded, Above 3000': 63-86% unshaded/58-80% shaded

<u>Dryness:</u> Dead and down fuel moistures: 1-hour 3-7%, 10-hour 5%, 100-hour 5-8%, and 1000-hour <10%.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

No perimeter growth is expected. Dry conditions will continue to encourage emergent hot spots in dozer berms, logs, standing snags, and a even a thin layer of litter from scorched needles that have been recently blown off the standing trees. This smoldering fire behavior will continue in the Hell Hole Canyon area (Division S). The fuels outside of the fire perimeter will remain dry and highly receptive to fire. Any escaped fire would likely only exhibit short-range spotting. Fine fuel moisture continues to rise with the increased shading from shortening day length.

SPECIFIC: Division S: Smoldering within the perimeter in stumps, logs, and in aerial fuels (candles). Watch for newly available fuel from needlecast. Any fire moving into new fuels will exhibit active fire behavior w/ short-range (< ½ mile) spotting. Active fire behavior only during the 2-3 hours at the peak of the burn period. Only creeping with low flame lengths in the morning and evening hours.

All Other Divisions: Interior smoldering.

- · Hold fire within the current footprint.
- · Back-haul all excess equipment and supplies.
- · Communicate with READs for priority repair standards and assignments.

7. Special Instructions:

- Utilize Risk Assessment Tool before tactical engagement.
- · Do not deviate from planned travel route to and from worksite.
- · Disengage all resource in localized threat areas.
- · Complete logistical duties, such as fueling, in the morning outside of spike camp.
- · Follow CDC guidance and established local, state and national guidance to ensure a healthy work environment.
- · Adhere to the "module of one" concept to reduce physical exposure and transmission of COVID 19.
- · Resource Advisors are operating in multiple divisions, check in & out with DIVS.
- · Resources returning from R&R or swapping crew members MUST CALL CHECK-IN prior to shift.
- · Communicate radio dead spots to DIVS.
- · Ensure communication with divisions on adjacent Zones.





Appendix A: Effective Waterbars


When locating and building water bars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fireline, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable, and that soil does not block the water bar outlet. Waterbars should be dug as dips, not constructed from fill.


Recommended spacing for waterbars on firelines.

Fireline slope %		Maximum Distance Apart (feet)
1-5		200
6 - 20	***************************************	125
21 - 40		60
41 - 60	***************************************	40
>60		25

Waterbars constructed by hand on hand line should be at least two Pulaski widths (4-6 inches) wide and 6-12 inches high.

Waterbars constructed by heavy equipment on dozer lines should be at least 12 inches wide and 12-18 inches high.





Water bar construction

- a. Space water bars based on gradient, following the chart above.
- b. Build water bars at a 30-45° relative to perpendicular to the fireline.
- c. The outlet of the water bar must be cleared and open to ensure proper drainage and prevent ponding or pooling of water. The outlet must extend beyond the edge of the fireline.
- d. Water bars should be located so they drain onto vegetative cover, slash, rocks, duff, or other less erodible material. Water bars should not drain directly into drainages or unstable areas.
- e. Excavate water bars as dips into firm soil instead of building as dikes from fill material.
- f. Wherever possible, water bars should drain onto the unburned side of the line. On ridges, alternate direction of water bars (herringbone pattern) to prevent concentrating water on one side of the fireline.


