...Higher humidity today but still well above normal daytime temperatures...

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Higher humidity will prevail today but afternoon temperatures will continue to be well above normal. Winds will remain terrain influenced across lower elevations with breezy conditions over the ridge tops.

WEATHER FORECAST for WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny. Not as dry.

TEMPERATURES: 76-84 below 3000 feet; 65-74 above 3000 feet

HUMIDITY: 23-33%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West northwest 7-12 mph with gusts around 18 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope/upvalley 3-9 mph

WEATHER FORECAST for WEDNESDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy.

TEMPERATURES: 35-45 below 3000 feet; 45-55 above 3000 feet.

HUMIDITY: 45-65% ridges and upper slopes; 70-90% valleys and lower slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West northwest 5-10 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downvalley 2-8 mph in the evening becoming northwest 3-7 mph after midnight.

OUTLOOK for Thursday into the Weekend: Conditions will remain unseasonably warm and relatively dry on Thursday with breezy conditions through the afternoon. A potent low pressure system will move inland Thursday night through Friday bringing much colder conditions along with increased winds and humidity. There is a slight chance of light showers by late Thursday night with a better chance on Friday morning then tapering off through the day. Any rainfall amounts should be generally light with a few hundredths to two tenths of an inch. The potential for accumulating snowfall looks small with snow levels starting out around 6000 feet Thursday night then lowering to near 4000 feet by Friday morning. It is possible to see up to one inch of snow but generally only a dusting is expected. Temperatures will plunge around 25 degrees colder on Friday, dropping to several degrees below normal. It will remain chilly, breezy, and unsettled through the weekend with some small chances for light precipitation. Overnight lows will drop further as well with subfreezing temperatures into the lower elevations.

GENERAL SAFETY CONCERNS

- Driving- Narrow roads: Slow down, watch for wildlife and civilans.
- Fire Behavior- As the weather is drying out, more hot spots will start showing themselves
- ❖ Danger Trees- Most trees are dangerous, old, large, dead, leaning, green, and/or diseased.
- Dehydration- Even though tempatures are moderate the humidity is very low. Stay healthy, stay hydrated.
- . Footing- Lots of steep and unstable terrain.

Fire Order of the Day – Remain in Communication With Crew Members

- o **DRIVING-** If it's Pedictable it's preventable. Speeding=Accident. Slow down and keep an eye out for wildlife and civilians.
- o **RISK MANAGEMENT-** Maintain LCES, SA. Monitor conditions closely. Briefings are critical. Increase briefings of out of area resources. Is it safe to engage? Anticipate the effects of drought, steep terrain, winds, and fuels.
- o **DANGER TREES-** Use the IRPG, page 22. Perform assessments, minimize exposure, is the work necessary. The risks increase during periods of winds.
- o **DEHYDRATION** It can take its toll. So drink lots of **WATER**. Strive to drink 2 quarts per hour during heavy exertion. Avoid energy drinks, dilute sports drinks. Monitor others if they stumble. Being thirsty is being dehydrated! Anticipate your needs, and order more water early during the shift.


