<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Yesterday's rain and snow above 4000 feet will create some icy road conditions this morning. Otherwise, morning clouds should give way to mostly sun in the afternoon. Temperatures will remain several degrees below normal for this time of year. Brisk ridge winds are likely with lighter breezes in the lower elevations. A weak system will drop down tonight bringing a slight chance of a few light showers.

WEATHER FORECAST for SATURDAY:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Icy roads in the morning.

TEMPERATURES: 51-59 below 3000 feet; 41-49 above 3000 feet

HUMIDITY: 40-50%

SLOPE/VALLEY - Northwest 5-10 mph with gusts up to 15 mph.

RIDGETOP - North northwest 6-12 mph with gusts to around 20 mph.

<u>OUTLOOK for Sunday through Tuesday:</u> Conditions will remain cool with some higher ridge winds creating some blustery conditions on Sunday. A mix of sun and clouds is expected each day with overnight temperatures dropping to well below freezing Sunday night. Most mountain valleys will dip into the lower 20s with the potential for some upper teens by Monday morning. Another weak system may bring a few light showers Tuesday night but chances are small at this time.

- 22 Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 (c) and 29 CFR 785.19 (a)).
- 23 Time for a meal period is not compensable if the employee is not required to perform substantial duties
- 24 (86 Forest Practices Board Regulations 1026). When an employee's time and attention is primarily
- 25 occupied by a private pursuit such as eating a meal, then the employee is completely relieved from duty
- and is not entitled to compensation under the FLSA (102 Labor Employee Press 39580).
- 27 Personnel on the fireline may be compensated for their meal period if all of the following conditions are

- 37 Compensable meal breaks include time spent eating while traveling in a plane, bus, or other vehicle.
- 38 For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of the fire, a meal period of at
- 39 least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift e.g., a minimum 30 minute break for

- 31 aircraft, then hazard pay is warranted. Hazard pay is not authorized for situations such as flying
- 32 passengers from a work center to a location to fix equipment when there are no adverse conditions that
- 33 threaten or severely limit the aircraft.
 - <u>Groundwork Beneath Hovering Helicopter</u> Participating in ground operations to attach an
 external load to a helicopter hovering just overhead.

Appendix A: Effective Waterbars


When locating and building water bars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fireline, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable, and that soil does not block the water bar outlet. Waterbars should be dug as dips, not constructed from fill.


Recommended spacing for waterbars on firelines.

Fireline slope %	~	Maximum Distance Apart <u>(feet)</u>
1-5		200
6 – 20		125
21 - 40		60
41 - 60		40

Waterbars constructed by hand on hand line should be at least two Pulaski widths (4-6 inches) wide and 6-12 inches high.

Waterbars constructed by heavy equipment on dozer lines should be at least 12 inches wide and 12-18 inches high.





Water bar construction

- a. Space water bars based on gradient, following the chart above.
- b. Build water bars at a 30-45° relative to perpendicular to the fireline.
- c. The outlet of the water bar must be cleared and open to ensure proper drainage and prevent ponding or pooling of water. The outlet must extend beyond the edge of the fireline.
- d. Water bars should be located so they drain onto vegetative cover, slash, rocks, duff, or other less erodible material. Water bars should not drain directly into drainages or unstable areas.
- e. Excavate water bars as dips into firm soil instead of building as dikes from fill material.
- f. Wherever possible, water bars should drain onto the unburned side of the line. On ridges, alternate direction of water bars (herringbone pattern) to prevent concentrating water on one side of the fireline.
