- Foster and maintain good relationships with local cooperators, stakeholders, and public while providing coordinated, accurate and timely information.
- Effectively manage cost by implementing strategies and tactics that have a high probability of success.

Control Objectives:

- Suppress all new fires in the complex on the Mt. Hough RD
- Keep all fires within existing perimeters

Claremont Fire – keep the fire:

- South and West of Pine Creek Valley
- East of the Minerva Trail and 1999 Pidgeon Fire burn scar
- North of Cleghorn Bar Road and Trail and roads 2309G, 23N10 and 23N39

Bear Fire - keep the fire:

- West of the Minerva Trail and 1999 Pidgeon Fire burn scar
- North of Middle Fork Feather River
- East of Road 23N60 and Hartman Bar Trail
- South of Roads 23N14 and 23N16

General Situational Awareness:

To help protect yourself, your family and to ensure all employees return home safely, make sure to practice physical distancing and wear a face covering.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: Smoke will be dense for much of the morning and then will lift some in the afternoon. Winds will remain light and terrain driven, with a southwesterly general wind over the area. Smoke is likely to moderate weather conditions again today, but afternoon winds are expected to be slightly stronger than they were yesterday. Overnight RH recoveries will continue to moderate to poor through the weekend. Expect thermal belt effects each night through the weekend. Thursday night through Sunday looks to be a critical period due to increasing winds and vertical mixing. Saturday looks to be the day of most concern, when winds could gust 15-25 mph.

Today (0700-1900):

Weather: Smoky, mostly dense in the morning. Otherwise, Sunny.

High Temperatures: 73-83° Upper Slopes & Ridges, 84-94° Low-Mid Slopes & Valleys. (24hr Trend: Up 2F)

Afternoon Humidity: 15-25%. (24hr Trend: Little-Change)

20 Foot Winds:

Valleys/Lower Slopes: Down slope/drainage 5 mph, diminishing during the morning, then becoming up slope and up valley 5-10 mph in the afternoon.

Upper Slopes & Ridges: Southeast 5 mph becoming SW 5-10 mph with gusts 10-15 mph mid-late afternoon. (24hr Wind Trend: Little to no change.)

Transport Wind: SE 7 mph in the morning, becoming S 5 mph in the afternoon.

LAL: 1.

Chc of Wetting Rain (> or = to 0.10"): 0%

Inversion/Thermal Belt: 6,000ft MSL thru morning.

Afternoon Mixing Height: 9,500 feet AGL.

Tonight (1900-0700):

Weather: Smoky, dense at times. Otherwise clear.

Temperatures: Lows 53° valley bottoms to 72° ridges. (24hr Trend: Up 5°)

Overnight Max Humidity: Valleys/Lower Slopes: 40-75%; Upper Slopes/Ridges: 25-40%. (24hr Trend: Down 5-10%)

20 Foot Winds:

Lower Slopes: Up slope and up drainage 5-10 mph becoming downslope and down drainage 5 mph overnight.

Upper Slopes: SW 5-10 mph early, becoming SE 5 mph overnight.

LAL: 1

Chc of Wetting Rain (> OR = to 0.10"): 0%

Inversion: 5,700ft MSL with smoke becoming trapped below it. Expect thermal belt between 5500 and 6500ft.

2-5 Day Outlook, Friday-Monday: * Increasing SW winds Friday-Saturday, Heat peaking Sunday*

Dry. Wide diurnal temperature ranges, hot afternoons, and moderate to poor RH recoveries on the upper slopes and ridges. Mostly clear. Max Temps 79-99° with Min RHs 7-20%. Overnight Lows 46-76°. Max RHs: 20%-70%. SW afternoon winds 5-10 mph G15-25 mph, strongest Fri-Sat, 5-10 mph drainage winds overnight. Mostly smoky.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Southwest wind pattern has returned and as it strengthens, over the next couple days with slightly hotter days but also higher relative humidity's. Beginning around noon to 2pm fire activity will become active. Earlier or later depends on where you are on the landscape, if you are in the thermal belt or ridgetop expect smoldering to low fire activity to increase significantly after noon. If in the valley or creek bottom expect closer to 2pm before activity significantly increases.

Key Points:

- Trend in lower fuel moistures continues after briefly rising in 100-hour dead fuels (~90th percentile conditions) and low nighttime Rh recovery continues to make most if not all dead and down fuels available for burning. Trending at season lows.
- Torching and spotting has contributed significantly to fire spread and challenged control efforts. Watch for holdover heat near control lines. This is a trend that has defined many of the large fire control issues in this area.

ERC 77 (▲ up +1, at 90th percentile) BI 60 (▲ up +6, below 90th percentile) Northern Sierras PSA NC07
100 HR Dead Fuel Moisture: 7% (▼ down -1, near 90th percentile)
1000 HR Dead Fuel Moisture: 8% (no change, at 90th percentile)

Expected ROS, FL, and PIGs below for uncontained/controlled fires, or if fire spots or slopes outside of control lines.

Rate of Spread (ROS): max 10-90 ch/hr, min ROS creeping to 1-10 ch/hr. Prob. Of Ignition (PIG): 80-89% afternoon
Flame Lengths (FL): areas in alignment expect FL 5-10+ ft., where fuels and topography are not in alignment expect FLs creeping to <1-5 ft.

SPECIFIC:

Branch II: Claremont Fire – Overnight fire activity in thermal belts will stay active will be the first places that becoming active in the afternoon. Watch out for alignment of slope, fuels and afternoon winds transitioning from down canyon to up canyon. Expect fires that rollout below and running back upslope, if working in or near where on steep slopes. This may range from creeping in the morning to individual tree and group torching in the afternoon. When temperatures and probability of ignition increase and Rh decreases.

Key Points:

- **Div P** – expect areas of recent active fire behavior where fire crossed over dozer lines, and spotted, becoming active earlier in the afternoon today. Anticipate the any of the red-needle bug-killed trees to torch and send many embers, trying to spot down wind.
- **Div Z** – activity continue decrease as fuels are consumed. Be ready for any activity from last couple days that with change in wind direction, watch out for spread/spot across dozer lines between La Porte Road (near Red Bridge) and Harrison Flat over 23N10 road. Be heads up for embers trying to spot from island of fuels, burning out, in the area between Bray Creek, La Porte Road, and dozer line from H-2 to La Porte Road.
- **Div S/V/X** – with minimal fire activity in **Div S/V**, and greatly reduced activity in **Div X**. Torching and flareup of interior islands of fuel will continue to consume unburned vegetation as it becomes available from backing and smoldering. Watch for any heat near the lines.

Branch X: Bear Fire – Active fire spread north of Bear Creek on the plateau, and between Mt. Ararat Creek to upper Bear Creek, with low to moderate rate of spread upslope, with occasional individual tree and group torching. Canyon winds will return to a typical southwest upcanyon flow during the day and northeast downcanyon flow at night.

Key Point:

- **Div QQ/TT** – Following yesterdays activity, holdover intense heat to increase in activity in the afternoon.
- **Div AA** – Very active spread to the to the north yesterday, expect to see this over the next couple days in response to southwest pattern sets in. Expect increased activity in the mid-upper slope of east flank above the Middle Fork of the Feather River to be active with each burn period a push from upcanyon winds.
- Watch out for roll-out igniting material below and making uphill runs in drainage, and in afternoon spotting continues to be a significant component of fire spread (spotting distances 1/10 to 1/25 of mile). Fire will actively back, flank, and spread uphill/updrainage in most directions.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke and haze will return to the active fire area with southwest wind pattern, diminishing use air support for ground operations.

SAFETY

Short intense fire runs are possible. Make sure you know where your safety zone is at, and the time it takes to get there.

Maidu Requests for Visiting Homeland

1. "Be good to the land and the land will be good to you." Maidu quote

Thank you fire fighters for helping us keep our homes and cultural sites safe.

2. Enjoy your visit in the Mountain Maidu and Valley Maidu homelands.

Archeological sites and the resources they contain are not public property. A place, site or resource may have significance to a family or local tribe, which often carries with it a special level of protection.

3. Take care to avoid injuries.

Cultural sites are very old and fragile. Archeological resources are anything over 50 years old and can therefore erode easily. Also, historic dump sites can be hazardous, with sharp glass, rusty metal, and compounds and chemicals that can harm you.

4. Enjoy with care.

Oils from skin damage pictographs (rock paintings) and petroglyphs (rock carvings). It ruins irreplaceable historic resources, and it is illegal.

5. Don't touch the knickknacks.

ALWAYS LEAVE ARTIFACTS RIGHT WHERE YOU FIND THEM. Out of context, artifacts mean little to archeologists. Often the most important aspect of archeological resources is their relationship to the place and other adjacent resources. Archeological sites and artifacts are our direct link to stories that otherwise might not be told. How can these stories be complete or accurate if the setting is altered or lost? For this and other reasons, it is illegal to move or remove artifacts.

6. Feel free to discover.

Some of the sites are identified, and some sites are not recorded. If you happen to come across a cultural site we ask you to treat it like you would any cultural artifact. And note the location and report it to a Resource Advisor.

Speak with resource advisors about the potential for archaeological sites being located adjacent to roads or proposed fire lines. It's easy to destroy features and artifacts in the dark.

- Over approximately 160 years, many changes have reshaped tribal relationships with these vast landscapes as well as with each other, and yet our knowledge of and responsibilities to these incredibly rich and vast landscapes remains strong. **We appreciate your dedication to care for and building your own relationships with our natural environment while protecting these fragile and irreplaceable resources!**

Region 5: Employee Self-Assessment Questions

June 11, 2020

Have all employees apply this self-assessment prior to entering any work location every day. This self-assessment includes four questions:

1. In the last 14 days have you had a fever, shortness of breath, body-aches or coughing (not attributable to something else, e.g. allergies) or been diagnosed with COVID-19 (presumptive or positive test)?
 - If so, do not return to work until cleared by a medical professional or you meet CDC guidance on "Discontinuation of Isolation."
2. In the last 14 days have you had close contact with someone who may have COVID-19? This includes anyone with a positive COVID-19 test or who has COVID-19 symptoms (fever, shortness of breath, body-aches or coughing (not attributable to allergies)).
 - If so, you cannot report to the workplace until cleared by a medical provider or until 14 days after the last date of exposure. If you develop symptoms, see #1.
3. In the last 14 days have you assisted in the care of an individual (outside your household) who is not well?
 - If so and you were wearing proper PPE (including a N95 mask), work with your supervisor to determine whether you should report to the workplace.
 - If so and you were not wearing proper PPE, you cannot report to the workplace until cleared by a medical provider or until 14 days after date of exposure. If you develop symptoms, see #1.
4. In the last 14 days have you traveled outside your local area?
 - If so, you should notify your supervisor and monitor yourself for symptoms for 14 days. If mitigations were not possible during travel, work with your supervisory chain to determine if self-quarantine is needed. If you develop symptoms, see #1.

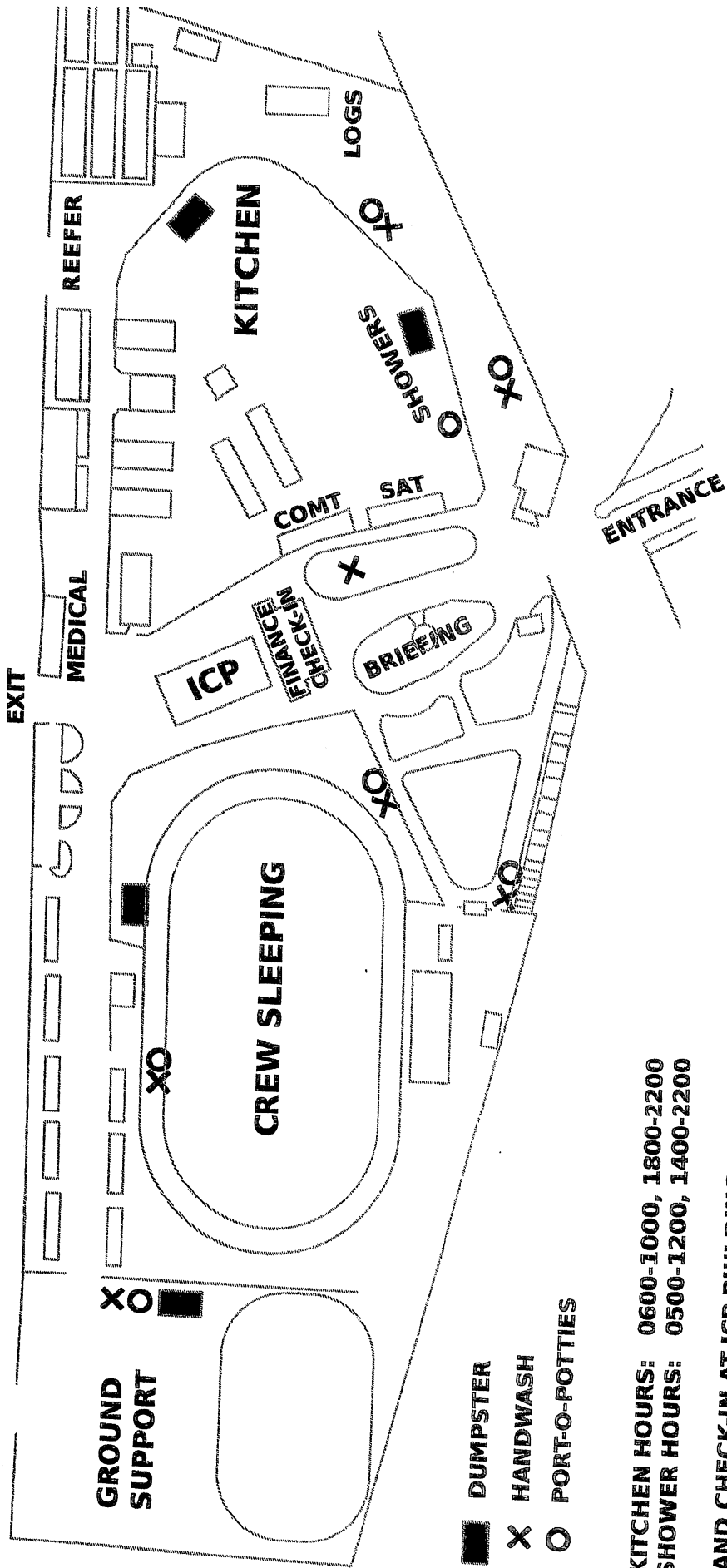
