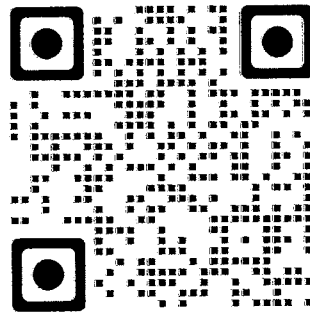

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Hot and dry conditions continue through Monday afternoon before a dry cold front approaches the region late Monday through Tuesday. Critical fire weather conditions possible Monday into Wed AM.

**Today (0600-1800):**

**Weather:** Hot, smoky throughout the day, dense at times, in the Middle Fork of the Feather River drainage. Sunny.

**High Temperatures:** *Upper Slopes & Ridges:* 85-91°F (29-33°C) *24hr Trend: Little Change*  
*Mid Slopes & Valleys:* 92-99°F (33°-37°C)

**Afternoon Min RH:** 10-15%. *24hr Trend: Little Change*

**20 Foot Winds:** *Valleys/Lower Slopes:* Downslope 5mph (8kph), becoming upslope 4-8mph (6-13kph), then WSW 5-10 gusts 13-17 mph (8-16 g 21-27kph)  
*Upper Slopes & Ridges:* WSW 8-12mph gusts 15-19 mph (13-19 g 24-31 kph) by mid-late afternoon. *24hr Wind Trend: Little Change*

**Transport Wind:** SSW 7 mph (11kph) in the morning, becoming WSW 15mph (24kph) in the afternoon.

**LAL:** 1. **Chc of Wetting Rain (> or = to 0.10"): 0%**

**Inversion/Thermal Belt:** 5,500ft MSL thru morning. **Afternoon Mixing Height:** 13,000 feet AGL.

**Tonight (1800-0600):**

**Weather:** Smoky, dense at times. Otherwise clear.

**Low Temperatures:** *Valleys:* 49°F (9°C) *Ridges:* 72° (22°C) *24hr Trend: Little Change*

**Overnight Max RH:** *Valleys/Lower Slopes:* 45-85% *Upper Slopes/Ridges:* 28-42% *24hr Trend: Up 5%*

**20 Foot Winds:**  
**Lower Slopes:** Up slope 5-10mph (8-16kph) early evening, becoming downslope and down drainage 5mph (8kph) overnight  
**Upper Slopes:** W-NW 5-10mph (8-16kph)

**LAL:** 1 **Chc of Wetting Rain (> OR = to 0.10"): 0%**

**Inversion:** 5,500ft MSL with smoke becoming trapped below it. Expect thermal belt between 5500 and 6500ft.

**2-5 Day Outlook, Monday-Thursday:** \* **Heat peaking Mon, Dry Front with East Winds Mon Night-Wed AM** \*  
Hot and dry Monday, and moderate to poor RH recoveries on the upper slopes and ridges. Winds shifting northeast Monday night into Tuesday with arrival of cold front. Fire Weather Watch for gusty northeast winds and low humidity expected late Monday night into as late as early Wednesday morning. Temperatures cooling to near average on Tuesday behind the front with high pressure returning by Thursday.

**Eureka Ridge (6895ft) S of Claremont Fire:** Temps: 66F/89F, RH: 29%/12%, Max wind: SE 12 mph.

**Buck Lake Road West (3793ft) NE of Bear Fire-** Temps: 46F/98F, RH: 90%/14%, Max wind: WSW 17 mph.

### Weather Summary

**Discussion:** See attached weather forecast

### Outputs

**GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:** Fire behavior potential to be like Saturday. Expect active fire behavior with upslope and short upslope/upcanyon fire runs, tree torching and short-range spotting. Resistance to control will be high due to steep slopes, deep/narrow canyons, deep duff, snags, and very dry downed woody fuels. Burning debris can roll downhill on steep slopes creating new spot fires that may then run back upslope. The potential for large fire growth and fire plume development will decrease today with the Haines Index dropping to a 4 which is low. Smoke over the fires may limit the drying of fuels and fire behavior. If smoke disperses on the fire expect enhanced fire behavior. There is a potential for the fire to spot across the Middle Fork of the Feather River.

**Spread Rate:** Timber on steep slopes- 1600 feet per hour (490 Meters); **Spotting**, up to 3/10 mile (one half kilometer); **Flame Length:** up to 8 ft. (2.5 meters) except in large concentrations of heavy dead fuels and on steeper slopes. Maximum daily spread up to one half mile to a mile (.8 to 1.60 kilometers per hour). Fire spread in narrow canyons/steep slopes with wind alignment may exhibit even faster spread rates. **Fire Danger Values:** The Energy Release Component (ERC) is forecasted to increase with four nearby weather stations at a high to very high fire danger level. (90<sup>th</sup> to 97<sup>th</sup> percentile) **Drought Severity Index:** This area of California is in moderate drought.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR SPECIFIC:

#### **Branch II: Claremont Fire**

**DIV. P:** The fire will continue to be active with upslope/upcanyon movement to the north/northeast, torching, and spotting. The burnout between the Bear and Claremont fires is complete. There is about a 3 mile (4.8 kilometers) stretch of backing fire spreading down slope towards the Middle Fork of the Feather River. Fire is also flanking across the slope moving towards Grizzly Creek pushed by west and southwest winds. Cleghorn Bar will be impacted. Watch out for spot fires across lines.

**DIV. S/V/X:** These divisions are in patrol and mopup. Expect residual burning in stump holes, logs and snags and burn out of interior islands which may cast spot fires across established fire lines.

**DIV Z:** Watch out for burning of islands in interior areas that may cast hot embers across fire lines

#### **Branch VII: Claremont Fire**

**DIVS DD:** Spot fires may be lofted to the south side of the Middle Fork of the Feather River. Fire modeling indicates a potential for the fire to spot across the Middle Fork of the Feather River at No Ear Bar. The slopes are very steep and heavily timbered in this area. Crown fire runs are possible with movement up to one half a mile per hour (.80 kilometers).

#### **Branch: X: Bear Fire**

**DIV. AA:** Expected continued upslope and upcanyon fire runs with associated torching of conifer trees and spot fires. The burnout has closed with Div. P on the Claremont Fire. Reference DIV. P for further information. Fire will continue to threaten Fourth Water Creek and Third Water Creek, with spotting and upslope/upcanyon runs.

**DIVs QQ and TT;** Watch out for torching and associated spot fires across fire lines.

**DIV. MM:** The Willow Creek Canyon, on the southwest side of the fire continues to hold and watch out for spot fires across lines.

**Aviation:** Smoke is being trapped between the 5500 to 6500-foot level, causing poor visibility, limiting operations.

**SAFETY:** Ensure escape routes are established and marked and know where the fire is located and the direction it is spreading.

## Fight Complacency

- Stay mentally engaged on the task at hand.
- Give clear briefings. Address complacency in your daily AAR.
- Clearly identify the day's mission and purpose.
- Use the "Buddy System" and watch out for each other. If you see something, say something.
- Ask yourself: "Are you doing the job safely, the way you were trained?"
- Look for a "new" or "fresh" approach to repetitive assignments.

## Smoke Effects

- Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.
- Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio.
- Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue.
- Allow for extended rest periods if needed.
- Avoid working in heavy inversions for prolonged periods if possible. Take occasional breaks in clear air to mitigate buildup of CO, and CO2.
- ***"Over hydrate" to assist in flushing smoke particulates from your system.***

## Driving & Fatigue

- Make sure you are getting your rest when you can! Stick to work/rest guidelines.
- Fatigue can cause us to mentally stray from the driving task.
- It only takes a second of distraction to lose control of our vehicle. The faster you are traveling, the faster you get in trouble.
- Make sure you recognize when you are too tired to drive!
- Don't tough it out and put yourself and your passengers at risk!
- Slow down, take breaks, and talk to your passengers. If possible, keep an alert passenger in the front seat next to you. Know your limits.

## Night Shift: Patrol with a Purpose!

- Obtain a clear briefing to understand the purpose and intent of the patrol.
- Coordinate all patrol activities with adjoining patrol resources.
- Maintain strict accountability of all resources.
- Always keep the purpose of the patrol in mind before engaging.
- Always assess risk versus gain when considering taking action during patrol activities.

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## ***North Complex COVID-19 Expectations***

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- All incident personnel will follow all local, State and CDC guidelines for COVID-19.
- **As you travel through the local communities proximal to the fire, be mindful that in the State of California, face coverings are required inside local businesses.**
- Being a Federal fire, incident personnel are expected to comply with the following Region 5 and incident guidance.
- Use the COVID-19 Daily Screening Tool, provided in the IAP, to monitor self and module.
- Utilize Module-as-one concepts to reduce the risk of transmitting the novel Coronavirus. This limits “close contacts” to those within the module. A “close contact” is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 15 minutes with or without face coverings/masks.
- **Social Distancing.** Maintain a minimum of 6’ physical distancing, especially from those outside of your module-as-one.
- **Face Coverings.** Face coverings are required to be worn, **in the appropriate manner covering nose and mouth**, when in identified “mask areas” at Camp. Outside of camp, all incident personnel will wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible, especially with those outside your module-as-one.
- **Wash your hands.** Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing you nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Do not use hand sanitizers containing methanol or 1-propanol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect vehicles and equipment. Disinfect all high-touch surfaces frequently, such as radios, phones, door handles, etc.

## FINANCE SECTION STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

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### **WORK REST CYCLE**

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don't exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hours shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person's responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

### **OPERATIONAL SHIFTS**

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional time may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

### **DUTY STATUS**

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, and/or be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs.). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed **at least 8 hours** of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

### **PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING**

Personnel time will be reported to the Time Unit daily or every other day once they are signed by the next level supervisor. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e. HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

Private Contracted Equipment time must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily or every other day and hours on shift noted even if it is a daily rate. When swapping out operators you need to notify Finance as well as changing from single to double shift and vice versa.

Supervisor's - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

### **MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS**

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). Until the fire is controlled, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation. Please also show in remarks section what division you are working in.

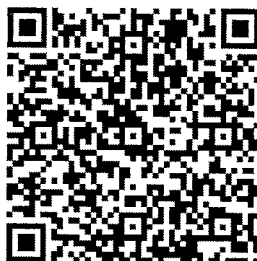

# Maidu Requests for Visiting Homeland

## 1. "Be good to the land and the land will be good to you." Maidu quote

Thank you fire fighters for helping us keep our homes and cultural sites safe.

## 2. Enjoy your visit in the Mountain Maidu and Valley Maidu homelands.

Archeological sites and the resources they contain are not public property. A place, site or resource may have significance to a family or local tribe, which often carries with it a special level of protection.

## 3. Take care to avoid injuries.

Cultural sites are very old and fragile. Archeological resources are anything over 50 years old and can therefore erode easily. Also, historic dump sites can be hazardous, with sharp glass, rusty metal, and compounds and chemicals that can harm you.

## 4. Enjoy with care.

Oils from skin damage pictographs (rock paintings) and petroglyphs (rock carvings). It ruins irreplaceable historic resources, and it is illegal.

## 5. Don't touch the knickknacks.

ALWAYS LEAVE ARTIFACTS RIGHT WHERE YOU FIND THEM. Out of context, artifacts mean little to archeologists. Often the most important aspect of archeological resources is their relationship to the place and other adjacent resources. Archeological sites and artifacts are our direct link to stories that otherwise might not be told. How can these stories be complete or accurate if the setting is altered or lost? For this and other reasons, it is illegal to move or remove artifacts.

## 6. Feel free to discover.

Some of the sites are identified, and some sites are not recorded. If you happen to come across a cultural site we ask you to treat it like you would any cultural artifact. And note the location and report it to a Resource Advisor.

Speak with resource advisors about the potential for archaeological sites being located adjacent to roads or proposed fire lines. It's easy to destroy features and artifacts in the dark.

- Over approximately 160 years, many changes have reshaped tribal relationships with these vast landscapes as well as with each other, and yet our knowledge of and responsibilities to these incredibly rich and vast landscapes remains strong. **We appreciate your dedication to care for and building your own relationships with our natural environment while protecting these fragile and irreplaceable resources!**

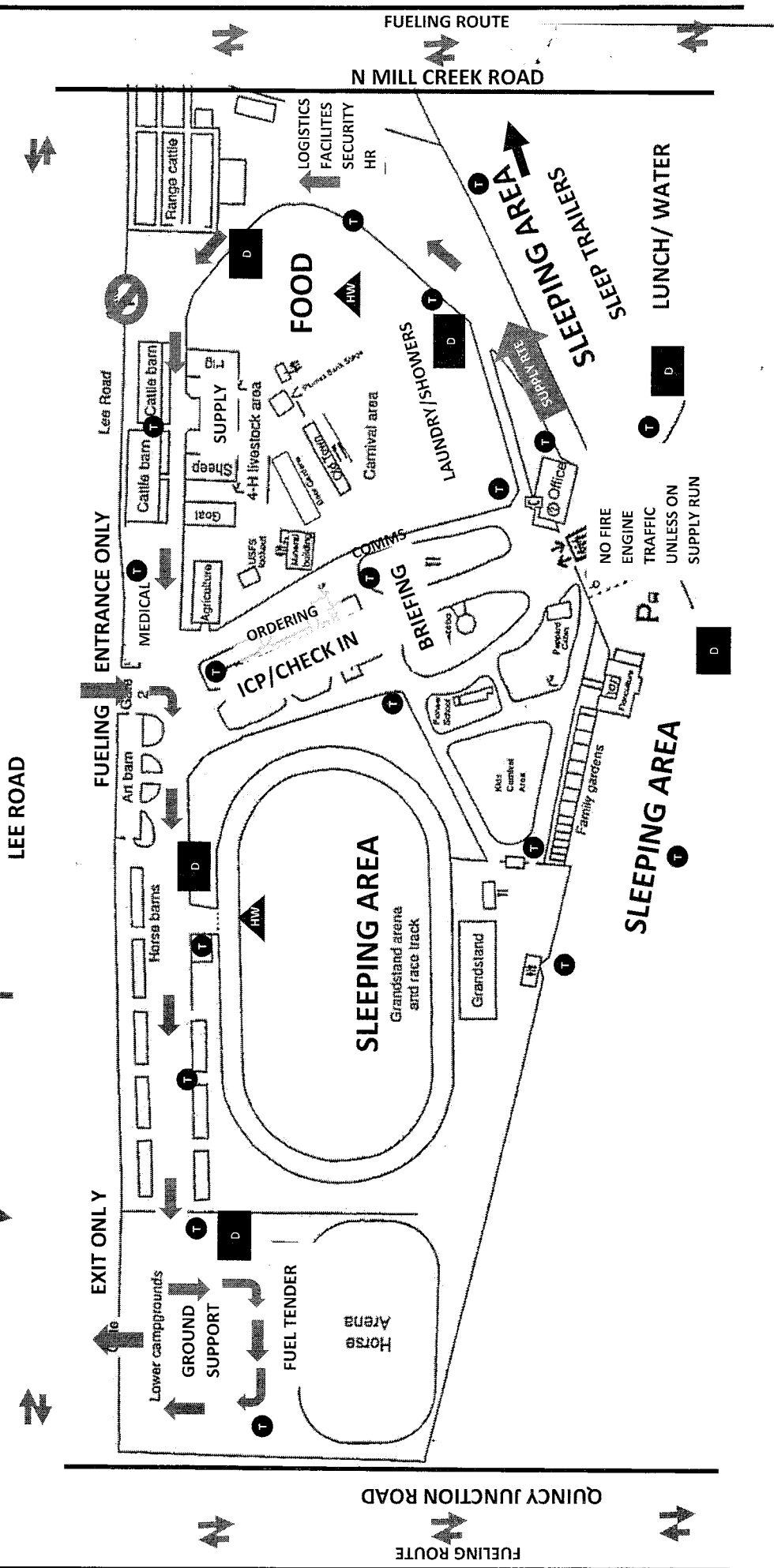

## **CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR**

This team is committed to “**ZERO TOLERANCE**” of careless, illegal, inappropriate and unsafe actions.

**Alcohol and/or illegal drugs are NOT allowed** within the incident environment or while actively assigned to the incident. Local Law Enforcement Officials will be called to deal with any suspected illegal activities. Each employee has the responsibility to be ready, willing, and able to perform the duties for which they are qualified.

### **Sexual Harassment**

Inappropriate actions or comments will not be tolerated. Everyone is expected to act in a professional manner. It is your responsibility to stop inappropriate actions or comments immediately upon becoming aware of such. Sexual Harassment must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist or Incident Commander. When outside of your designated sleeping area, you are required to wear at least a shirt, appropriate shorts, and shoes or sandals. If you need clarification of these expectations contact the Human Resource Specialist or IC. What we PERMIT we PROMOTE!!!!

## **SAFETY**

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

## **EMPHASIS AREAS**

### **Training**

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations – See back page.**

### **Evaluations**

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

### **Injuries/Claims**

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

### **Work Rest Cycles**

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.



## **Position Qualifications**

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

## **Engagement/Disengagement**

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

## **Debriefing**

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

## **Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets**

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be reviewed and signed by the next level supervisor. A finance “Rules of Engagement” document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

## **Social Media**

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident’s professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.
