OPERATIONAL BRIEFINGS

Operational briefings are critical to safe fire operations. To ensure a consistent and effective briefing, a standardized briefing checklist should always be used. The following checklist is printed on the cover of the NWCG Incident Response Pocket Guide:

Situation:

- Fire name, location, map orientation, other incidents in the area
- Terrain influences
- Fuel type and conditions
- Fire weather (previous, current, and expected)

Mission/Execution:

- Command (Incident Commander/immediate supervisor)
- Commander's intent
- Specific tactical assignments
- Contingency plans

Communications:

- Communication Plan (tactical, command, air/ground frequencies, cell phone numbers, etc.)
- Medivac Plan

Service/Support:

- Other resources that may be working adjacent to you and those available to order
- Aviation operations
- Logistics (e.g., transportation, supplies, equipment)

Risk Management:

- Identify known hazards and risks
- Identify control measures to eliminate hazards and reduce risk
- Identify trigger points for disengagement or reevaluation of operational plan

WEATHER DISCUSSION: An upper level trough will bring light scattered rain showers today, as well as much cooler temperatures and high RH values. The best potential for precipitation is over Branches VII and VIII, with rainfall totals of 0.10-0.20". Can't rule out an isolated thunderstorm or two for today. West Southwest winds gusting up to 20 to 25 are expected over ridges. Smoke expected to clear across the entire perimeter. Clear skies are expected Saturday with drier and warmer conditions across the perimeter.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fire is burning in mixed conifer stands with a shrub understory. Secondary fuel types are moderate brush fields and grass shrub mix. There is a mix of standing and down snags in the previous fires within and adjacent to the fires edge. Spotting distance 1/3 mile observed.

1000 hr fuels are 8-10%, measured 10 on the north side of the fire are 6-9%.

SPECIFIC:

Fire behavior will be creeping and smoldering. Backing and flanking fire along the perimeter. Late in the day there may be a slight chance to blackline as fuels become receptive.

AIR OPERATIONS: Mid-morning the inversion mixes out and should allow for air support.

SAFETY

Base all actions on current and expected fire behavior.

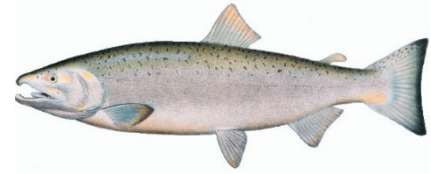

Fish Screens: Coho Salmon Critical Habitat

Most rivers and streams in this area are considered critical habitat for Threatened Coho salmon. Please ensure that Mark 3 and Engine/Tender suction hoses have the appropriate screen attached. Talk to a READ if you think you need a screen!



Port Orford Cedar root disease

Some local drainages are infected with a root disease that spreads via mud and water. To prevent spreading this disease to uninfected areas, all water tenders and engines will apply bleach to their tanks in a 1 to 1000 ratio (using bleach with 6.0 % Sodium hypochlorite). Talk to a READ if you need some bleach!

Invasive Yellow-tuft (Alyssum)

Please do not park in or drive through the flagged off area at the mill-site briefing area. There is an introduced plant in this area that spreads aggressively in the serpentine areas in the Illinois Valley. Most invasive plants do not spread into



serpentine soils. Serpentine soils are home to rare plants that only grow here in the Illinois Valley. This invasive plant threatens those rare plants. The READs would appreciate people utilizing the weed wash when they can, especially if they've been working



or parking near the IV Airport. Don't know what serpentine is? Not sure if you should hit the weed wash? Ask a READ!

SLATER FIRE – NORTH ZONE CHECK-IN INSTRUCTIONS

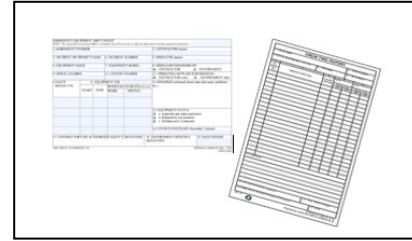

How to Check in with Finance

- **Contractors & Cooperators:** Scan, take a picture, or attach an electronic copy of your **1.** Resource Order, **2.** Agreement, **3.** Pre-Use Equipment Inspection (if applicable), **4.** Crew Manifest (if applicable), and **5.** Travel Shift Ticket signed by your supervisor and email to 2020.Slater.Finance.North@firenet.gov with **Finance Check In** in the subject line.
- **ADs/Casual Hires:** Scan, take a picture, or attach an electronic copy of your **1.** Resource Order, **2.** Casual Hire Form with ECI#, and **3.** *Forest Service ADs only:* Receipts for travel to the incident if the fire will be processing your travel and email to 2020.Slater.Finance.North@firenet.gov with **Finance Check In** in the subject line.
- **Federal or State Gov't Employees:** Scan, take a picture, or attach an electronic copy of your **1.** Resource Order and email it to 2020.Slater.Finance.North@firenet.gov with **Finance Check In** in the subject line.
- **ODF, OSM and Local Fire Support resources DO NOT need to check in with Finance.**

How to Submit Your Time

All resources must submit their time to Slater North Finance **EXCEPT OSM and Local Fire Support**. All other resources have two options:

1. Fill out your CTR/Shift Ticket, have your supervisor sign it, take a picture of it, and email it to Finance with the word **Time** in the subject line:

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

- 1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report) Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."**
- 2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.**
Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority	<input type="checkbox"/> RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness.
