NO COMMUNICATION LINK WITH CREW MEMBERS, SUPERVISORS & ADJOINING FORCES

Watchout Situation #7 is a danger that must be mitigated by maintaining good communications while working on fires. Firefighters must constantly ask themselves the following questions as situations change on the fireline:

- Can communications be established?
 - Talk about how communications are set up on fires.
 - Review situations where communications were a problem and what was done to fix the problem.
- Is the communication triangle complete?
 - Review the communication triangle and where it comes up in the "10 Standard Fire Orders" and the "18 Watchout Situations."
 - Discuss ways that firefighters can maintain the communication triangle on the fireline.
- Reduce the risks
 - If the situation is complex, wait until communications are in place.

Talk about the fires where cre3ws had to leave the line, didn't go out on the line, or something negative happened because communications were inadequate. Discuss what was done to establish communications.

4. OPERATIONAL PERIOD

Commander's Intent:

It is my expectation that we as an organization will meet the following Leader's Intent as well as the objectives identified below:

- Ensure all incident strategies and actions reflect a commitment to public, responder, and aviation safety through use of the risk management process as outlined in the IRPG and the aviation risk assessment process.
- Coordinate incident management activities with our requesting and cooperating agencies including but not limited to suppression actions and support needs.
- Treat all incident personnel, cooperators, and local publics with dignity and respect creating a "no tolerance" atmosphere for harassment, alcohol, or illegal drug use.

Values of Concern:

- Neighboring communities and private residences in California and Oregon.
- Critical communication and utility infrastructure including high power transmission lines, DOD/AT&T fiber optic cable, communication sites and repeaters.
- Highway 199 providing a main thoroughfare for inland and coastal areas of Southern Oregon and Northern California.
- Many historic, natural, cultural and recreational values within the fire area including historic buildings and multiple T&E species.
- Economic values impacted by area closures.

Management Objectives:

- Provide for emergency personnel and public safety at all times through the utilization of a deliberate risk-informed approach, with avenues for feedback from personnel. Also, ensure COVID-19 precautions and best practices are met by following agency, team and county guidance.
- Reduce the impacts of fire on communities, major infrastructure and private lands.
- Foster and maintain relationships with the public, cooperators and stakeholders.
- Ensure coordinated, timely and accurate release of public information. When possible utilize virtual platforms.
- Maintain fiscal accountability by making good risk-informed decisions.
- All personnel assigned should receive evaluations prior to leaving the incident.

Operational Objectives:

- Under the full suppression strategy, utilize direct and indirect tactics to minimize fire size. As feasible utilize minimum impact suppression tactics within the Red Buttes and Siskiyou Wilderness areas.
- Protect the values of concern identified above by suppressing the wildfire and utilizing point protection of structures when necessary.
- Scout, recon and identify primary and alternate containment opportunities considering resource availability and probability of success.
- Work collaboratively to refine and implement the population protection plan when necessary.
- Coordinate with lead Resource Advisor, including the Karuk Tribe representative, and operational Resource Advisors to minimize natural and cultural resource damage.
- Provide initial attack for the Rogue Siskiyou NF in the area under the Temporary Flight Restriction.
- Secure lines and mop-up to the level necessary based on site conditions associated with the values at risk to make the likelihood of escape minimal considering current/predicted weather conditions.

*** Strong SW Winds Today...especially along ridges ***

WEATHER DISCUSSION: An approaching Pacific frontal system will bring strong southwesterly winds to the area today. Initially RHs will remain relatively dry reaching minimums for the day in the early afternoon before then gradually climbing as winds increase in the afternoon. A marine layer along the coast and extending inland to near the 199 tunnel will tend to keep RHs higher in western portions of the fire area while further to the east will start the day drier and stay drier longer into the afternoon. Precipitation will begin spreading over western portions over the fire area late in the evening and continue east through the early morning hours.

WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Clouds increasing through the day. Becoming very windy along ridges.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: Highs in the lower 80 1500 ft valleys, lower 70s mid-slopes & lower ridges and mid 60s 5000 to 6000 ft ridges and peaks.

<u>MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:</u> 45-50% western portions of the Slater (AA/DD/GG/JJ), 35-40% other northern portions of Slater, 25-30% SE Slater and Devil. Min RHs around 1300 NW & 1500 SE then gradually increasing. <u>20 FOOT WINDS:</u>

Slopes and Valleys – SW winds 10 to 15 mph with afternoon gusts 20 to 25 mph...locally stronger afternoon winds 15 to 20 mph with gusts to 30 mph in the Illinois Valley and other aligned drainages. In areas without SW exposure, diurnal terrain driven winds will prevail.

Ridges and Peaks – Along 4000 to 5000 ft ridges SW winds increasing to 25 mph with gusts 40 mph in afternoon. Highest peaks will see SW winds 30-35 mph with gusts up to 50 mph.

STABILITY: Shallow inversions mixing out early. Unstable in the afternoon with strong turbulence near ridges. **CHANCE OF RAIN:** 0% **LAL:** 1 **Smoke Transport Wind:** SW 40 to 50 mph.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT:

<u>WEATHER</u>: Rain beginning over western portions of the fire around 2200 and spreading east overnight. Fire average precipitation totals of 0.20" expected through Thu morning. Up to 0.3 - 0.4" possible far west with around 0.1" eastern areas.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURE: Lows in the upper 40s to mid-50s.

MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 100%.

20 FOOT WINDS: SW winds 30 to 40 mph along ridges in the evening diminishing to 20 to 30 mph around midnight. Winds becoming more westerly through the early morning hours and diminishing to 15 to 20 mph. **STABILITY:** Cloud cover, rain and windy conditions will prevent the formation of valley inversion for much of the night, however patchy lowland fog is likely to form towards morning.

CHANCE OF RAIN: 90% LAL: 1 Smoke Transport Wind: SW 30 to 40 mph.

THURSDAY AND FRIDAY: Precipitation will taper off through Thu morning with cool, moist conditions persisting through Fri. A few additional isolated showers are possible both Thu and Fri afternoons but should be on the light and spotty side. Nighttime RH recoveries will be excellent, near 100% with valley fog likely. RHs during the day will remain high as well with afternoon minimums around 60% Thu and 50% Fri.

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY THROUGH MONDAY: A strong ridge building in on Sat and strengthening Sun will begin a rapid warming and drying trend which will persist into next week. Locally breezy N-NW winds will develop on Sat then become NE and increase in strength Sat night and persist through Sun morning. Temperatures will continue to warm with RHs lowering rapidly Sun and Mon and remaining low through the overnight hours with the offshore flow pattern continuing as well.

Local Weather Thresholds That Support Active Fire Behavior:

Temperatures greater than 80°, Relative Humidity less than 25%, Wind greater than 15mph.

FUELS

- 1. ERC's are greater than 90%
- 2. Fire is burning in mixed conifer stands with a shrub understory.
- 3. Secondary fuel types are moderate brush fields and grass shrub mix.
- 4. Fuel Moistures
- 10 hour fuels are 6-9%, 100 hour fuels are 10%, 1000 hour fuels are 8-10%

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- 1. The heavy inversion layer has been impacting the winds ability to reach the ground.
- 2. Tomorrows winds should be strong enough to break down the inversion early in the day, potentially producing active fire behavior across the fire area.
- 3. A potential for an increase in relative humidity exists. Significant variability across the fire area exists, the timing of that arrival and how moist that air mass is, may temper active fire behavior.

SPECIFIC:

Upper Elevations:

- Mixed conifer stands expect rates of spread around 20 chains per hour with flame lengths around 12 feet.
- Brush fields 20-40 chains per hour and 8-10 ft flame lengths.
- Grass and shrub 15-30 chains per hour and 4-6 ft flame lengths.

Lower Elevations:

• Backing and flanking fire with upslope runs 5-10 chains per hour when wind and slopes align.

Night Shift:

- Fire behavior will diminish to creeping and smoldering in valley bottoms after sunset as RH's recover.
- Active burning in highest elevations where the RH recovery is minimal.

AIR OPERATIONS

Expect clean air earlier in the day, however, wind speeds may limit air operations.

SAFETY

Reburn Potential: With an increase in winds, reburn potential exists where only the surface fuels consumed, and brush was pretreated. Those areas are susceptible to reburn, especially where winds and slope align.

SAFETY MESSAGE Slater Fire September 23, 2020

An important aspect of safety is individual responsibility for one's own health and safety. Even with the best supervision, each individual firefighter will occasionally be required to make personal decisions concerning their safety. It is important that individual responsibility is taught as the basis for a viable safety program.

Individual responsibilities

- Begin each work shift both mentally and physically prepared for the rigors of wildland firefighting. Getting adequate sleep, maintaining a healthy diet,
- ✓ Wear your PPE without being told. Each individual is responsible for performing their own risk assessments Fireline supervisors have more important duties to focus on other than performing glove patrol.
- ✓ Maintain situational awareness at all times
- ✓ Do not expect someone else to be responsible for your safety. Take it upon yourself to make "Safety" your number one priority.

Medical Incident Report (8 line)

- Purpose of the 8-Line is have a standard process to get the right medical response to someone in need. Also any firefighter can fill out and transmit with prior training and direction.
- > Treat it like an incident anyone may start out as the IC till someone with more experience can takeover.
- Always be ready for the first plan to fail have an alternate plan think Pace Primary, Alternate, Contingency, Emergency

The time to understand the medical evac. plan is before you need it. The plan is in IAP and under Emergency Medical Care (Pink) in the IRPG. Discuss with everyone around you. You may be the one depending on it to work to get you the proper care.

End State: Maintain roadways for safe travel of fire resources. All line on the Division is direct control line.

Cultural Resources:

There is a potential that undocumented cultural resources will be encountered while fighting fire. It is important when a potential cultural resource is encountered that they are not disturbed in any manner.

- GPS its location and take a photo, but do not remove or collect anything. Work with your division to notify a resource advisor for recommendations on how to proceed.
- Some cultural resources present hazardous conditions, such as open mining shafts. Be attentive to these potential hazards when working around known mines or in rocky areas.



• Resource damage can usually be avoided with good communication. Known resources may be flagged ahead in work areas.

Remember:

• Weed Wash: Please remember to use the weed wash when checkingin and during demob. Resources that arrived without initial weedwashing are being cycled through by division. Do not park in the flagged off weed patch at the mill site briefing area.



- Fish Screens: Please ensure that Mark 3 and engine/tender suction hoses have a 3/16" fish screen attached when drafting. Do not draft from areas marked as no-draft zones due to the presence of invasive aquatic species.
- Port-Orford cedar root disease: All water tenders and engines will apply bleach to their tanks in a 1 to 1000 ratio (using bleach with 6.0 % sodium hypochlorite).
