

Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. There is a high potential for fatalities, serious injuries, or incidents with potential during transfer of command periods (some have occurred in the past). Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.

- \*\* Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:
  - No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel
  - Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed
  - Communications; face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
  - Initial attack resources may not have checked-in and the Incident Commander may not be aware of the number, type and location of all resources.
  - Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.
- Mitigation actions to take:
  - Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
  - Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources, as well as your original supervisor, while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
  - Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.

#### 4. OPERATIONAL PERIOD

#### Commander's Intent:

It is my expectation that we as an organization will meet the following Leader's Intent as well as the objectives identified below:

- Ensure all incident strategies and actions reflect a commitment to public, responder, and aviation safety through use of the risk management process as outlined in the IRPG and the aviation risk assessment process.
- Coordinate incident management activities with our requesting and cooperating agencies including but not limited to suppression actions and support needs.
- Treat all incident personnel, cooperators, and local publics with dignity and respect creating a "no tolerance" atmosphere for harassment, alcohol, or illegal drug use.

#### Values of Concern:

- Neighboring communities and private residences in California and Oregon.
- Critical communication and utility infrastructure including high power transmission lines, DOD/AT&T fiber optic cable, communication sites and repeaters.
- Highway 199 providing a main thoroughfare for inland and coastal areas of Southern Oregon and Northern California.
- Many historic, natural, cultural and recreational values within the fire area including historic buildings and multiple T&E species.
- Economic values impacted by area closures.

#### Management Objectives:

- Provide for emergency personnel and public safety at all times through the utilization of a deliberate risk-informed approach, with avenues
  for feedback from personnel. Also, ensure COVID-19 precautions and best practices are met by following agency, team and county
  quidance.
- Reduce the impacts of fire on communities, major infrastructure and private lands.
- Foster and maintain relationships with the public, cooperators and stakeholders.
- Ensure coordinated, timely and accurate release of public information. When possible utilize virtual platforms.
- Maintain fiscal accountability by making good risk-informed decisions.
- All personnel assigned should receive evaluations prior to leaving the incident.

#### Operational Objectives:

- Under the full suppression strategy, utilize direct and indirect tactics to minimize fire size. As feasible utilize minimum impact suppression tactics within the Red Buttes and Siskiyou Wilderness areas.
- Protect the values of concern identified above by suppressing the wildfire and utilizing point protection of structures when necessary.
- Scout, recon and identify primary and alternate containment opportunities considering resource availability and probability of success.
- Work collaboratively to refine and implement the population protection plan when necessary.
- Coordinate with lead Resource Advisor, including the Karuk Tribe representative, and operational Resource Advisors to minimize natural and cultural resource damage.
- Provide initial attack for the Rogue Siskiyou NF in the area under the Temporary Flight Restriction.
- Secure lines and mop-up to the level necessary based on site conditions associated with the values at risk to make the likelihood of escape minimal considering current/predicted weather conditions.

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> The strong ridge of high pressure centered over the area will shift gradually east today allowing for onshore flow to increase today and Saturday. While the coastal marine layer itself will remain to the west of the fire area, breezier NW winds along the ridges are expected as well as a gradually moderation in temperatures and RHs. The western portion of the Slater fire will see the most marine influence with minimum RH occurring earlier in the day and then increasing mid to late afternoon while eastern and southern areas further inland remain warmer and drier.

#### FRIDAY:

**WEATHER:** Mostly sunny with areas of smoke continuing to linger.

**MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE:** Highs in the upper 80s valleys and 70s western ridges. More eastern/inland ridges will see highs in the lower 80s.

**Ridges and Peaks** – NE winds around 10 mph early diminishing to 3 to 5 mph mid to late morning. NW winds increasing 11 to 14 mph in the afternoon with gusts 20 to 25 mph possible along western ridges including Monkey Ridge.

- **DIV UU** The fire is checked up in Sucker Cr. nearer to DIV TT, but as you move east and south updrainage, this feature will not check itself up. As crews get nearer to Swan Mtn., anticipate an active fire edge, including single and group tree torching.

**Communication:** As the transition takes place, the need to effectively communicate on the fire is important. Take personal responsibility to insure that people you interact with know what they need to know. Transition brings new faces and different ways of communicating. Make it work.

## **Port Orford Cedar root disease**

Some local drainages are infected with a root disease that spreads via mud and water. To prevent spreading this disease to uninfected areas, all water

tenders and engines will apply bleach to their tanks in a 1 to 1000 ratio (using bleach with 6.0 % Sodium hypochlorite). Talk to a READ if you need some bleach!

# **Invasive Yellow-tuft (Alyssum)**

Please do not park in or drive through the flagged off area at the mill-site briefing area. There is an introduced plant in this area that spreads aggressively in the serpentine areas in the Illinois Valley. Most invasive plants do not spread into



serpentine soils. Serpentine soils are home to rare plants that only grow here in the Illinois Valley. This invasive plant does threaten those unique plants. The READs would appreciate people utilizing the weed wash when they can, especially if they've been

working or parking near the IV Airport. Don't know what serpentine is? Not sure if you should hit the weed wash? Ask a READ!
