



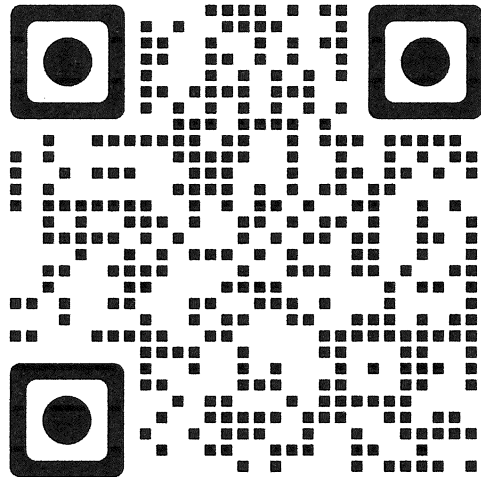

**3. Objective(s):**

**Management Objectives:**

- Ensure safety of emergency responders & public utilizing strategies & risk management processes.
- Protect natural and cultural resources, commercial timber, and critical infrastructure while utilizing resource and agency advisors.
- Foster and maintain good relationships with local cooperators, stakeholders, and public while providing coordinated, accurate and timely information.
- Effectively manage cost by implementing strategies and tactics that have a high probability of success.

**Control Objectives:**

- Suppress all new fires in the complex on the Mt. Hough RD
- Keep all fires within existing perimeters

**Sheep Fire - keep the fire:**

- West of Richmond & Wingfield Rd
- North of Fruit Growers Blvd
- East of Road 29N46
- South of Hwy 36

**Claremont Fire – keep the fire:**

- South and West of Pine Creek Valley
- East of Road 24N21
- North of Cleghorn Bar Road and Trail

**Bear Fire - keep the fire:**

- West of the 8M07 trail
- North of Middle Fork Feather River
- East of Road 23N60 and Hartman Bar Trail
- South of Roads 24N28, 23N14, and 23N16

**General Situational Awareness:**

Be aware of potential outflow winds from thunderstorms which may bring new life to areas that have had minimal activity.

Steep terrain and fire weakened trees create potential for rollout.

To help protect yourself, your family and to ensure all employees return home safely, make sure to practice physical distancing and wear a face covering.

Be prepared for the increase in activity in the afternoon.

Enhanced hygiene (especially handwashing), PPE & monitoring practices help limit the infection rate of first responders.



**\*\*\* Fire Weather Watch for Dry Lightning & Strong Outflow Winds In Effect 1400-2100 PDT Tuesday\*\*\***

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Lingering moisture and instability will lead to a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms this afternoon into early this evening. The greatest threat for showers and thunderstorms over the North Complex will be in the afternoon hours. It is most likely, however, that showers and thunderstorms will remain north and east of the area similar to Monday. It's still possible that outflow winds could affect the area in the afternoon and building smoke columns are likely to lead to some erratic and gusty winds in the heat of the afternoon and evening.

### Today (0700-1900):

**Weather:** Smoky, dense at times in the valleys, thinning, especially south of fires & at elevation from 1200-1600L. Partly Cloudy with a slight chance of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon.

**High Temperatures:** 67-77° Upper Slopes & Ridges, 77-87° Low-Mid Slopes & Valleys. *(Trend: No Change)*

**Afternoon Humidity:** 25-35% Upper Slopes & Ridges, 19-24% Low-Mid Slopes & Valleys. *(Trend: Little Change)*

**20 Foot Winds:** \* **Gusty & erratic outflow winds likely with any thunderstorms that form in the area.\***

**Valleys/Lower Slopes:** Downslope & down drainage 5 mph in the morning, then becoming upslope and up valley 5 mph before becoming WSW 5-10 mph in the afternoon.

**Upper Slopes & Ridges:** SW 5-10 mph increasing to 10-15 mph with gusts 15 to 25 mph in the afternoon. *(Wind Trend: Similar to Sunday's winds. Outflow wind gusts 30-50 mph possible)*

**Transport Wind:** SW 10 mph morning, then SSW 20 mph in the afternoon.

**LAL:** 2.

**Chc of Wetting Rain (> or = to 0.10"): 5%**

**Stability:** Inversion at 6,500ft MSL until noon local time.

**Afternoon Mixing Height:** 11,500 feet MSL.

### Tonight (1900-0700):

**Weather:** Clear skies and smoky.

**Temperatures:** Lows 48° valley bottoms to 63° ridges.

**Overnight Humidity:** Valleys: 60-90%; Ridges: 40-60%.

**20 Foot Winds:**

**Lower Slopes:** Downslope and down valley 0-5 mph.

**Upper Slopes:** SW 5-15 mph, strongest in the evening.

**LAL:** 1

**Chc of Wetting Rain (> OR = to 0.10"): 0%**

**Inversion:** Moderate thermal belt near 6,500ft with smoke becoming trapped below it.

### Wednesday-Saturday:

Mostly Sunny. Gusty SW winds in the afternoon and evening Tuesday. Winds W to NW Thursday. Enhanced East-Southeast winds possible Thursday night to Friday morning. Winds then west each afternoon-evening Friday into Saturday and light east winds Friday night into Saturday. Getting slightly hotter and drier each day, peaking Friday.

### Observations from Monday:

**Feather River College (3425ft) near ICP-** Temps: 58F/89F, RH: 88%, 28%. Max wind: SW 8 mph.

**Buck Lake Road West (3793ft) NE of Bear Fire-** Temps: 58F/85F, RH: 87%, 36%, Max wind: SW 15 mph.

**Pierce (5811ft) SW of Sheep Fire:** Temps: 62F/82F, RH: 50%, 25%, Max wind: W 20 mph.

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## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:**  
Potential changes to afternoon fire activity, with forecasted thunderstorm development moving through the area. Watch for low fire activity in the morning transitioning to increased fire activity as it responds to increase in windspeeds and temperature, with decreased Rh. This trend typically reverses prior to sunset, but also expect delay in decreased fire activity response.

- Key Points:**
- Possible thunderstorms (T-storms) and outflow winds may bring new life to areas exhibiting little fire activity. Downburst/outflow winds can significantly increase fire activity and/or change direction of primary fire spread and spotting.
  - Low nighttime Rh recovery continues to contribute to critically low and decreasing fuel moisture in dead fuels.
  - Critically low fuel moistures (~90<sup>th</sup> percentile conditions) make all dead and down fuels available for burning.
  - Expect afternoon winds to pick up lifting out smoke and inversion with increased fire activity and spotting.
  - Spotting from individual tree torching and passive crown fire activity has contributed significantly to increased fire spread rates and reduced control efforts.
- ERC 78 (▲ up +1, greater than 90<sup>th</sup> percentile)      BI 56 (▲ up +3, near 90<sup>th</sup> percentile)      Northern Sierras PSA NC07  
100 HR Dead Fuel Moisture: 6.6% (▼ down -0.1, greater than 90<sup>th</sup> percentile)  
1000 HR Dead Fuel Moisture: 7.6% (no change, greater than 90<sup>th</sup> percentile)

### SPECIFIC:

**Branch I: Sheep fire** – Smoke column from the Sheep fire was moderated by shading out of solar heating that contributed to increased fire activity. Fire spread in grass and sage-steppe in foothills and flats near Susanville and Janesville will support rapid rates of spread (up to 180+ ch/hr) with afternoon winds.

- Key Points:**
- Active fire behavior in Div D & F, with lower ROS & FLs in 2016 Willard fire. Div H will .
  - Expect afternoon winds to pick up, lifting out smoke and inversion, and increased fire activity and spotting.
  - Spotting from individual tree torching and passive crown fire activity has contributed significantly to increased fire spread rates and reduced control efforts.
- Rate of Spread (ROS):** max 20-180 ch/hr, min ROS 1-10 ch/hr.      **Prob. Of Ignition:** 82-85%  
**Flame Lengths (FL):** areas in alignment expect FL 5-10+ ft., where fuels and topography are not in alignment expect FL <1-5 ft.

**Branch II: Claremont Fire** – Area north of highway 70 has been lined but expect active fire behavior in this area to continue in the afternoon. Watch out for potential spotting upslope across containment lines. Watch for T-storm or pyrocumulus development. Potentially strong outflow winds will increase fire activity and spread fire erratically.

- Key Points:**
- Fire behavior modeling projects fire spread to the E, parallel with Middle Fork Feather River northeast section of Div Z.
  - Expect afternoon winds to pick up, lifting out smoke and inversion, and increased fire activity and spotting from torching trees and shrubs.
  - Spotting from individual tree torching and passive crown fire activity has contributed significantly to increased fire spread rates and reduced control efforts.
- Rate of Spread (ROS):** max 10-90 ch/hr, min ROS 1-8 ch/hr.      **Prob. Of Ignition:** 82-85%  
**Flame Lengths (FL):** areas in alignment expect FL 5-10+ ft., where fuels and topography are not in alignment expect FL <1-5 ft.

**Branch II: Bear Fire** – Active backing-fire into Little Bear Creek, spread down canyon from the south-southeast flank. Where the fire is on Bear Creek near the Middle Fork of the Feather River, continues to pose a significant fire spread risk with afternoon strong up canyons winds in the Feather River.

- Key Point:**
- Watch out for roll-out with material igniting below with uphill runs in drainage, and concerns regarding afternoon spotting north on the plateau, have not really materialized. Do not become complacent to this ... risk to individual tree torching and spotting still pose a risk of spread north.
- Rate of Spread (ROS):** max 10-90 ch/hr, min 1-8 ch/hr.      **Prob. Of Ignition:** 82-85%  
**Flame Lengths (FL):** areas in alignment expect FL 5-10+ ft., where fuels and topography are not in alignment expect FL <1-5 ft.

### AIR OPERATIONS:

Smoke inversion and haze can impede use of aviation resources in support of ground operations.



### Weather Environment

- Thunderstorm threat seems to be diminishing, but even a distant cell can impact our area with out flow winds.
- Normal SW winds can still be expected in the afternoon absent a storm cell and that's the wind that has given us trouble all week.
- Brief your crews and be prepared to change tactics based on changing weather conditions.

### Fireline:

- Hazard trees continue to come down in Div Z and Div A as well as fire weakened power poles in Div H, D, and F. Constantly survey your area for these hazards.
- Old grow sites and mines are scattered throughout the forest. If you encounter one, isolate, deny entry and report up the chain of command.
- Structure protection poses additional hazards. Residence and owners may remain in the area and complicate the process. Prioritize what is important and don't over commit.

### Transportation issues:

- Hwy 70 is open with escorted traffic, so park off and work at least 6 feet off the fog line and post a look out when working right on the highway.
- Roads are narrow and getting dusty from so much traffic. Slow down, and turn on headlights, especially early and late in the day when daylight is diminished.
- Heavy equipment operators cannot always hear the radio due to noise, don't assume they know you are in the area. Proceed with caution.




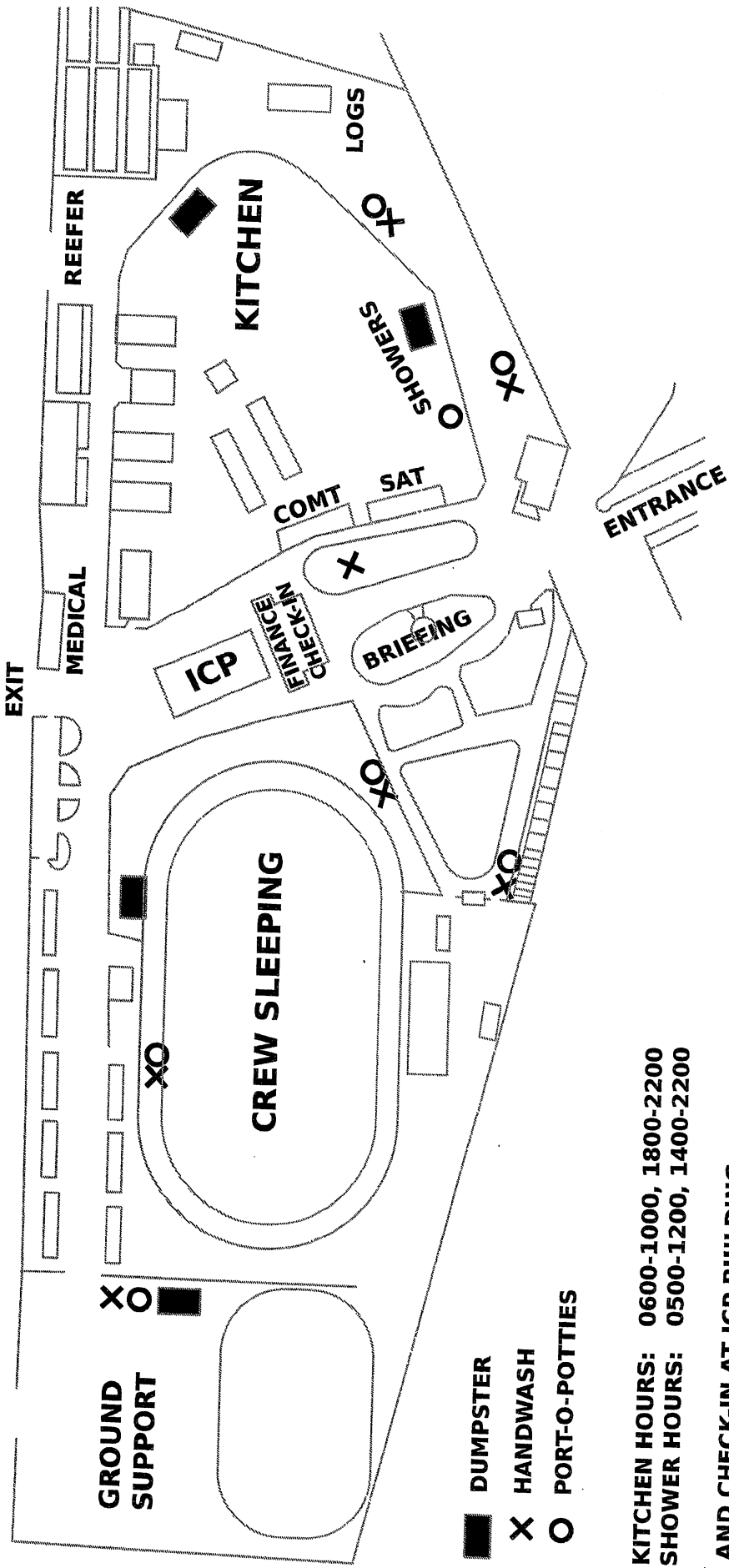

## **Region 5: Employee Self-Assessment Questions**

**June 11, 2020**

Have all employees apply this self-assessment prior to entering any work location every day. This self-assessment includes four questions:

1. In the last 14 days have you had a fever, shortness of breath, body-aches or coughing (not attributable to something else, e.g. allergies) or been diagnosed with COVID-19 (presumptive or positive test)?
  - If so, do not return to work until cleared by a medical professional or you meet CDC guidance on "Discontinuation of Isolation."
2. In the last 14 days have you had close contact with someone who may have COVID-19? This includes anyone with a positive COVID-19 test or who has COVID-19 symptoms (fever, shortness of breath, body-aches or coughing (not attributable to allergies)).
  - If so, you cannot report to the workplace until cleared by a medical provider or until 14 days after the last date of exposure. If you develop symptoms, see #1.
3. In the last 14 days have you assisted in the care of an individual (outside your household) who is not well?
  - If so and you were wearing proper PPE (including a N95 mask), work with your supervisor to determine whether you should report to the workplace.
  - If so and you were not wearing proper PPE, you cannot report to the workplace until cleared by a medical provider or until 14 days after date of exposure. If you develop symptoms, see #1.
4. In the last 14 days have you traveled outside your local area?
  - If so, you should notify your supervisor and monitor yourself for symptoms for 14 days. If mitigations were not possible during travel, work with your supervisory chain to determine if self-quarantine is needed. If you develop symptoms, see #1.
