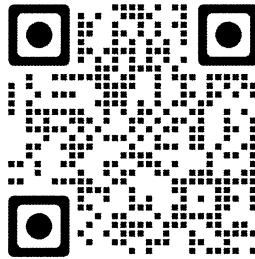

***** Gusty Southwest winds Sunday and Monday *****

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Southwest winds will increase a little more over yesterday with afternoon gusts of 15-18 mph possible. An incoming low pressure system will continue to increase SW wind gusts Sunday and Monday with areas of critical fire weather conditions possible due to gusty winds and low humidity.

Today (0600-1800):

Weather: Increasing areas of smoke. Sunny.

High Temperatures: (24hr Trend: Little Change)

Upper Slopes & Ridges: 68-74°F (20-23°C)

Mid Slopes & Valleys: 84-87°F (29-31°C)

Afternoon Min RH: 16-22% (24hr Trend: Little Change)

20 Foot Winds: (24hr Trend: +2mph)

Valleys/Low Slopes: Downslope 3-6mph, then SW 5-10 mph after 1100. Gusts 15 mph (5-10kph, then 6-14G24kph)

Ridges/Upper Slopes: Downslope 4-7mph, then SW 8-12 mph after 1100. Gusts 18 mph (6-11kph, then 13-19G29kph)

Transport Wind: SW 10-15 mph (16-24kph)

LAL: 1

A.M. Inversion/Thermal Belt: 6,500-7,000ft MSL

Chance of Wetting Rain (> or = to 0.10"): 0%

Afternoon Mixing Height: 12,000 feet AGL.

Tonight (1800-0600):

Weather: Areas of smoke.

Low Temps: Valleys: 40-45°F (3-6°C) Slopes/Ridges: 58-63° F (14-17°C) (24hr Trend: +4°)

Max RH: Valleys: 70-90% Slopes/Ridges: 40-45% (24hr Trend: Little Change)

20 Foot Winds: SW 5-10 mph, becoming down slope/drainage 4-7 mph after 2200. (8-16kph, then 6-11kph)

Inversion/Thermal Belt: 6,500-7,500ft MSL.

Chance of Wetting Rain (> OR = to 0.10"): 0%


2-5 Day Outlook, Sunday-Wednesday: Increasing SW winds, low RH. Near Critical Fire Weather conditions.

An incoming low pressure system will slowly move towards the west coast and may result in increased southwesterly wind gusts from Sunday into Tuesday. SW winds with gusts 25-30 mph possible. Periods of critical fire weather conditions possible due low humidity and gusty winds.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

WEATHER: Increasing areas of smoke. Sunny

MAX TEMP: Mid Slope & Valleys: **85-88°** Upper Slopes & Ridges: 68-74° **MIN RH: 15-20%**

20 FOOT WINDS: Valley/Lower Slopes: Down drainage 3-6 mph, then **SW 5-10 mph** after 1100, G 18mph.
Upper Slopes & Ridges Down drainage 4-7, then **SW 8-12 mph** after 1100, G 20 mph.

LAL: 1 CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN ($\geq 0.10''$): 0%

FUELS: The major fuel types, found in and around the fire area are timber litter and shrubs.

Ignition Receptiveness: ERC levels just above the 90th percentile. Probability of Ignition Day 89%
Night 25%.

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures :1 hour – 3% day, **10 hour– 5%**, 100 hour–5%, and 1000 hour– 6%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

***** Local Thresholds exceeded*****

We continue to experience critical fire weather with high temperatures, low RH and low fuel moistures, live and dead. Limited overnight recovery on ridge tops. In smoke shaded areas the fire remains very active (upslope runs, group torching and short-range spotting). Be aware of slope alignment, especially in clear air. Ground, surface and aerial fuels remain receptive.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Branch VII South Zone:

Division BB: Fuel/topography driven fire consisting of flanking, upslope movement and slope reversals.

Division DD: Expect fuel/topography driven fire with potential for active fire behavior with SW/NE drainage alignment.

Division JJ: SW/NE drainage alignment will increase fire behavior. Anticipate fire activity from the West Zone (CALFire).

Division GG: Expect fuel/topography driven fire with potential for active fire behavior from SW/NE drainage alignment.

Branch X North Zone:

Division AA/TT: Minimal fire activity expected in Div AA. Firing operations will be challenged in Div DD with the predicted SW wind. There is also potential for rollout, upslope runs and spotting.

Division P: Creeping and smoldering

Division MM/QQ: Expect significant fire activity as the fire continues to advance to the North even with the smoke inversion. Fire behavior consisting of torching, upslope movement and short-range spotting.

Division P/S/V/X/Z: These divisions are in mop-up/patrol status. Interior islands will continue to smolder and creep.

Night Division: Moderate temperatures tonight. Low RH on the ridge tops but much higher in the valleys. Winds will be SW 5-10 mph then down drainage after 2200. Firing operations will be challenged with adverse winds (SW). Fuels continue to remain receptive and burn readily at night.

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations over the entire incident will be limited due to smokey conditions.

Hazard Control Around Trees

- Eliminate the hazards with qualified sawyers, blasters/explosives, or heavy equipment.
- Avoid hazards by designating “No Work Zones” (flag, sign, and map).
- Modify suppression tactics or fireline location to avoid high-risk areas.
- Post lookouts to help secure high-risk areas.
- Utilize road/traffic controls in high-risk areas.
- Fireproof potential hazard trees to prevent ignition.
- Keep clear of bucket drops near trees/snags.
- Reposition firefighters to secure areas in response to high wind forecast.
- Provide timely feedback to others regarding any hazard trees.

LCES

- **Lookouts**- Use experienced people, know your trigger points, do not depend on air resources and check your surroundings!
- **Communications**- Know your radio frequencies, check batteries, and be cognizant of any problems with direct communications.
- **Escape Routes**- Know them, time them, discuss them, and reassess them!
- **Safety Zones**- Evaluate the “black” as your safety zone. Reassess for problems.

- **Fatigue**

Common Denominators

There are five major common denominators of fire behavior on fatal and near-fatal fires. Such fires often occur:

- On relatively small fires or deceptively quiet areas of large fires.
- In relatively light fuels, such as grass, herbs, and light brush.
- When there is an unexpected shift in wind direction or in wind speed.
- When fire responds to topographic conditions and runs uphill.
- Critical burn period between 1400 and 1700.

North Complex COVID-19 Expectations

- All incident personnel will follow all local, State and CDC guidelines for COVID-19.
- **As you travel through the local communities proximal to the fire, be mindful that in the State of California, face coverings are required inside local businesses.**
- Being a Federal fire, incident personnel are expected to comply with the following Region 5 and incident guidance.
- Use the COVID-19 Daily Screening Tool, provided in the IAP, to monitor self and module.
- Utilize Module-as-one concepts to reduce the risk of transmitting the novel Coronavirus. This limits “close contacts” to those within the module. A “close contact” is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 15 minutes with or without face coverings/masks.
- **Social Distancing.** Maintain a minimum of 6’ physical distancing, especially from those outside of your module-as-one.
- **Face Coverings.** Face coverings are required to be worn, **in the appropriate manner covering nose and mouth**, when at ICP and camps. Outside of camp, all incident personnel will wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible, especially with those outside your module-as-one.
- **Wash your hands.** Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Do not use hand sanitizers containing methanol or 1-propanol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect vehicles and equipment. Disinfect all high-touch surfaces frequently, such as radios, phones, door handles, etc.



EXTENSION PROCESS

Due to lack of resources nationwide and the inability to obtain new resources to replace those that are reaching their maximum length of assignment, the following guidelines apply.

HEALTH, READINESS, AND CAPABILITY MUST BE CONSIDERED PRIOR TO ASSIGNING INCIDENT PERSONNEL BACK TO BACK ASSIGNMENTS. THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF INCIDENT PERSONNEL AND RESOURCES WILL NOT BE COMPROMISED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

Federal employees, Local and out of state cooperating agencies

1. Obtain written approval from home unit supervisor
2. Obtain written approval from DIVS for extension or crew swap
3. See Resources Unit at ICP 4-5 days prior to 14th working day
4. If approved to extend, obtain extension form from DMOB
 - Extension options:
 - i. Extend to 21 days (exclusive of travel to and from incident. Time spent in staging and preposition status count towards the 21 day assignment.)
 - ii. Extend to 30 days. Inclusive of mandatory days off and exclusive of travel. (must have 2 days R&R between day 15-21)
5. Extension form needs to be signed by approvers listed.
6. For crew swap, bring 213 (Equipment Operator/Crew Change) to Check-in with Operations signature, method of travel, names of all personnel replacing existing crew, and home dispatch unit contact information.
 - Note crew swap on time documents and provide to finance
 - Replacement crew **must** arrive on 14th day of the existing crews work assignment and be available to work the following day
 - Bring fireline safety cards and ID.

Private contractors

1. Obtain written approval from Operations on 213 (general message) and bring to Resources Unit.
 - After working 14 days you must take at least 2 days R&R unpaid and can return to incident for an additional 14 day assignment.
 - At any time between day 1-14 you can swap personnel and provide information of new crew members to Check-In and Finance.
 - After a 30-day assignment, an extra 14 days can be considered.

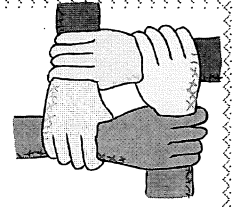

Maidu Requests for Visiting Homeland

1. "Be good to the land and the land will be good to you." Maidu quote

Thank you fire fighters for helping us keep our homes and cultural sites safe.

2. Enjoy your visit in the Mountain Maidu and Valley Maidu homelands.

Archeological sites and the resources they contain are not public property. A place, site or resource may have significance to a family or local tribe, which often carries with it a special level of protection.

3. Take care to avoid injuries.

Cultural sites are very old and fragile. Archeological resources are anything over 50 years old and can therefore erode easily. Also, historic dump sites can be hazardous, with sharp glass, rusty metal, and compounds and chemicals that can harm you.

4. Enjoy with care.

Oils from skin damage pictographs (rock paintings) and petroglyphs (rock carvings). It ruins irreplaceable historic resources, and it is illegal.

5. Don't touch the knickknacks.

ALWAYS LEAVE ARTIFACTS RIGHT WHERE YOU FIND THEM. Out of context, artifacts mean little to archeologists. Often the most important aspect of archeological resources is their relationship to the place and other adjacent resources. Archeological sites and artifacts are our direct link to stories that otherwise might not be told. How can these stories be complete or accurate if the setting is altered or lost? For this and other reasons, it is illegal to move or remove artifacts.

6. Feel free to discover.

Some of the sites are identified, and some sites are not recorded. If you happen to come across a cultural site we ask you to treat it like you would any cultural artifact. And note the location and report it to a Resource Advisor.

Speak with resource advisors about the potential for archaeological sites being located adjacent to roads or proposed fire lines. It's easy to destroy features and artifacts in the dark.
