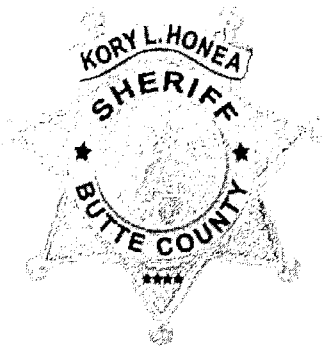

FROM THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM
Troy Hagan, Incident Commander

Thanks to all of you who have worked hard on this incident and welcome to those who may be new. The information presented below is intended to introduce you to some of the principles and protocols under which our Team operates.



- First of all, we regard you as part of our team. For us—including you—to work effectively, we must communicate—up, down and across.
- We take our job very seriously, but try not to take ourselves too seriously. Let's not let the little stuff bother us and detract from the job at hand.
- Safety is our first concern every time and in all situations. If you find a situation in which we don't seem to practice what we preach, let us know. We'll fix it.
- Your health and welfare are also important to us—and this is going to be a long fire season. Please be sure to wash your hands before meals and remember those other sanitation efforts that will reduce your chances of getting sick.
- We encourage you to maintain social distancing (6 feet or more) when you can. Wear a cloth face covering when in ICP or other closed-in areas. Help to mitigate COVID-19 transmission.
- Please offer a wave, a smile or a kind word to area residents and visitors. Let's leave the relationships better than we found them.
- You will notice that our regular team members don't wear agency uniforms. That's because we are a team of many agencies and represent our region, not particular agencies. We encourage folks on our incidents to forego wearing agency uniforms unless there is a particular need for identification (e.g. law enforcement).
- Sexual harassment and other inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated. Such behaviors do not contribute to the accomplishment of our objectives.
- If you see unescorted media on the fire, contact your DIVS immediately. All media must be escorted by incident staff and must wear PPE.
- One of our most important functions as a Team is to support you in the fire suppression effort—to provide equipment, supplies, good food, adequate sleeping accommodations and the like. If there is something we can do better for you, please let us know.
- If we have misspelled your name or unit in the IAP (or have other similar errors), please let us know so we can correct it.

We are committed to providing a healthy work environment where we treat one another with respect. To accomplish this, we must each take responsibility for our conduct and speech. And it's OK to laugh and have fun!

North Complex Weather Forecast

WEATHER DISCUSSION: After several days of a consistent weather pattern, change is on the horizon. Temperatures and humidity today will be much like yesterday. Southwesterly general winds will be a little stronger, 10-15 mph. Gusts can be as high as 25-30 mph, primarily at higher elevations. The front itself will cross the fire late tonight, but will be very weak as it does so – its passage will be hard to detect – and may be impossible to tell at all.

Today (0600-1800):

Weather: With the weak front approaching, look for SSW-SW general winds, peaking around 15 mph and gusts as high as 30 mph in exposed spots. The front should remain far enough off that temperatures today will be much like previous days.

High Temperatures: 24hr Trend: -1F to +1F / -0.5C to +0.5C

Upper Slopes & Ridges: 65-70°F / 18-21C Middle Slopes: 68-74°F / 20-23C

Low Slopes & Valleys: 78-84°F / 26-29C

Afternoon Min RH: 24hr Trend: 0-5% drier

Upper Slopes/Ridges: 15-25% Lower Slopes/Valleys: 8-15%

20 Foot Winds: 24hr Trend: +0-5 mph / 0-8 km/h at peaks/ridgetops, +5-10 mph / 8-16 km/h at lower elevations

Ridges/Above 5,000': SSW 5-10 mph / 8-16 km/h until 1400, strengthening to SW 15 mph / 25 km/h gusting to 30 mph / 48 km/h.

Low Slopes and Valleys: SSW 0-5 mph / 0-8 km/h early, becoming SW 5-10 mph / 8-16 km/h after 1100, increasing to SW 10-15 mph / 16-25 km/h with gusts to 25 mph / 40 km/h after 1400.

A.M. Inversion/Thermal Belt: 5,500-6,000 ft. / 1700-1850 m MSL

Transport Wind: W 10-15 mph / 16-25 km/h

Mixing Height: 5,000-6,000 ft. / 1500-1850 m MSL

LAL: 1

Chance of Wetting Rain (> or = to 0.10''): 0%

Tonight (1800-0600):

Weather: Look for the incoming front to slow down and wash out as it arrives, reaching Div QQ around 2200, and (what's left of the front) reaching the South Zone line near end of shift. The passing of the front may be barely perceptible, especially for South Zone – indeed, there may not be a front left by that point.

Low Temps: Valleys/Drainages: 36-42°F / 2-6C Slopes/Ridges: Above 50°F / 10C before midnight, sliding to 45°F / 7C by end of shift 24hr Trend: steady at low elevations, 5-7°F / 3-4C cooler at elevation after midnight.

Max RH: 24hr Trend: steady until front arrives, +10% between frontal passage and sunrise.

Valleys/Drainages: 55-70% Thermal Belt: 35-45% Upper Slopes/Ridges: 50-60%

20 Foot Winds: 24hr Trend: steady early, but light and variable overnight

SW 10-15 mph / 16-25 km/h with occasional gusts to 25 mph / 40 km/h until 2000. Afterwards, SSW around 5 mph / 8 km/h battling as terrain-driven winds increase through the night.

LAL: 1

Chance of Wetting Rain (> OR = to 0.10''): 0%

Inversion/Thermal Belt: 5,400-5,800 ft. / 1700-1850 m MSL until frontal passage

2-5 Day Outlook, Fri-Mon: Despite this front technically being a “cold” front, any cooling with end after sunrise, with Friday likely being warmer than Thursday as winds switch to NNE or NE. This is a lead-in to the weekend, which has a fire weather watch for late Saturday morning through Monday morning for summer-like temperatures and strengthening northeast winds.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY

WEATHER: Slightly cooler, more humid and lighter winds will moderate fire behavior today.

MAX TEMP: Mid Slope & Valleys: 68-74° Upper Slopes & Ridges: 65-70° Lower Slopes **78-84°**

MIN RH: Valley 8-15% Ridge 15-25%

20 FOOT WINDS: Ridges **SW 15 mph G30.**

Valleys **SW 10-15mph G25 mph.** Expect battling winds through the night.

LAL: 1 CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN ($\geq 0.10''$): 0%

FUELS: The major fuel types, found in and around the fire area are timber understory and litter.

Ignition Receptiveness: ERC levels are below the 90th percentile. Probability of Ignition Day 75%
Night 20%.

Thermal Belt 5,500-6,000 ft.

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures: 1 hour – 5% day, 10 hour– 5%, 100 hour–7%, and 1000 hour– 7%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

The fire is burning in Northern Sierra mixed conifer and routinely spreads by torching and spotting. Expect spots to establish quickly and fire behavior to transition active and increase to very active. SW winds continue to challenge firing operations and remain variable in areas with deep intersecting drainages. Probability of ignition around 75%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Branch X North Zone:

Division AA/TT: Minimal fire activity expected in Division AA. In Division TT, expect interior smoldering. Potential for spotting.

Division MM: Active interior and smoldering near the line. Potential for spotting with alignment and/or wind shifts.

Division QQ: Expect interior active fire behavior from firing operation on Red Mtn., Big Creek, Grizzly Creek and Grizzly Forebay areas. Potential for spotting due to erratic winds.

Division P/S/V/X/Z: Patrol status. Interior islands will continue to smolder.

Branch VII South Zone:

Division BB: Active interior fire behavior in the area of Turn Table Peak and Onion Valley. Potential for battling winds due to deep adjacent drainages. Watch for spotting from previous firing.

Division DD: Active interior fire behavior due to previous firing operations (towards DIV BB). Potential for spotting. Smoldering and creeping in the interior.

Division GG/JJ: Smoldering and creeping in the interior.

Night Division: The front arrival will create battling winds between SW flow and terrain driven winds – should generally be light after 2000. A probability of ignition (PIG) of 20% will minimize fire behavior and keep spot fires manageable. Firing operations will be successful with cooler temps, low PIG and favorable winds. Fire will likely remain active in the thermal belt 5,500 – 6,000 ft.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoky conditions may limit air operations.

Safety Message

Watchout #16 – Getting frequent spot fires across line. Continue to assess the fire environment and anticipate changes.

Maidu Requests for Visiting Homeland

1. "Be good to the land and the land will be good to you." Maidu quote

Thank you fire fighters for helping us keep our homes and cultural sites safe.

2. Enjoy your visit in the Mountain Maidu and Valley Maidu homelands.

Archeological sites and the resources they contain are not public property. A place, site or resource may have significance to a family or local tribe, which often carries with it a special level of protection.

3. Take care to avoid injuries.

Cultural sites are very old and fragile. Archeological resources are anything over 50 years old and can therefore erode easily. Also, historic dump sites can be hazardous, with sharp glass, rusty metal, and compounds and chemicals that can harm you.

4. Enjoy with care.

Oils from skin damage pictographs (rock paintings) and petroglyphs (rock carvings). It ruins irreplaceable historic resources, and it is illegal.

5. Don't touch the knickknacks.

ALWAYS LEAVE ARTIFACTS RIGHT WHERE YOU FIND THEM. Out of context, artifacts mean little to archeologists. Often the most important aspect of archeological resources is their relationship to the place and other adjacent resources. Archeological sites and artifacts are our direct link to stories that otherwise might not be told. How can these stories be complete or accurate if the setting is altered or lost? For this and other reasons, it is illegal to move or remove artifacts.

6. Feel free to discover.

Some of the sites are identified, and some sites are not recorded. If you happen to come across a cultural site we ask you to treat it like you would any cultural artifact. And note the location and report it to a Resource Advisor.

Speak with resource advisors about the potential for archaeological sites being located adjacent to roads or proposed fire lines. It's easy to destroy features and artifacts in the dark.

- Over approximately 160 years, many changes have reshaped tribal relationships with these vast landscapes as well as with each other, and yet our knowledge of and responsibilities to these incredibly rich and vast landscapes remains strong. We appreciate your dedication to care for and building your own relationships with our natural environment while protecting these fragile and irreplaceable resources!

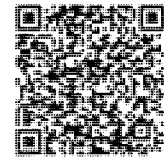

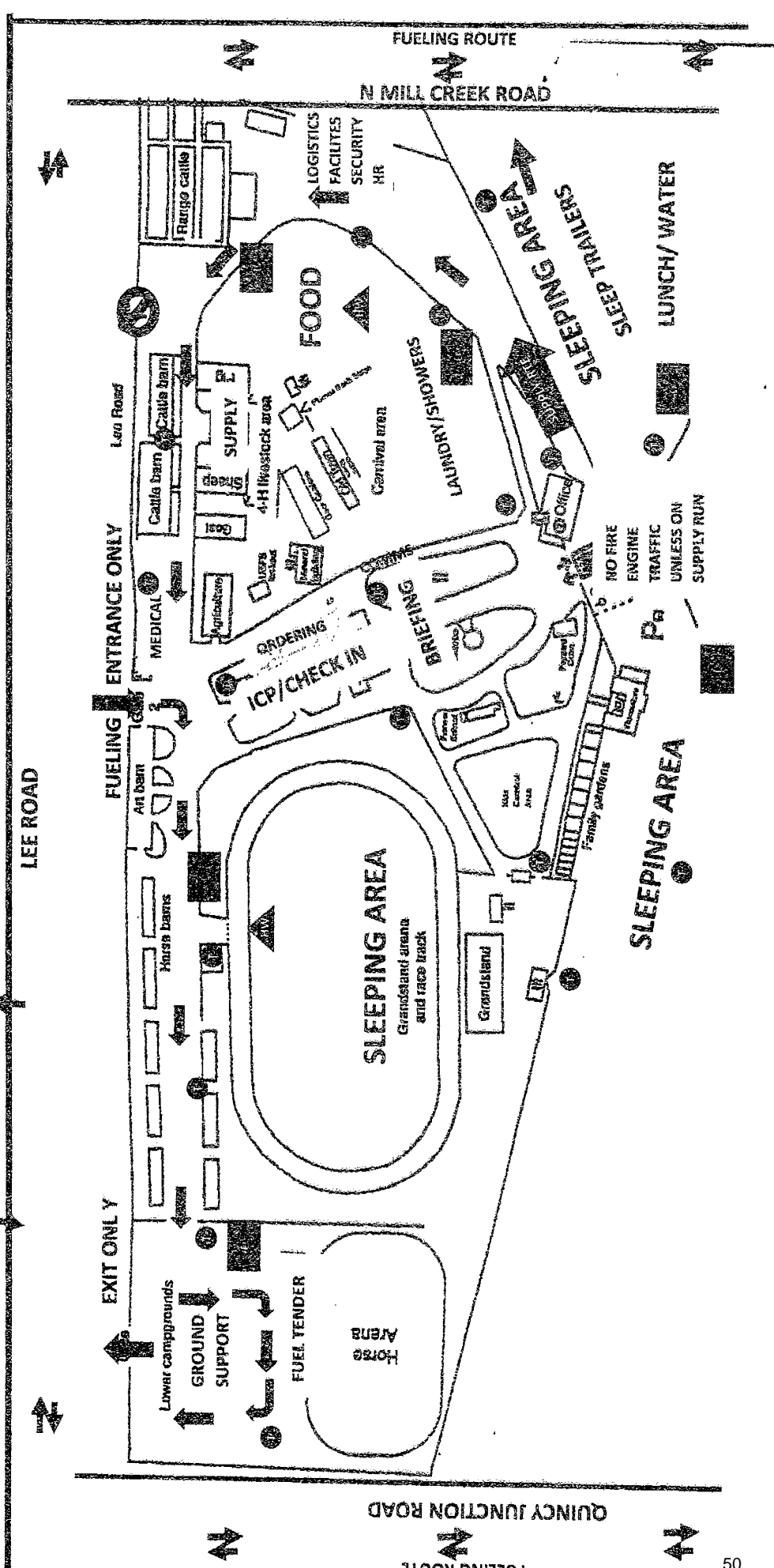

North Complex COVID-19 Expectations

- All incident personnel will follow all local, State and CDC guidelines for COVID-19.
- **As you travel through the local communities proximal to the fire, be mindful that in the State of California, face coverings are required inside local businesses.**
- Being a Federal fire, incident personnel are expected to comply with the following Region 5 and incident guidance.
- Use the COVID-19 Daily Screening Tool, provided in the IAP, to monitor self and module.
- Utilize Module-as-one concepts to reduce the risk of transmitting the novel Coronavirus. This limits “close contacts” to those within the module. A “close contact” is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 15 minutes with or without face coverings/masks.
- **Social Distancing.** Maintain a minimum of 6’ physical distancing, especially from those outside of your module-as-one.
- **Face Coverings.** Face coverings are required to be worn, **in the appropriate manner covering nose and mouth**, when at ICP and camps. Outside of camps, all incident personnel will wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible, especially with those outside your module-as-one.
- **Wash your hands.** Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing you nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Do not use hand sanitizers containing methanol or 1-propanol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect vehicles and equipment. Disinfect all high-touch surfaces frequently, such as radios, phones, door handles, etc.

- Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).

- Supervisory positions have changed. Know who you are working for.
- Briefings: Required every shift, for all personnel, for new assignments, and for changing conditions.

Make a Safety Difference

- As a supervisor, provide constant and relentless oversight.
- ***Stay focused on the task at hand, all the time!***
- Come up with a safer way to perform a risky assignment.
- Discuss situations that might cause a near miss.
- Never tolerate “Hey, watch this!”
- Discuss the effects of fatigue and how to mitigate the effects of fatigue.
- While in the fire zone, wear your hardhat when you leave the vehicle.
- Have a purpose in what you do.



Covid-19
