WEATHER DISCUSSION:

...Hot and Dry Conditions through Tuesday, South Winds by Thursday...

A change to the persistent hot and dry conditions will be arriving late in the week, but before we get there, hot and dry weather will persist with light, terrain driven winds continuing. The high pressure system that has been parked over California and Nevada will start to break down by midweek as a strong Pacific storm system approaches the West Coast. This will allow gusty south to southwest winds to develop Thursday and Friday with winds peaking on Saturday as the storm moves onshore. Increasing moisture will bring a chance for showers by the weekend, although the exact track of the storm is still in doubt resulting in low confidence on potential precipitation amounts.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Widespread haze and smoke, otherwise clear.

TEMPERATURES: Ridges: Highs: 72-77 F / 22-25 C Lows: 45-50 F / 7-10 C

Valleys: Highs: 86-92 F / 30-33 C Lows: 60-65 F / 16-18 C

HUMIDITY: Ridges/Slopes: Min: 10-20% Max: 20-30%

Valleys: Min: 10-20% Max: 45-60%

20 FT WINDS: Ridges: Downslope/down-valley 8-14 mph / 14-23 km/h with gusts to 25 mph / 40 km/h until 1300...then

winds becoming upslope/up-valley 5-10 mph / 8-16 km/h with gusts to 18 mph / 29 km/h during the afternoon. Winds returning to downslope/down-valley 5-10 mph / 8-16 km/h with gusts near 20 mph / 32

km/h after 2100.

Valleys: Downslope/down-valley 0-4 mph / 0-6 km/h until 1300...then winds becoming upslope/up-valley

4-8 mph / 6-13 km/h. Winds returning to downslope/down-valley 2-5 mph / 3-8 km/h after 2100.

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN: 0 percent.

A.M. INVERSION/THERMAL BELT: 5000-6000 ft. / 1500-1800 m MSL.

TRANSPORT WINDS: Northeast 15 mph / 24 km/h until 1300, then southwest 10 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY:

Mostly Clear (0-10%). Widespread smoke and haze. Hot and dry with minimum humidity values from 12-18%. Gusty northeast winds in the morning, becoming upslope/up-valley by early afternoon.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK:

Wednesday through Friday: Cooling trend in store with winds becoming more southerly ahead of a strong Pacific storm system. Humidity values will be improving, although gust south winds peaking near 30 mph / 48 km/h along ridges will become coming late Thursday and Friday. There is a chance for rain showers moving into the area on Friday. Temperatures will be cooling into the 60s and 70s (15 to 25 C) by Friday afternoon.



Weather Word of the Day: Rain Shadow – An area of reduced precipitation on the lee side of a mountain barrier caused by warming of air and dissipation of cloudiness as air descends the barrier.

WEATHER SUMMARY: Widespread haze and smoke, otherwise clear. Hot and dry weather will persist with an increase in southerly winds after Wednesday.

Temperatures: Day Ridges: 72–77 Degrees (22-25 C) Valleys/Canyons: 86–92 Degrees (30-33 C)

Night 45–50 Degrees (7-10 C) 60–65 Degrees (16-18 C)

Relative Humidity: Ridges: Min 10%-20% Max 20%-30% Valleys: Min10%-20% Max 45%-60%

20 FT Winds: Ridgetop: Downslope/down valley 8-14 mph with gusts to 25 mph becoming upslope/up valley 5-10 mph with gusts to 18 mph in the afternoon. Evening winds downslope/down valley 5-10 mph with gusts to 20 mph.

Slope/Valley: Downslope/down valley 0-4 mph becoming upslope/up valley 4-8 mph. Evening winds downslope/down valley 2-5 mph.

RH Below 19%, Mid Flame Wind Speed Greater Than 8 MPH, Temperature Above 85 Degrees.

Weather is forecast to exceed thresholds but may not do so at the same time.

OUTPUTS

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Potential exists for moderate upslope runs as fire transitions from surface to torching. Roll out on the south side of North Fork Feather River or spotting on the north side could result in active fire behavior. Breaks in smoke cover will increase intensity and spotting distances. Spots along cold portions of the containment line should exhibit low rates of spread.

SPECIFIC:

Branch II:

DIV OO (River South) – Fire will continue to back into the North Fork Feather River. Potential for roll out and moderate upslope runs exist during periods of clear air and moderate winds. Moderate and continuous surface fuels are present in the south side of the river. Fire should continue flanking east toward the penstocks.

DIV OO (River North) – Fire established in the 2008 BTU Lightening Complex fire scar above Rock Creek could exhibit rapid rates of spread with wind and slope alignment. Fine fuel is dry and abundant (See **Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory**). Shading from smoke or cloud cover will affect intensity. Breaks in smoke, especially, will lead to rapid changes in fire intensity and speed. Transition to flatter terrain and cooler conditions near The Big Hill and North Valley should reduce fire intensity.

DIV QQ – Winds are forecast to be favorable throughout the day. Spots outside the line during periods of low RH may transition from surface fire to isolated torching in timber fuels. POI of 80% can be expected during daytime hours with short range spotting possible. Conditions will dry into the evening and early morning hours above the inversion. Surface spread will persist until wind shifts to a southwest follow and accompanied raise in RH.

DIV MM – Fire movement down the North Fork Feather River is unlikely, but the greatest threat is during the morning hours when peak downslope winds are forecast. Fire in the thermal belt will remain active until mixing occurs after sunup. Monitor fire behavior to identify thermal belt location and monitor fire location for the potential roll out.

Branch V – Except low to moderate fire behavior outside containment lines. Timber fuel models will exhibit the greatest intensity with torching and short-range spotting.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Smokey conditions deteriorating into the afternoon as wind shifts to a westerly flow

North Complex COVID-19 Expectations

- All incident personnel will follow all local, State and CDC guidelines for COVID-19.
- As you travel through the local communities proximal to the fire, be mindful that in the State of California, face coverings are required inside local businesses.
- Being a Federal fire, incident personnel are expected to comply with the following Region 5 and incident guidance.
- Use the COVID-19 Daily Screening Tool, provided in the IAP, to monitor self and module.
- Utilize Module-as-one concepts to reduce the risk of transmitting the novel Coronavirus. This limits "close contacts" to those within the module. A "close contact" is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 15 minutes with or without face coverings/masks.
- **Social Distancing.** Maintain a minimum of 6' physical distancing, especially from those outside of your module-as-one.
- Face Coverings. Face coverings are required to be worn, in the appropriate manner covering nose and mouth, when at ICP and camps. Outside of camps, all incident personnel will wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible, especially with those outside your module-as-one.
- Wash your hands. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing you nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Do not use hand sanitizers containing methanol or 1-propanol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect vehicles and equipment. Disinfect all high-touch surfaces frequently, such as radios, phones, door handles, etc.

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FINANCE MESSAGE

Thank you for submitting your times in the safest way possible. The options for submitting your CTR's and Shift Tickets are:

- Electronic fillable PDF CTR/Shift Ticket. Finance can email you forms directly. Make sure the forms
 are signed by the supervisor before submitting to Finance. In order to use fillable forms, you must
 have some version of Adobe Acrobat downloaded on your device, or you can send to your email and
 fill out.
- Hard copy CTR/Shift Ticket. You may fill out a hard copy CTR/Shift Ticket, snap a picture and email to Finance OR you may turn in your actual hard copy as usual. If you send in a picture, please make sure it is legible and includes the supervisor's signature at the bottom. The phone numbers listed below are hard line phones, so texting does not work.

PLEASE:

- Crews need to include a manifest with their first CTR.
- Try to submit your times at least every other day. There will be a drop box at Haskins for time submission. We will have a driver bring them daily to Finance at ICP.
- Write your email on your CTR
- Hazard pay justifications are required on your CTR's in comments section. "H=Hazard" is not enough.

WHEN YOU ARE CLOSE TO DEMOB:

- Give Finance a "Courtesy Call" to make sure all your documents have been received.
- Follow the demob plan instructions based on your travel route home. This will determine whether your demob will be in-person or remote.
- Submit all time documentation (including travel home) ahead of demob.
- Send only one representative per resource to finance.
- Abide by scheduled demob time or call finance for an unscheduled demob.

EXTENSION PROCESS

Due to lack of resources nationwide and the inability to obtain new resources to replace those that are reaching their maximum length of assignment, the following guidelines apply.

HEALTH, READINESS, AND CAPABILITY MUST BE CONSIDERED PRIOR TO ASSIGNING INCIDENT PERSONNEL BACK TO BACK ASSIGNMENTS. THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF INCIDENT PERSONNEL AND RESOURCES WILL NOT BE COMPROMISED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

Federal employees, Local and out of state cooperating agencies

- 1. Obtain written approval from home unit supervisor
- 2. Obtain written approval from DIVS for extension or crew swap
- 3. See Resources Unit at ICP 4-5 days prior to 14th working day
- 4. If approved to extend, obtain extension form from DMOB
 - Extension options:
 - i. Extend to 21 days (exclusive of travel to and from incident. Time spent in staging and preposition status count towards the 21 day assignment.)
 - ii. Extend to 30 days. Inclusive of mandatory days off and exclusive of travel. (must have 2 days R&R between day 15-21)
- 5. Extension form needs to be signed by approvers listed.
- 6. For crew swap, bring 213 (Equipment Operator/Crew Change) to Check-in with Operations signature, method of travel, names of <u>all personnel</u> replacing existing crew, and home dispatch unit contact information.
 - Note crew swap on time documents and provide to finance
 - Replacement crew must arrive on 14th day of the existing crews work assignment and be available to work the following day
 - Bring fireline safety cards and ID.

Private contractors

- 1. Obtain written approval from Operations on 213 (general message) and bring to Resources Unit.
 - After working 14 days you must take at least 2 days R&R unpaid and can return to incident for an additional 14 day assignment.
 - At any time between day 1-14 you can swap personnel and provide information of new crew members to Check-In and Finance.
 - After a 30-day assignment, an extra 14 days can be considered.



1. "Be good to the land and the land will be good to you." Maidu quote

Thank you fire fighters for helping us keep our homes and cultural sites safe.

2. Enjoy your visit in the Mountain Maidu and Valley Maidu homelands.

Archeological sites and the resources they contain are not public property. A place, site or resource may have significance to a family or local tribe, which often carries with it a special level of protection.

3. Take care to avoid injuries.

Cultural sites are very old and fragile. Archeological resources are anything over 50 years old and can therefore erode easily. Also, historic dump sites can be hazardous, with sharp glass, rusty metal, and compounds and chemicals that can harm you.

4. Enjoy with care.

Oils from skin damage pictographs (rock paintings) and petroglyphs (rock carvings). It ruins irreplaceable historic resources, and it is illegal.

5. Don't touch the knickknacks.


ALWAYS LEAVE ARTIFACTS RIGHT WHERE YOU FIND THEM. Out of context, artifacts mean little to archeologists. Often the most important aspect of archeological resources is their relationship to the place and other adjacent resources. Archeological sites and artifacts are our direct link to stories that otherwise might not be told. How can these stories be complete or accurate if the setting is altered or lost? For this and other reasons, it is illegal to move or remove artifacts.

5. Feel free to discover.

Some of the sites are identified, and some sites are not recorded. If you happen to come across a cultural site we ask you to treat it like you would any cultural artifact. And note the location and report it to a Resource Advisor.

Speak with resource advisors about the potential for archaeological sites being located adjacent to roads or proposed fire lines. It's easy to destroy features and artifacts in the dark.

 Over approximately 160 years, many changes have reshaped tribal relationships with these vast landscapes as well as with each other, and yet our knowledge of and responsibilities to these incredibly rich and vast landscapes remains strong. We appreciate your dedication to care for and building your own relationships with our natural environment while protecting these fragile and irreplaceable resources!

SAFETY

Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

EMPHASIS AREAS

Training

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations** – **See back page.**

Evaluations

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

Injuries/Claims

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

Work Rest Cycles

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

Position Qualifications

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

Engagement/Disengagement

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

Debriefing

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be <u>reviewed and signed</u> by the next level supervisor. A finance "Rules of Engagement" document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

Social Media

California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law.
