#### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

#### ...Increasing Southerly Winds, Chance of Rain Friday and Saturday...

A significant change to the weather pattern will be occurring late this week as a Pacific storm system taps into leftover moisture from Tropical Storm Marie in the Eastern Pacific Ocean. Ahead of this approaching storm, gusty south to southwest winds will be developing starting Wednesday afternoon and persisting into the weekend. Temperatures will be cooling with humidity values rising over the next several days.

Winds returning to downslope/down-valley 5-10 mph / 8-16 km/h with gusts near 20 mph / 32 km/h after 2200.

TRANSPORT WINDS: Northeast 15 mph / 24 km/h until 1200, then southwest 15 mph 24/ km/h.

#### OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY:

Increasing clouds with areas of smoke and haze. Not as hot with temperatures cooling into the 70s to lower 80s F / 20s C. Minimum humidity levels will bottom out between 15 and 25 percent by late afternoon. Northeast winds in the morning gusting up to 20 mph, shifting to the southwest after 1100 with gusts up to 25 mph, mainly along the ridges. Local eddying of winds in steep valleys and stream confluences should be expected.

#### **EXTENDED OUTLOOK:**

Thursday through Saturday: Breezy to windy through the period with south to southwest winds gusting up to 35 mph / 55 km/h along the ridges. Turning colder with humidity levels rising each day. Scattered to numerous showers developing Friday and continue through Saturday night with wetting rain likely.



Weather Word of the Day: Dynamic Lifting - The forced uplifting of air from various atmospheric processes, such as weather fronts, and cyclones.

#### Incident Weather Thresholds

RH Below 19%, Mid Flame Wind Speed Greater Than 8 MPH, Temperature Above 80 Degrees.

Weather is forecast to exceed thresholds but may not do so at the same time.

#### **OUTPUTS**

#### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

Weather will begin transitioning to a more normal daily pattern. Upslope/upcanyon flows will slowly return to the fire area. Smoke from area fires will continue to influence our local winds and fire behavior. Clear conditions will signal the potential for greater fire behavior and should be monitored as an indicator of transitions from surface to isolated torching.

#### SPECIFIC:

#### Branch II:

**DIV OO (River South)** – Fire is closing in on the penstocks. Forecast shift in wind direction could accelerate movement toward the east. Clear air will increase fire intensity. Moderate and continuous surface fuels are present and spread will continue until fuels are consumed.

DIV OO (River North) – Increased threat of spotting moving into today. Forecast winds will push embers parallel to or across the river. Fire established in the 2008 BTU Lightening Complex fire scar above Rock Creek could exhibit rapid rates of spread with wind and slope alignment. Fine fuel is dry and abundant (See Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory). Shading from smoke or cloud cover will affect intensity. Breaks in smoke, especially, will lead to rapid changes in fire intensity and speed. Transition to flatter terrain and cooler conditions near The Big Hill and North Valley should reduce fire intensity.

**DIV QQ** – Winds are forecast to cross control lines starting today. Spots outside the line during periods of low RH may transition from surface fire to isolated torching in timber fuels. POI of 80% can be expected during daytime hours with short range spotting possible. Conditions will dry into the evening and early morning hours above the inversion. Surface spread will persist until wind shifts to a easterly flow during the evening hours.

**DIV MM** – Fire movement down the North Fork Feather River is unlikely, but the greatest threat is during the morning hours when peak downslope winds. Southwest winds are forecast and could spread embers from interior torching to the east of the large spot. The thermal belt will return, and fire behavior could remain active until mixing occurs after sunup. Monitor fire behavior to identify thermal belt location and monitor fire location for the potential roll out.

**Branch V** – Except low to moderate fire behavior outside containment lines. Timber fuel models will exhibit the greatest intensity with torching and short-range spotting.

#### **AIR OPERATIONS:**

Smokey conditions deteriorating into the afternoon as wind shifts to a westerly flow

### **North Complex COVID-19 Expectations**

- All incident personnel will follow all local, State and CDC guidelines for COVID-19.
- As you travel through the local communities proximal to the fire, be mindful that in the State of California, face coverings are required inside local businesses.
- Being a Federal fire, incident personnel are expected to comply with the following Region 5 and incident guidance.
- Use the COVID-19 Daily Screening Tool, provided in the IAP, to monitor self and module.
- Utilize Module-as-one concepts to reduce the risk of transmitting the novel Coronavirus. This limits "close contacts" to those within the module. A "close contact" is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 15 minutes with or without face coverings/masks.
- <u>Social Distancing.</u> Maintain a minimum of 6' physical distancing, especially from those outside of your module-as-one.
- <u>Face Coverings.</u> Face coverings are required to be worn, in the appropriate manner covering nose and mouth, when at ICP and camps. Outside of camps, all incident personnel will wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible, especially with those outside your module-as-one.
- Wash your hands. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing you nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Do not use hand sanitizers containing methanol or 1-propanol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect vehicles and equipment. Disinfect all high-touch surfaces frequently, such as radios, phones, door handles, etc.



# **Maidu Requests for Visiting Homeland**

### 1. "Be good to the land and the land will be good to you." Maidu quote

Thank you fire fighters for helping us keep our homes and cultural sites safe.

2. Enjoy your visit in the Mountain Maidu and Valley Maidu homelands.

Archeological sites and the resources they contain are not public property. A place, site or resource may have significance to a family or local tribe, which often carries with it a special level of protection.

### 3. Take care to avoid injuries.

Cultural sites are very old and fragile. Archeological resources are anything over 50 years old and can therefore erode easily. Also, historic dump sites can be hazardous, with sharp glass, rusty metal, and compounds and chemicals that can harm you.

### 4. Enjoy with care.

Oils from skin damage pictographs (rock paintings) and petroglyphs (rock carvings). It ruins irreplaceable historic resources, and it is illegal.

### 5. Don't touch the knicklmacks.


ALWAYS LEAVE ARTIFACTS RIGHT WHERE YOU FIND THEM. Out of context, artifacts mean little to archeologists. Often the most important aspect of archeological resources is their relationship to the place and other adjacent resources. Archeological sites and artifacts are our direct link to stories that otherwise might not be told. How can these stories be complete or accurate if the setting is altered or lost? For this and other reasons, it is illegal to move or remove artifacts.

#### S. Feel free to discover.

Some of the sites are identified, and some sites are not recorded. If you happen to come across a cultural site we ask you to treat it like you would any cultural artifact. And note the location and report it to a Resource Advisor.

Speak with resource advisors about the potential for archaeological sites being located adjacent to reads or proposed fire lines. It's easy to destroy features and artifacts in the dark.

Over approximately 160 years, many changes have reshaped tribal relationships with
these vast landscapes as well as with each other, and yet our knowledge of and
responsibilities to these incredibly rich and vast landscapes remains strong. We
appreciate your dedication to care for and building your own relationships with our
natural environment while protecting these fragile and irreplaceable resources!
