#### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

Hot conditions along with smoke will plague the area again today. Visibilities should improve late in the day, but fires across California increased smoke production which will move over the fire. Winds will be light today and westerly below 10 mph. As upslope/up-valley flow starts mid morning, humidity above 4500' will increase slightly, before falling in the afternoon as mixing occurs. Afternoon minimums could fall below 15%. For night shift, higher elevations will see humidity recovery in the 40s around midnight but then steadily fall below 30 percent in the early morning hours. Critical fire weather conditions will escalate early in the week.

**FUELS CONDITIONS:** Fuels in the Red Salmon Complex consist of mixed conifer with Mountain brush, timber litter and grass understory. Fires in the past few years including 1999 Megram (SW), 3013 Butler (N), 2006 Bake-Oven (SE), and 2013 Corral (S) have more of a shrub and grass component with standing dead snags and heavy dead/down fuels. ERC's and1000-hr fuel moisture (8%) above 97th percentile and climbing. We've been upgraded to EXTREME drought in this area.

#### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

**HUMIDITY:** 

Fuels remain critically dry. Primary spread will be thru fire moving in dead/down fuels, torching trees which lofts embers and starts spot fires in the dead/down fuels. Brush fuel types appear to be less involved than the conifers and dead fuels. Fire will be more active on the upper 1/3 of the slopes in general and rapid upslope runs remain likely where winds and slopes align.

Smoke may damper fire behavior on the lower slopes and valley bottoms. Fire will be much more active during times when the inversion and smoke are off the fire area allowing for sunshine and vertical mixing of air.

Flame lengths will generally be 2-6 feet with backing/flanking and 10-30 feet at the head. ROS backing 3-5 ch/hr, flanking 8-18 ch/hr and 20-60 at the head. Spread is primarily on the surface with associated single/group tree torching with likelihood of upslope runs when there is wind/slope alignment. Spotting distances of 0.25-0.5 miles is possible with longer spotting distances occurring as the fire nears ridgelines and is exposed to higher winds.

#### SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

**DIV A/D:** Minimal fire behavior expected.

**DIV K:** Continued burnout of heavy fuels adjacent to control lines along much of the division. Continued spread to the north in the Butler burn scar towards established dozer lines at Horn Creek Gap.

**DIV M/N:** Minimal fire behavior expected.

**DIV O, P:** Possible upslope runs east to Devil's backbone ridge in areas where the fire works across the drainage bottom in Red Cap Canyon. High chance of spot fires across control lines with these runs. Continued movement to the north/northeast in Eight-mile creek drainage towards W. Fork Knownothing Creek and Head of N. Fork Eagle Creek.

**DIV Q/R:** The fire continues to move south across the slopes out of Red Cap canyon into head of Soldier Creek, Tish Tang a Tang Creek, Oregon Creek and Bret Creek.

**DIV U:** Fire will spread West and north into the south and main forks of Domingo Creek and continue north towards N Fork Mill Creek. Primarily surface spread with torching and spotting and rollout with short during upslope runs likely where there is slope and wind alignment.

**DIV W, Y:** Minimal fire behavior expected.

Night SHIFT: Fire will continue to be active most of the night especially in thermal belt and on the ridgelines.

#### SAFETY

SAFETY: Extreme fire behavior can occur when the inversion breaks.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Smoke lingering over the fire area may hamper air operations.

- Take the time to understand the plan. Ensure all resources completely understand the assignment, the Communications Plan, and the Medical Plan.
- Supervisory positions have changed. Know who you are working for.
- Briefings: Required every shift, for all personnel, for new assignments, and for changing conditions.

# Any Firefighter knows HOW Every firefighter should know WHY

#### Make a Safety Difference

- As a supervisor, provide constant and relentless oversight.
- Stay focused on the task at hand, all the time!
- Come up with a safer way to perform a risky assignment.
- Discuss situations that may cause a near miss.
- Never tolerate "Hey, watch this!"
- Discuss the effects of fatigue and how to mitigate the effects of fatigue.
- While in the fire zone, wear your hardhat when you leave the vehicle.
- Have a purpose in what you do.

#### Covid-19

- Be Smart! Stay Apart! Maintain at least 6 feet distance from people when feasible
- Practice good hygiene. Wash hands often and avoid touching your face
- Cover your nose and mouth with a facial covering and cough into your elbow if needed

#### **Red Salmon Complex COVID-19 Expectations**

- All incident personnel will follow all local, State and CDC guidelines for COVID-19.
- As you travel through the highway 96 corridor to the Fire, the Hoopa and Yurok Reservations are closed. Please do not stop in Hoopa or Weitchpec.
  - ✓ (Exception: The Hoopa Gas Station, which is open for business.)
- Use the COVID-19 Daily Screening Tool provided in the IAP to monitor self and module.
- Utilize Module-As-One concept to reduce the risk of transmitting the novel Coronavirus. This limits "close contacts" to those within the module. A "close contact" is defined as less than 6 feet, for at least 15 minutes with or without face coverings/masks. A "casual contact" is defined as less than 6 feet for less than 15 minutes or more than 6 feet for more than 15 minutes.
- **Social Distancing**. Maintain a minimum of 6 feet physical distancing from those outside of your module-as-one.
- <u>Face Coverings</u>. Face coverings are required to be worn in the appropriate manner covering nose and mouth when at ICP and camps.
- Wash your hands. Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use had sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Do not use hand sanitizer containing methanol or 1-propanol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- <u>Clean and disinfect vehicles and equipment.</u> Disinfect all high-touch surfaces frequently, such as radios, phones, door handles, etc.

#### **FINANCE MESSAGE**

Thank you for submitting your times in the safest way possible. The options for submitting your CTR's and Shift Tickets are:

- Electronic fillable PDF CTR/Shift Ticket. QR codes to fillable forms are included below. If you do not have QR capabilities, Finance can email you forms directly. Make sure the forms are signed by the supervisor before submitting to Finance. In order to use fillable forms, you must have some version of Adobe Acrobat downloaded on your device, or you can send to your email and fill out.
- Hard copy CTR/Shift Ticket. You may fill out a hard copy CTR/Shift Ticket, snap a picture and email to Finance
  OR you may turn in your actual hard copy as usual. If you send in a picture, please make sure it is legible and
  includes the supervisor's signature at the bottom. The phone numbers listed below are hard line phones, so
  texting does not work.

#### **PLEASE:**

- Crews need to include a manifest with their first CTR.
- Try to submit your times at least every other day. There is a drop box at Orleans Base Camp in Check-in to drop off your time.
- Write your email on your CTR
- Hazard pay justifications are required on your CTR's in comments section. "H=Hazard" is not enough.

#### WHEN YOU ARE CLOSE TO DEMOB:

- Give Finance a "Courtesy Call" to make sure all your documents have been received.
- Follow the demob plan instructions based on your travel route home. This will determine whether your demob will be in-person or remote.
- Submit all time documentation (including travel home) ahead of demob.
- Send only one representative per resource to finance tent.
- Abide by scheduled demob time or call finance for an unscheduled demob.

#### **WORK REST CYCLE**

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don't exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hours shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person's responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

#### **OPERATIONAL SHIFTS**

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

#### **DUTY STATUS**

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, <u>and/or</u> be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs.). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed at least 8 hours of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

## PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

<u>Personnel time</u> will be reported to the Time Unit daily or every other day once they are signed by the next level supervisor. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e. HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

<u>Private Contracted Equipment time</u> must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily or every other day and hours on shift noted even if it is a daily rate. When swapping out operators you need to notify Finance as well as changing from single to double shift and vice versa.

Supervisor's - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

#### **MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS**

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). Until the fire is controlled, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation.

# **Resource Advisor Messages**

- Resource advisors are available in nearly all Divisions on the fire and are here to support the mission of containing this wildfire while at the same time aim to minimize resource damage impacts. If you feel something needs to be brought to a Resource Advisor (or Cultural Specialist), go through your appropriate chain of command to make the notification.
- The Six Rivers, Klamath and Shasta-Trinity National Forests, as well as the Great Basin Team 5, have been working very closely with cultural specialists from the three main tribes in this area (the Hoopa, Karuk and Yurok) so please help us to maintain and foster these good relationships.
- The area in which the fire is burning is a very sacred place to these tribal cultures so please work with us utilizing MIST tactics to protect cultural and wilderness values. Snags can also have cultural significance so please limit those to what is needed for safety and to contain the movement of the fire.




#### **Assignment Definition**

An assignment is defined as the time period (days) between the first full operational period at the first incident or reporting location on the original resource order and the last day worked prior to commencement of return travel to the home unit.

#### Length of Assignment

Standard assignment length is 14 days, exclusive of travel from and to home unit, with possible extensions identified below. Time spent in staging and preposition status counts toward the 14-day limit, regardless of pay status, for all personnel, including incident management teams.

#### 14-Day Scenario



#### **Assignment Extension**

Prior to assigning incident personnel to back-to-back assignments, their health, readiness, and capability must be considered. The health and safety of incident personnel and resources will not be compromised under any circumstance.

#### Assignments may be extended when:

- Life and property are imminently threatened.
- Suppression objectives are close to being met.
- A military battalion is assigned.
- Replacement resources are unavailable, or have not yet arrived.

Upon completion of the standard 14-day assignment, an extension of up to an additional 14 days may be allowed (for a total of up to 30 days, inclusive of mandatory days off, and exclusive of travel).


#### 21-Day Scenario

A 21-day assignment is exclusive of travel from and to home unit. Time spent in



staging and preposition status counts toward the 21-day assignment, regardless of pay status, for all personnel, including incident management teams.

#### 30-Day Scenario



An assignment longer than 22 days is exclusive of travel from and to home unit. Time spent in staging and preposition status counts toward the assignment, regardless of pay status, for all personnel, including Incident Management Teams. For an assignment exceeding 21 days, two mandatory days off will be provided prior to the 22nd day of the assignment.

Contracts, Incident Blanket Purchase Agreements (I-BPA), and Emergency Equipment Rental Agreements (EERA) should be reviewed for appropriate pay requirements and length of assignment. If the contract, I-BPA, or EERA do not address this, the incident Finance/Administration Section Chief or the procurement official should be consulted as to whether compensation for a day off is appropriate.

ANYTHING THAT DOESN'T FIT INTO ONE OF THESE 3 SCENARIOS MUST BE REVIEWED BY DEMOB UNIT LEADER PRIOR TO ASSIGNMENT EXTENSTION FORM COMPLETION. LOCAL UNIT RESOURCES REFERENCE CHPT 07 PG 166.

Submit requests for all incident replacements on a 213, General Message:

- Separate cache from non-cache items on separate 213's.
- Include explanation for lost or damaged items.
- Include DIVS signature on the 213 to verify the item(s) has/have been lost or damaged and support the circumstances surrounding it.
- For stolen items, contact your supervisor and Security Manager as soon as practical.

#### **FOR CACHE ITEMS**

Requesting resource is **NOT** being demobed and requested items **ARE** available in Supply:

- Supply will attempt to fill request and note on the 213.
- Replace 1 for 1 for NFES issued items.

Requesting resource is **NOT** being demobed and requested items are **NOT** available in Supply:

- The Supply Unit will place an order for the requested items through the regular cache order process on the incident. The order will be shipped to the incident and replacement will take place at the Supply Unit and noted on the 213.
- Replace 1 for 1 for NFES issued items.

Requesting resource IS being demobed and requested CACHE items are NOT in stock in Supply:

- Along with the 213, complete an OF-315, Incident Replacement Requisition for cache items only and take to SPUL for review and approval. Include the requesting resources email on the form so the Resource Order can be emailed to the requesting resource.
- The SPUL will issue S#'s pending receipt and verification of proper documentation for cache items.

#### **NON-CACHE ITEMS**

Non-cache items include any items not available through the National Cache System.

Lost, damaged, or destroyed government non-cache property shall be reported to the appropriate DIVS or higher level overhead within 24 hours of occurrence. The requesting resource shall complete an ICS-213 and OF-289, Property loss and Damage Report—Fire Suppression, available at Orleans and Willow Creek Supply Unit. Include the following:

- All witnesses shall document the facts and circumstances of the loss or damage on the OF-289. Explanations shall be detailed and indicate how the incident caused the damage.
- The requesting resource will deliver the completed ICS-213 and OF-289 to the Comp/Claims Unit Leader. The COMP will make the determination based on the documentation presented.
- Approval for replacement is the responsibility of the incident agency and may be delegated to the Incident Commander/FSC2.
- If the replacement request is approved, the replacement cost will be limited to cache equivalent value. The requesting resource will complete the OF-315 for the Supply Unit.
- Items that do not have a like-item in the cache will be reviewed and approved at the discretion of the FSC2 or IBA, as delegated by the Agency Administrator,




