WEATHER DISCUSSION: Marine influence will combine with a little air-mass cooling to bring RH levels up across all elevations of the fire area today. However today will be the last relatively cool and moist day before a trend upward in temps begins on Saturday. A thunderstorm threat returns to NW CA on Sunday and Monday. A more prominent easterly wind direction will begin Saturday but only during the night and morning hours and last for a few days...although the easterly wind speeds will remain light.

Today (Friday 0600-1800):

Weather: Sunny.
Max Temperature: Below 4,000 ft: 84-89. Above 4,000 ft: 72-76.
Min Humidity: Below 4,000 feet: 30-40%.
Above 4,000 feet and higher: 35 - 45%.

20 Foot Winds:

Lower/Mid Slopes: Downslope or east 1-3 mph until 1300, then upslope or west northwest 4-7 mph.
Upper Slopes/Ridges: East 1-4 until 1400, then West and Southwest 4-6 mph with Gusts to 10 mph until sunset.

LAL: 1 Chance of Wetting Rain (0.10"): 0%

Stability: Low valley inversions lift 1200. Mid-level inversion will hold in place through at least 1500 hrs.
Afternoon Mixing Height: Valleys: 3,500 feet AGL. Ridges: 5,000 feet AGL.
Smoke Transport: Toward the East and Northeast.

Tonight (1800-0600):

Weather: Clear...continued cool and moist.
Low Temperatures: Valley-Midslope: 55-60°; Upper slope/Ridge: 60-64°.
Max Humidity: Below 4000 feet: 75-85%.
Above 4000 feet: 60 to 70%.

20 Foot Winds:

Lower/Mid Slopes: West and Northwest 3-5 mph until 2300 hrs, then northeast or downslope 1-4 mph.
Ridges: East and Northeast 4-6 mph through sunrise.

LAL: 1 CWR: (0.10"): 0%

Inversion: Moderate inversion/thermal belt centered around 4,500 ft MSL.

Saturday: Sunny..warmer and drier. Max Temps: 82-87°. Minimum RH: 23-27%. Afternoon Winds - Lower Slopes: West and Northwest or upslope 5 mph. Upper slopes/Ridges: West at 6 mph Gust to 12 mph.


Sunday and Monday Outlook: Mostly Cloudy...A 25% chance of thunderstorms late Sunday with less of a chance on Monday. Increasing temperatures and lower RH's. Temperatures in the upper 80s. Afternoon humidity 19-25%. West winds 3-6 mph with gusts around 12 mph. East winds at night and early morning to 5 mph.

WEATHER: Sunny

MAX TEMP: Below: 4000 ft 84-89° Above: 4000 ft 72-76° **MIN RH:** 30-45%

20 FOOT WINDS: East 1-4 mph until 1400, then West and Southwest 4-6 mph with Gust to 10 mph until sunset.

CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN (≥ 0.10 "): 0%

FUELS: The major fuel types, found in and around the fire area are timber litter and shrubs.

Ignition Receptiveness: ERC levels are at the 90th percentile. Probability of Ignition 60% Night 22%.

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures :1 hour – 6% day, 10 hour– 6%, 100 hour–7%, and 1000 hour– 7%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Expect a low to moderate risk burn environment due to moderate seasonal temperatures, slightly higher RH and critically low 1000 hr. fuel moistures. Indices may not meet local thresholds but potential for large fire growth exist. Once the inversion lifts (approx. 1500) anticipate and increase in fire behavior over the incident especially where open line exist. Uphill runs and spotting will be an issue where slope and wind align. RH over 45-50% will diminish fire behavior to creeping and smoldering.

SPECIFIC

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Division A: Low activity consisting of creeping and smoldering.

Division D: No fire activity in Div. Delta. Firing operations (if needed) will be aided with forecasted West winds later in the afternoon (after 1400).

Prospect spot (interior): Will continue to move with active fire behavior. Expect to see movement East along China Creek and adjacent drainages following the Butler fire burn scar.

Division K: Firing operations will be successful once RH drop below 45-50% and East wind surface.

Division M / N: Low activity expected.

Division O: Watch for fire mid-slope to align and make upslope runs. Highly active fire behavior could be produced with significant spotting potential.

Division U: The main fire continues to move south across the slopes. Watch for mid slope alignment and uphill runs. There is potential for very active fire behavior

Division P, R: No Fire Behavior

Division W, Y: low activity mostly creeping and smoldering.

Night Division: Once humidities increase, expect to see fire activity drop off to smoldering.

AIR OPERATIONS

Low level inversions will lift at approx. 1200, mid-level at approx. 1500.

Carbon Monoxide, Particulate Matter, and Smoke Exposure

General signs and symptoms and associated levels of CO exposure:

- **Low** - No appreciable effect, except shortness of breath on vigorous exertion; possible tightness across the forehead; dilation of cutaneous (along skin) blood vessels.
- **Moderate** - Shortness of breath on moderate exertion; occasional headache with throbbing in the temples, Headache; irritable; easily fatigued; judgment disturbed; possible dizziness; dimness of vision.
- **High** - Headache, confusion; collapse; fainting on exertion Unconsciousness; intermittent convulsion; respiratory failure, death if exposure is long continued.

Identify hazards and mitigations prior to operational shifts. As fire increases, anticipate an increase of Carbon Monoxide, Particulate Matter, and Smoke in areas that previously were clear of smoke and reducing firefighter smoke exposure.

Signs and Symptoms of Heat Illness

Heat Stress: Hot, sweaty skin, headaches, cramps; may be relieved by rest, cooling, and hydration.

Heat Related Emergencies: Hot dry skin that has stopped sweating. Headaches, nausea, dizziness and vomiting. Left untreated, unconsciousness and death will occur. (Condition may also be referred to as moderate to severe heat exhaustion and or heat stroke).

Treatment – Rapidly cool individual’s body by eliminating clothing, pouring water over them, especially the head and upper torso. **Start the IWI Notifications.** Monitor the victim and provide whatever medical support necessary. Placing ice around the neck, groin and armpits can help speed the cool down



Red Salmon Complex COVID-19 Expectations

- All incident personnel will follow all local, State and CDC guidelines for COVID-19.
- **As you travel through the highway 96 corridor to the Fire, the Hoopa and Yurok reservations are closed so please do not stop in Hoopa or Weitchpec.**
- Use the COVID-19 Daily Screening Tool, provided in the IAP, to monitor self and module.
- Utilize Module-as-one concepts to reduce the risk of transmitting the novel Coronavirus. This limits “close contacts” to those within the module. A “close contact” is defined as face to face contact for at least 15 minutes or in the same enclosed space for 2 hours.
- **Social Distancing.** Maintain a minimum of 6’ physical distancing from those outside of *your module-as-one*.
- **Face Coverings.** Face coverings are required to be worn, in the appropriate manner covering nose and mouth, when at ICP and Camps. Outside of camps, all incident personnel will wear a face covering when social distancing is not possible with those outside your module-as-one.
- **Wash your hands.** Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing you nose, coughing or sneezing. If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Do not use hand sanitizers containing methanol or 1-propanol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect vehicles and equipment. Disinfect all high-touch surfaces frequently, such as radios, phones, door handles, etc.

- Escort individual or "module-as-one" to isolation area. Separate the symptomatic personnel.
- Isolation support personnel should begin documentation.
- Notify Line Medics or MEDL if at ICP or Orleans Base Camp.
- COVID Safety will coordinate with SRF Forest IMO.
- Have individual or "module-as-one" fill out WF Employee Contact Assessment Sheet.
- Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information (PII) or Personal Health Information (PHI).

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES—FINANCE SECTION

WORK REST CYCLE

IT IS NATIONAL DIRECTION TO MEET 2 TO 1 WORK/REST RATIO (1 hour of sleep/rest for every 2 hours of work). Every effort shall be made to manage work hours so you don't exceed the maximum of 16 hrs. Work hours exceeding 16 hours shall be approved by your supervisor in advance, and a justification/mitigation form completed for review by Section Chief & approved by IC. It is each person's responsibility to comply with this direction to manage for fatigue and safety.

OPERATIONAL SHIFTS

Pay status for assigned overhead and crews on the fireline will not start prior to the posted briefing time and will terminate on arrival back in camp (except for debriefing—additional hours may be accrued by those required to attend debriefing). Supervisors will be allowed ½ hour prior to briefing and after return to camp to ready crew and equipment.

DUTY STATUS

Division/Group supervisors and Unit Leaders are responsible for establishing on and off duty status. The objective is a 2 to 1 work/rest ratio. Personnel will normally work, travel, and/or be placed on ORDERED standby 8 to 16 hours per day and be off duty 8 hours or more (breaks count towards 8 hrs.). Off duty time will be in a non-pay status. Each federal employee is guaranteed at least 8 hours of pay status each 24-hour period (midnight to midnight) unless it is the first or last day of an assignment or stated otherwise in a contract or agreement.

PERSONNEL/EQUIPMENT TIME REPORTING

Personnel time will be reported to the Time Unit daily or every other day once they are signed by the next level supervisor. Situations entitling you to HAZARD PAY are to be noted in remarks (i.e. HP=Uncontrolled Fireline, hovering hookups, low level flights, etc.)

Private Contracted Equipment time must be tracked on a Shift Ticket daily or every other day and hours on shift noted even if it is a daily rate. When swapping out operators you need to notify Finance as well as changing from single to double shift and vice versa.

Supervisor's - If you are responsible for daily tracking of equipment or personnel, please ensure you understand the agreement, and follow the rules provided in this document. Do not sign documents for resources you did not manage unless you have knowledge of their assignment hours.

MEAL AND OTHER WORK BREAKS

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 © and 29 CFR 785.19(a)). Until the fire is controlled, personnel on the fireline MAY BE compensated for meal periods if all of the following conditions are met: 1) The fire is not controlled and 2) The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, and 3) The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and documented on CTR. For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of a fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift of eight hours or more. In those situations where personnel cannot be relieved from work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be counted as time worked, which will be compensable. If breaks are NOT able to be taken, CTR should have a statement in remarks explaining the situation.

FINANCE MESSAGE

Thank you for submitting your times in the safest way possible. The options for submitting your CTR's and Shift Tickets are:

- **Electronic fillable PDF CTR/Shift Ticket.** QR codes to fillable forms are included below. If you do not have QR capabilities, Finance can email you forms directly. Make sure the forms are signed by the supervisor before submitting to Finance. In order to use fillable forms, you must have some version of Adobe Acrobat downloaded on your device, or you can send to your email and fill out.
- **Hard copy CTR/Shift Ticket.** You may fill out a hard copy CTR/Shift Ticket, snap a picture and email to Finance OR you may turn in your actual hard copy as usual. If you send in a picture, please make sure it is legible and includes the supervisor's signature at the bottom. The phone numbers listed below are hard line phones, so texting does not work.

PLEASE:

- Crews need to include a manifest with their first CTR.
- Try to submit your times at least every other day. There is a drop box at Orleans Base Camp in Check-in to drop off your time.
- Write your email on your CTR
- Hazard pay justifications are required on your CTR's in comments section. "H=Hazard" is not enough.

WHEN YOU ARE CLOSE TO DEMOB:

- Give Finance a "Courtesy Call" to make sure all your documents have been received.
- Follow the demob plan instructions based on your travel route home. This will determine whether your demob will be in-person or remote.
- Submit all time documentation (including travel home) ahead of demob.
- Send only one representative per resource to finance tent.
- Abide by scheduled demob time or call finance for an unscheduled demob.

FIRE REPLACEMENT PROCEDURES

START THIS PROCESS AT LEAST 48 HOURS PRIOR TO DEMOB

Submit requests for all incident replacements on a 213, General Message:

- Separate cache from non-cache items on separate 213's!
- Include explanation for lost or damaged items.
- Include DIVS signature on the 213 to verify the item(s) has/have been lost or damaged and support the circumstances surrounding it.
- For stolen items, contact your supervisor and Security Manager as soon as practical.

FOR CACHE ITEMS

Requesting Resource is NOT Being Demobed and Requested Items ARE Available In Supply:

- R&D shall fill request and note on the 213.

Requesting Resource is NOT Being Demobed and Requested Items are NOT Available In Supply.

- The Supply Unit will place an order for the requested items through the regular cache order process on the incident. The order will be shipped to the incident and replacement will take place at the Supply Unit and noted on the 213.

Requesting Resource IS Being Demobed and Requested CACHE Items are NOT In Stock In Supply:

- Along with the 213, complete an *OF-315, Incident Replacement Requisition for cache items only* and take to SPUL for review and approval. Include the requesting resources' email on the form so the Resource Order can be emailed to the Requesting Resource.
- The SPUL will issue S#s pending receipt and verification of proper documentation for cache items.

NON-CACHE Items – This is the Important Part!!!

Non-Cache items include any item not available through the National Cache System.

Lost, damage, or destroyed government non-cache property shall be reported to the appropriate DIVS or higher-level overhead within 24 hours of occurrence. The requesting resource shall complete an ICS-213 and *OF-289, Property Loss and Damage Report – Fire Suppression*, available at Orleans Base Camp Supply Unit. Include the following:

- All witnesses shall document the facts and circumstances of the loss or damage on the OF-289. Explanations shall be detailed and indicate how the incident caused the damage.
- The requesting resource will email the completed ICS-213 and OF-289 to the Comp/Claims Unit Leader at scott_parsons@firenet.gov. The COMP will make a determination based upon the documentation presented.
- Approval for replacement is the responsibility of the incident agency and may be delegated to the Incident Management Team for IC and FSC.
- If the replacement request is approved, the replacement cost will be limited to cache equivalent value. The requesting resource will complete OF-315 for the Supply Unit.
- Items that do not have a like-item in the cache will be reviewed and approved at the discretion of the FSC or Incident Business Advisor, as delegated by the Agency Administrator.



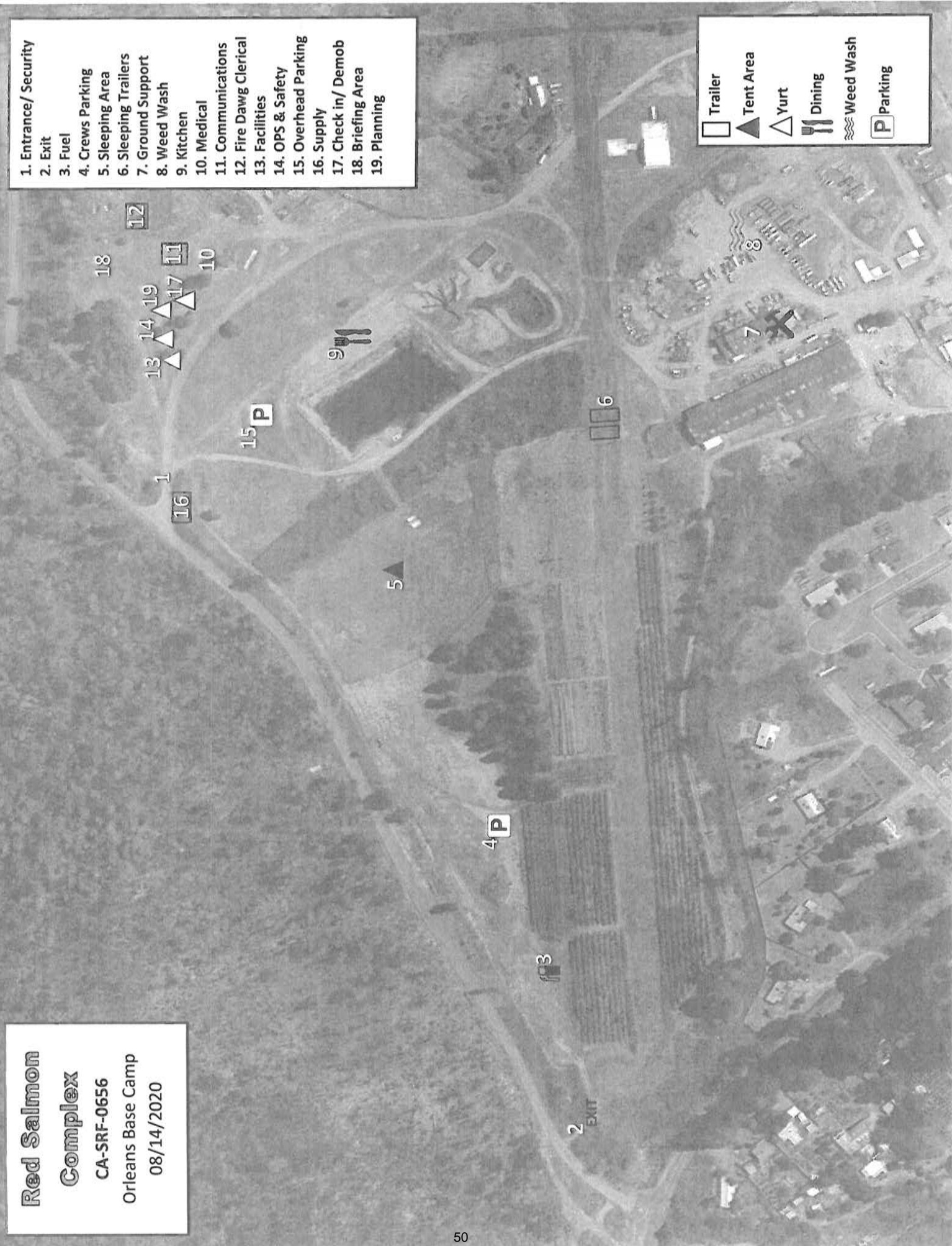

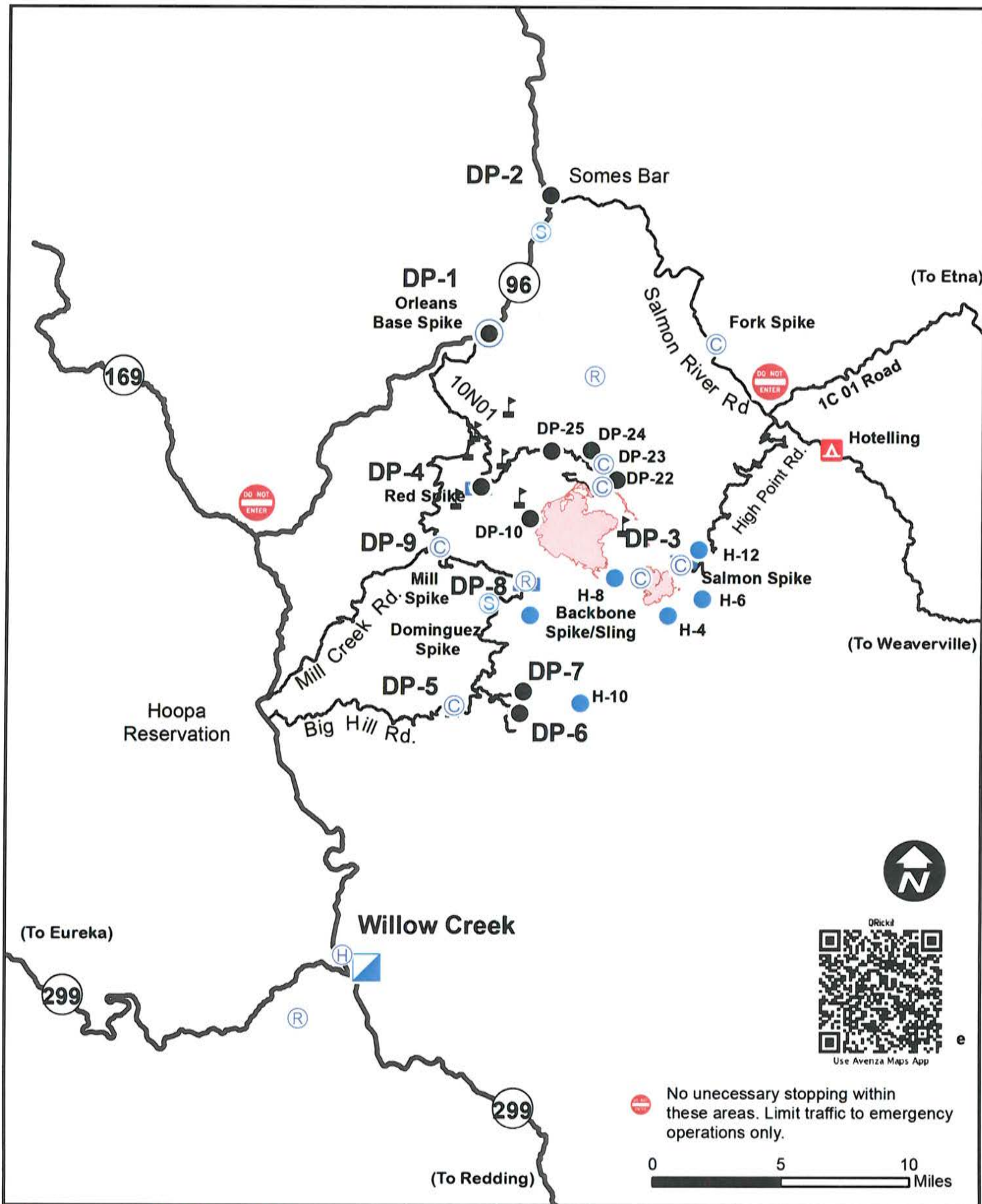
