

Still warm and dry with a moderately unstable atmosphere

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Modest instability will remain today as weak upper low pressure begins to drift over the fire area. Temperatures will cool by about 5 degrees, however, a drier air mass will arrive thus only bringing a slight increase in humidity. Afternoon ridge winds will be a little gustier than we've recently seen. The inversion over the fire will strengthen as compared to yesterday but it's still feasible that prolonged intense heat will push a column through the cap. Low pressure over the area will keep temperatures relatively cooler but still with moderate humidity recovery periods at best for the middle and upper slopes. Warming trend returns Friday with increasing mixing heights again.

Today (0600-1800):

Weather: Sunny. Areas of smoke hanging low over the fire, mainly in the late morning and early afternoon.

High Temperatures: Red Fire: 81-90°; Salmon Fire: 79-83°; Jones Point Fire: 94-99°.

Humidity: Red Fire 22-26%; Salmon 30-34%; near 1300 hrs, then slowly rising through 1800 hrs.
Jones Point Fire: 19-23% near 1600 hrs, then slowly rising.

20 Foot Winds:

Lower/Mid Slopes: Variable 0-3 mph until 1000, then terrain driven 4-8 mph.

Upper Slopes: Northeast 4-7 mph until 1200, becoming West 8-10 mph with gusts to 16 mph.

Jones Point Fire: Variable 0-3 mph until 1300 hrs then up river (NNW) 8-12 mph with gusts around 20 mph.

Stability: Low valley inversions lift around 1100 hrs. Mid-level inversion will rise near 1400 hrs.

Afternoon Mixing Height: Valleys: 6,000 feet AGL. Ridges: 7,000 feet AGL.

Tonight (1800-0600):

Weather: Clear. Smoke settling in area drainages.

Low Temperatures: Red Fire: 60-66°; Salmon Fire: 56-60° Jones Point Fire: 59-62°.

Humidity: Red Fire: Peaking at 37-42% from 1900 hrs to 0300 hrs, then falling to 29-33% by 0600 hrs.

Salmon Fire: Peaking at 40-45% from 1900 hrs to 0300 hrs, then falling to 30-35% by 0600 hrs.

Jones Point: Steadily increasing and peaking at 85-90% by 0600 hrs.

20 Foot Winds:

Lower/Mid Slopes: Variable 3-5 mph until 2300 hrs, then drainage 4-6 mph.

Ridges: West 8-10 mph with gusts to 16 mph until 2200 hrs, then Northeast 5-8 mph.

Jones Point: up river (NNW) 8-12 mph with gusts around 20 mph until 2000 hrs, then drainage 0-4 mph.

Inversion: Strong inversion/thermal belt centered around 5,000 ft MSL. Weak inversion around 1,500 feet.

Wednesday: Passing high clouds. Areas of smoke. Max Temps: 76-86°, except 92° at Jones Point. Afternoon RH: Red Fire 25-30%, Salmon Fire 27-32%. Jones Point 22-25%. Afternoon Winds - Lower Slopes: Variable/Terrain Driven. Upper slopes: West 8-10 mph with gusts around 16 mph.

Thursday and Friday Outlook: Thursday is similar to Wednesday then a warming trend begins Friday. Afternoon humidity 22-35%. Continued moderate humidity recovery largely staying below 50% overnight.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

Fire activity will moderate slightly today as temperatures decrease and fuels moisten modestly. There is still potential for the inversion to break leading to an increase fire activity similar to what we saw on Monday. Rapid rates of spread with torching, crowning and long-distance spotting should be expected if a convection column develops. Otherwise expect to see surface fire spread with upslope runs when in alignment with slope.

Spotting distance: up to .3 of a mile.

Probability of ignition: Near 70%.

Predicted ERC: 85th percentile Timber ROS: 5-11 ch/hr. Timber FL: 4-8 feet

Predicted BI: 82nd percentile Brush ROS: 1-3 ch/hr. Brush FL: 1-3 feet

SPECIFIC

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Branch I (Div A, D, K): Surface fire spread, single and group torching, running and spotting should be expected again today. In division A and D heavy fuels along the line within the burnout operation will continue to consume and have potential to spot over the line.

Branch V (Salmon): Heavy fuels continue to consume along with interior pockets. Spotting potential from these fuels remains high. Otherwise spread should be limited to creeping and smoldering. Those resources working along Backbone Ridge need to keep aware of the potential for the Red fire to move southeast towards operations on the ridge.

Branch VI (Jones Point): The fire is burning in a timber litter fuel type on steep slopes. Fire behavior will be limited to creeping and smoldering as heavy fuels burn out along the line and interior pockets consume.

Branch VII (Div R, U, W, Y): Divisions U, W, Y should expect uphill runs from the fire in Red Cap drainage after 1300. Torching, long range spotting and short crown runs will occur as the fire moves up the steep slopes towards Packsaddle ridge. All other division, no fire behavior is expected.

Night Shift (All Branches): Fire activity will moderate through the night with creeping and smoldering expected. More active burning will take place within the thermal belt between 4500-5500 ft. Take advantage of higher humidity to conduct burn out operations as conditions allow.

AIR OPERATIONS

Low level inversion lifts around 1000 hrs. Smoke will impact aviation on all Branches.

SAFETY

Both green and dead trees have been weakened by the fire and can fall unexpectedly, use caution when working these areas.

MINIMUM IMPACT SUPPRESSION TECHNIQUES (MIST)

Firefighter and public safety is always the first priority in any suppression action, including operations in wilderness. Use of MIST provides guidelines for preserving wilderness areas for present and future generations.

When evaluating fire management actions, the potential degradation of wilderness character should be considered before, and given significantly more weight than, economic efficiency and convenience. Unless human life or private property is immediately threatened, only those actions that preserve wilderness character and/or have localized, short-term adverse impacts to wilderness character should be implemented.

FIRELINE CONSTRUCTION

- Take advantage of natural barriers wherever possible.
- Use cold-trail and/or wet line when appropriate.
- If the decision is made to construct line, use only the width and depth necessary for halting the fire spread. Minimize ground disturbance.
- Minimize bucking and cutting of trees to establish fire line; build line around logs when feasible and effective.
- Limb vegetation only to the extent necessary to stop fire spread.
- Avoid cutting live trees whenever possible.
- As an alternative to felling, consider allowing ignited trees and snags to burn themselves out. Ensure adequate safety measures are communicated to those affected by this decision.
- If burning trees or snags pose a serious threat of spreading firebrands, extinguish the fire with water and/or dirt wherever possible.

AIR OPERATIONS

- Limit retardant or foam use, use water instead. If retardant and foam is appropriate, avoid drops near water.

HELISPOTS

- Minimize the number of helispots in wilderness. Use alternate sites outside wilderness when possible or consider using pack strings (mules).
- Use natural openings as much as possible.
- Size the helispots for the appropriate size helicopter. Consider long line remote hook operations instead of helispots for logistical support.

SPIKE CAMPS

- Minimize the use of spike camps in wilderness. If spike camps are needed, use existing camp sites where available.
- Avoid camping in wet meadows, along streams or on lake shores. Resource Advisors can help identify suitable sites.
- Layout camp carefully from the start, identify areas for cooking, sleeping, washing, latrines and water supplies.
- In small camps individuals can use "cat hole" method

of disposal (6"-8" hole) short term. In larger camps locate community latrines 300' from water.

- Designate wash areas away from streams, and provide for gray water disposal. Do not use soap, shampoo, or other chemicals near waterways.
- Store food away from camp and so that it is not accessible to wildlife.
- Store garbage so that it is not accessible to wildlife, and remove it as frequently as possible.
- Use stoves to cook when possible. Minimize the use of campfires, and use either a pit or mound ring fire with dead or downed small diameter firewood. Do not build rock ring campfires. An old fire shelter placed under the coals helps protect the soil.
- Limit travel ways within, to, and from camp.

PERSONAL SPIKE CAMP CONDUCT

- Select durable sites for tents.
- Do not clear vegetation or dig trenches to create bedding sites.
- Pack out all garbage, including candy wrappers, cigarette butts, and flagging.
- Carry water and bathe away from lakes and streams.
- Do not use nails in trees or limb trees for bedding.
- Evaluate the short and long term impacts of your decisions.

REPAIR

- Remove signs, flagging, garbage, and equipment used during fire suppression.
- Restore disturbed areas.
- Scarify the top 2-4" of soil in heavily compacted areas and scatter needles, twigs, branches, over the area.
- Rehabilitate newly established trails on slopes <6%, water bar trails created on steeper slopes.
- Scatter cut material and camouflage cut surfaces with dirt.
- Do not use non-native materials, avoid introducing invasive species.
