WEATHER DISCUSSION: There is chance for outflow winds from showers and thunderstorms that develop east of the fire through the early evening hours. Otherwise, quieter conditions are expected tonight under partly cloudy skies with slightly cooler temperatures. Barring any outflow winds from shower activity the east this evening, expect a light southwest wind overnight along ridgetops and exposed slopes and valleys. RH recoveries will be lower as a drier air mass moves into the area.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Sky Weather: Partly cloudy with early evening isolated showers and thunderstorms primarily east of US-395.

Temp: 50-55; Max RH: 50-60%. 20' valley winds downslope 2-5 after 2000. 20' ridge winds southwest 3-7 Weak inversion developing late with poor RH recovery on mid slopes.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

Nighttime humidity recoveries and lighter winds should decrease fire behavior tonight. Evening west winds and late night through early morning southwest winds will be favorable for Divisions A and Z tonight.

Observed fire behavior on portions of Division A exhibited extreme fire behavior the late evenings and nights of both 8/16 and 8/17. Portions of the fire may exhibit similar conditions as predicted for tonight especially if outflow gusts from thunderstorms occur. This is a heads up for fire behavior potential tonight.

ERC levels on Dog Valley RAWS station are just above the 90th percentile. The values are forecasted to climb close to 97th percentile by the end of the week.

The primary carrier on the Loyalton Fire is the grass and shrub fuels. The timber stands and stringers with understory brush will continue to burn in the evening and through the night.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

Grass/ Shrub fuel types: Anticipated rates of spread are 20 to 25 chains per hour when downslope winds align with topography. Flame lengths 10-15' with spotting up to 1/10 of a mile. Probability of ignition dropping to 20%. Early morning hours anticipate much lower rates of spread and lower flame lengths due to the RH recovery.

Timber with Mahogany/ Bitter Brush: Anticipate low to moderate rates of spread with spotting. 10hr fuels will not react to overnight humidity and are expected to carry fire where present through the night. Timbered areas are receptive and have potential for single to group tree torching.

During any outflow wind occurrence, expect fire-line intensity and rates of spread to increase.
