5. GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES <u>Incident Strategy</u> <p>The suppression strategy for the River Complex will utilize a combination of direct, indirect and point protection. A key element of the plan is flexibility and the ability to apply the right resource, to the right task, at the right time, for the right duration. It is understood fireline will be constructed only where it is feasible and safe to do so. It is the responsibility of the Incident Commander and their Staff to work with the Agency Administrator to ensure the plan is regularly reviewed and updated.</p> <u>Leader's Expectations</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide the highest level of customer services to all involved with or impacted by the River Complex. River Complex Fire Weather Forecast

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The biggest weather change today will be winds gradually shifting to a more southwest and even pure south direction by late this afternoon and overnight. As this occurs wind speeds will also gradually increase...even during the overnight hours as an unseasonably strong upper low approaches the California coast. Temperatures will remain fairly hot across the lower elevations in Branch II warming to around 90 degrees with humidity values from 19-29%. Any morning smoke should mix out by late morning to midday with blue skies along the western edge of the fire in Branch I. This will provide good mixing and ventilation but the airmass aloft remains fairly stable with a Haines Index of 4 this afternoon. Be aware that the smoke transport winds aloft at around 10,000 feet will be from a southwest to south direction and strong...suggesting some longer range spotting potential should the fire get active.

WEATHER FORECAST Sunday:

WEATHER: Smoke through midday...otherwise mostly sunny. Seasonably warm and dry.

HIGH TEMPERATURES: 85-90 lower portions of Branch I along Denny Road. Upper 70s at 5000 feet.

HUMIDITY: 19-28% areas that are smoke free...28-38% smoke and shaded areas.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Light South through 1200...then Southwest 5-10 mph gusts 12-15 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light til 1100 then afternoon upcanyon 3-7 mph gusts 10-12 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 4 during the afternoon. **INVERSION:** Moderate inversion through midday.

WEATHER FORECAST For Sunday Night:

WEATHER: Smoke settling over the fire. Breezy at times over the ridgelines above 4500 feet.

TEMPERATURES: 55-60

HUMIDITY: Moderate to good recovery. 80% lower slopes and 50-60% upper slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Becoming Southerly 5-10 mph some gusts to 15 mph possible at night
Be aware of strong winds aloft that could mix down if fire is active.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Southerly 3-6 mph some gusts to 10 mph possible along Denny Road.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Strong upper low approaching the area will bring some potentially strong South to Southeast winds...especially over the ridges on Monday into Tuesday. Gusts 25-30 mph possible with lighter winds mid/lower slopes. Cooler with highs 72-82. RH values 35-45% daytime and good recovery at night. System will be slow moving through Weds with a gradual cooling and moistening trend but wetting rains are not forecast at this time.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Expect smoky conditions early then possible clearing by 1300. With skies clear the fire will become active. Group tree torching will occur with the potential for short crown runs on aligned slopes and drainages. The fires remain fuels & topography driven. The primary fire spread is from heavier fuels burning log to log and rolling material. Falling snags will challenge containment lines and will increase the potential for fire spread over barriers that would normally hold the fire. Rates of spread will be from 1 to 8 chains per hour with flame lengths 1-7 feet in the timber.

Primary spotting will be from rolling material. Fire backing into the narrow drainages has the potential to hook and make intense uphill runs.

Expect the fires to remain active until 0200hrs.

Specific:

Branch I: The fire will remain as surface fire burning in the heavier fuels. Spotting will be from rollout. Fire progression will continue to the Northeast. Expect mainly backing fire. Intense runs probable in aligned drainages. Roll out and falling snags will challenge established line.

Winds will be favorable for ay burnout operations parallel to the 7N26 Rd. If fire crosses the 7N04 Rd. it will be backing fire. Rolling material will challenge the 7N04.

Branch II: Expect mainly backing and flanking fire in heavy fuels and surface litter. Single and group tree torching will continue. Spot fires will continue from rolling material. NE flank of the Groves will continue flanking the ridges above Denny.

Fire to the SE around Big Mt. will continue to spread laterally along the drainages.

The fire is not expected to impact crews working on structure prep along the 299 corridor or in Denny.

Air Operations: Inversion should clear by 1300 to allow for air ops.

Safety:

Steep country means rolling material, watch for spot fires below you!

Fatigue:

- By now, the road systems are starting to become familiar to you.
- Maintain your safe driving distance and continue to reduce your speed in unsafe areas. Watch out for complacency.
- Some hazard tree indicators are trees burning for a long period of time, high risk trees with rot and shallow roots, numerous downed trees in the work area, dead broken or burning tops and limbs. Accumulation of downed limbs, trees, absence of needles, bark or limbs, and leaning or hung up trees.
- The following are fatigue producers: Carbon monoxide, dehydration, heat stress and poor fitness level. All can reduce resistance to fatigue and being awake for 24 hrs affects your decision making capability just like .10 blood alcohol content. Continue to monitor yourself and crews.

Looking at medical emergencies that have had bad outcomes several contributing factors come into play. Many of these by themselves are not a problem when several of these occur together the effect can be tragic.

Being in an unfamiliar area with poor access not having the normal medical response available requires a different approach require far greater situational awareness to mitigate these issues.

We have provided you with a check list of things to do before and during a medical evacuation. Please review these cards. Cut the cards out and laminate them for your line gear. Remember Pre-Incident Planning, good situational awareness and size up when you arrive at the work site, having a plan for your Div. regarding (EMT) **E**quipment, **M**anpower, and **T**ransportation may save a life. If you wait to plan it may be too late.

If you have any questions or concerns please come by the Medical Unit and speak with the on duty MEDL.

Medical Pre-Incident Planning:

- Identify EMTs and Equipment imbedded in suppression recourses.
- Review the Incident or Forest Emergency reporting procedures
- Review the Incident's assigned Medical resources and their location. (note radio call sign)
- Assure that all assigned supervisors have reviewed and understand the Medical Plan. (if none is available develop a quick plan before engaging)

Arriving at work site:

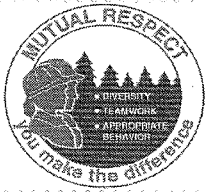
- Assess access and egress for medical ground units.
- Assure that all resources can clearly articulate their location. (update as they move)
- GPS potential Drop Points or Landing Zones.
- Note weather changes and check on availability of air resources.
- Pre-Position medical supplies

During Response to a Medical Emergency:

- Contact Communications and declare a **MEDICAL EMERGENCY!!**
- Identify the Unit needing help and their location
- Insure that LECS are maintained.
- Obtain patient info and severity.
- Develop a resource list
 - o Initial care
 - o Sustained care
 - o Extrication/evacuation
- Report the Emergency and request anticipated resources needs
- Put two plans in place and start both plans clearly identifying the primary and backup plan to resources assigned.

During the Evacuation (every 15 min.)

- Reassess the treatment and the patient response (Are they getting better?) Do you have the right level of care?
- Assess the evacuation plans progress and adjust as needed.
- Assure that additional personnel are available for relief.
- Up-date Comm/Disp of the progress of the rescue.
