

5. GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES <u>Incident Strategy</u> <p>The suppression strategy for the River Complex will utilize a combination of direct, indirect and point protection. A key element of the plan is flexibility and the ability to apply the right resource, to the right task, at the right time, for the right duration. It is understood fireline will be constructed only where it is feasible and safe to do so. It is the responsibility of the Incident Commander and their Staff to work with the Agency Administrator to ensure the plan is regularly reviewed and updated.</p> <u>Leader's Expectations</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide the highest level of customer services to all involved with or impacted by the River Complex. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Personal interactions both internal and external to the incident management organization • Personal safety and the safety of others • An incident-within-an-incident <u>Management Objectives:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety by ensuring LCES is evaluated and by utilizing sound Risk Management Principles. • Maintain and build on Cooperator, Partner, and Stakeholder relationships. • Suppress the Complex at the smallest size, while not exposing firefighters or aircraft to unnecessary risk. • In Wilderness, favor indirect attack by using natural barriers, topography and watercourses, and low impact, "light hand" suppression techniques. <u>Control Objectives:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Protect life and property in the communities of Denny, Bell Flat, Hoboken, Dailey, and Trinity from the impacts of unwanted wildfire. • Scout western side of Complex for access and implement suppression actions to minimize spread of fire toward the Community of Hoopa. • Develop and implement structure defense plan for the Trinity Village/Hawkins Bar area.

...RED FLAG WARNING IN EFFECT THROUGH TUESDAY...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: An unseasonably strong upper low situated along the coast will set up a situation in which some gusty southerly winds will develop over the ridges and just above the River Complex. The inversion may hold strong through midday with smoke in the drainages. However as winds increase aloft the cap should come off and allow the strong winds aloft to mix down with gusts to 25 mph along the ridgelines at 5000 feet. Lower and mid slopes will still be dominated by canyon winds...trending southwesterly during the afternoon. The low off the coast will introduce some instability and Haines values increase to 6 during the main burn window from 3 pm through 8 pm this evening. Temperatures may trend a few degrees cooler with slightly higher RH but winds and instability will trump those trends. Night shift should be aware that strong winds will continue through the night and may even increase along the ridges...helping to offset any cooling or moistening.

WEATHER FORECAST Monday:

WEATHER: Smoke through midday...otherwise partly cloudy. Becoming breezy on the ridges.

HIGH TEMPERATURES: 84-89 lower portions of Branch I along Denny Road. 72-77 at 5000 feet.

HUMIDITY: 25-35% lower elevations in the inversion. 30-40% above 4000 feet.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Light Southwest through 1100...then Southwest 8-15 mph gusts 20-25 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light til 1100 then afternoon upcanyon 4-8 mph gusts 11-14 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 6 very unstable after 3 pm. **INVERSION:** Moderate inversion through midday.

WEATHER FORECAST For Monday Night:

WEATHER: Smoke settling over the fire. Windy at times over the ridgelines above 4500 feet.

TEMPERATURES: 53-57

HUMIDITY: Moderate to good recovery. 80% lower slopes and 50-60% upper slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southerly 8-15 mph some gusts to 25 mph overnight.

Be aware of strong winds aloft that could mix down if fire is active.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Southerly 3-7 mph some gusts to 10-12 mph possible along Denny Road.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Red Flag Warning continues at least through Tuesday afternoon for strong southerly winds with ridgetop gusts 25-30 mph. A slight cooling trend Tuesday into Wednesday. Highs 70 at 5000 feet to 80 along New River near Denny Rd. RH values 35-45% daytime and good recovery at nite. No wetting rain forecast.

WEATHER SUMMARY: RED FLAG WARNING for Strong Southerly Winds

Winds: Day, Ridges SW 8-15mph Gusts 25mph. Drainages Upslope 3-5mph.

Min. RH: Day 25-35% Night 50-60%

Temperatures: Day 80-90. Night 55-60

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Today there is a strong potential for extreme fire behavior. With forecasted winds and a high Haines our fire could become plume dominated.. Group tree torching will occur with crown runs on aligned slopes and drainages with continuous timber. The fires will be wind & topography driven.. Falling snags will challenge containment lines and will increase the potential for fire spread over barriers that would normally hold the fire. Rates of spread will be from 1 to 16 chains per hour with flame lengths 1-11 feet in the timber.

Primary spotting will be from rolling material and lofting brands.

Expect the fires to remain active all night as the winds are not expected to deminish.

Specific:

Branch I: Expect surface fire burning in the heavier fuels. If winds surface fire will transition into the crowns. Expect group tree torching. Fire progression will continue to the Northeast. Expect mainly active backing fire along the west flank. Intense runs probable in aligned drainages. Roll out and falling snags will challenge established line.

If fire crosses the 7N04 Rd. it will be backing fire. Rolling material will challenge the 7N04.

Branch II: Expect flanking fire in heavy fuels and surface litter. Single and group tree torching will continue. Spot fires will continue from rolling material. NE flank of the Groves will continue flanking the ridges above Denny.

Fire to the SE around Big Mt. will continue to spread laterally along the drainages.

The fire is not expected to impact crews working on structure prep along the 299 corridor or in Denny. The fire that has crossed Quimby Creek has the potential to impact the Miller Ranch.

Air Operations: Inversion should clear by 1200 to allow for air ops.

Safety:

Pay attention to thresholds for extreme fire behavior: Winds over 10mph, High Haines, Steep Slopes and trees torching. Review IRPG Pages 3-4.

- Communicate hazards to the operator


WATER AND RETARDANT DROPS (i.r.p.g. pg.56-59)

- Get clear of snags in the target area



TOPIC:

Smoke Exposure Signs, Symptoms, and Treatment



Wildfires across the state are creating hazardous and smoky conditions. Smoke from fires in our region may begin to drift into communities and rapidly degrade air quality.

Some wildland firefighters, especially those on hand crews, are routinely exposed to smoke-filled air for hours each day when assigned to a large fire, sometimes for 14 days. At other times they can be stationed in a smoky environment 24 hours a day for weeks at a time when inversions trap smoke. This frequently occurs in northwestern California, for example on the Six Rivers, Klamath, and Shasta-Trinity National Forests. In those cases even non-firefighters working in administrative positions at the Incident Base have been adversely affected by breathing contaminated air. Short-term exposure (hours or days), typical of wildland fire events, can aggravate lung disease, leading to asthma attacks and acute bronchitis. These effects can also increase the susceptibility to respiratory infections. Healthy adults may not suffer serious effects from short-term exposures, although temporary minor irritation may occur when particulate matter levels are elevated.

Understanding symptoms are key to protecting yourself from further exposure. Once you start to feel symptoms, take action to remove yourself from a situation in which the air might be polluted by wildfire smoke. The onset of symptoms can appear as late as 24 to 48 hours after exposure. Keep your eye out for these symptoms:

- Asthma attack
- Coughing (sometimes without mucus)
- Greater-than-usual Fatigue
- Chest pain/discomfort
- Headache
- Irritated sinuses
- More than a normal amount of trouble breathing
- Rapid heartbeat
- Runny nose
- Scratchy throat
- Stinging eyes
- Wheezing and shortness of breath



Be Aware of the Symptoms of Increasing Respiratory Distress during and after exposure

Treatment

- Nasal irrigation with warm saline solution in order to clear out excess mucus and particulates
- Use an eyewash to rinse irritated eyes.

The Medical unit recommends that you watch your crew and check to see if they have asthma, bronchitis, COPD, or any respiratory issues. Report any significant symptoms to the Medical Unit.
