5. GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES <u>Incident Strategy</u> <p>The suppression strategy for the River Complex will utilize a combination of direct, indirect and point protection. A key element of the plan is flexibility and the ability to apply the right resource, to the right task, at the right time, for the right duration. It is understood fireline will be constructed only where it is feasible and safe to do so. It is the responsibility of the Incident Commander and their Staff to work with the Agency Administrator to ensure the plan is regularly reviewed and updated.</p> <u>Leader's Expectations</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide the highest level of customer services to all involved with or impacted by the River Complex. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Personal interactions both internal and external to the incident management organization • Personal safety and the safety of others • An incident-within-an-incident <u>Management Objectives:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety by ensuring LCES is evaluated and by utilizing sound Risk Management Principles. • Maintain and build on Cooperator, Partner, and Stakeholder relationships. • Suppress the Complex at the smallest size, while not exposing firefighters or aircraft to unnecessary risk. • In Wilderness, favor indirect attack by using natural barriers, topography and watercourses, and low impact, "light hand" suppression techniques. <u>Control Objectives:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Protect life and property in the communities of Denny, Bell Flat, Hoboken, Dailey, and Trinity from the impacts of unwanted wildfire. • Scout western side of Complex for access and implement suppression actions to minimize spread of fire toward the Community of Hoopa. • Develop and implement structure defense plan for the Trinity Village/Hawkins Bar area.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A low off the coast will keep winds blowing from a southerly direction over the ridge lines again today. Lower elevations will continue to be dominated by valley and diurnally driven winds. Expect more sunshine and better mixing today with any inversions lifting by midday. Temperature and humidity will trend seasonably cool with the low off the coast. Highs at 5000 feet only around 70 with 80s the lower portions of Branch II along Denny Road. During the peak burn period from 3 to 8 pm the afternoon Haines Index will be 5...meaning there is unstable air aloft. Be aware that should any columns build the winds aloft at around 10,000 feet are strong and from the southeast. The night shift should expect good humidity recovery with light winds below the inversion overnight. Ridge winds remain south/southeast.

WEATHER FORECAST Wednesday:

WEATHER: Smoke through midday...otherwise partly cloudy. Locally breezy on the ridges.

HIGH TEMPERATURES: 81-86 lower portions of Branch I along Denny Road. 68-74 at 5000 feet.

HUMIDITY: 30-40% lower elevations in the inversion. 40-50% above 4000 feet.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Light Southerly through 1100...then South/Southeast 5-10 mph gusts 15 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light til 1100 then afternoon upcanyon 3-6 mph gusts 10-12 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 5...unstable after 3 pm. **INVERSION:** Light to moderate inversion through midday.

WEATHER FORECAST For Wednesday Night:

WEATHER: Smoke settling over the fire. Breezy on the ridges until sunset.

TEMPERATURES: 53-57

HUMIDITY: Moderate to good recovery. 80% lower slopes and 55-65% upper slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southerly 5-10 mph some gusts to 15 mph in the evening.

Be aware of strong winds aloft that could mix down if fire is active.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Evening down-canyons 1-4 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Upper low will still impact our weather on Thursday with Southerly ridge winds and light canyon winds. Seasonable temps and humidity. Low ejects inland over southern Oregon Thursday Night into Friday. This will lead to a warming and drying trend Friday through the weekend. Highs 80-90. RH 25-35%. Lite North winds along the ridges with diurnal drainage winds.

FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Clearing clouds and moderate winds will increase the chances that we will clear the smoke out over the fire around 1200hrs. When the inversion clears out, sun will heat the fuels increasing the chances for torching trees. The fire will be fuels & topography driven. Falling snags will challenge containment lines and will increase the potential for fire spread over barriers that would normally hold the fire. Rates of spread will be from 1 to 6 chains per hour with flame lengths 1-7 feet in the timber. Most of the active areas of the fire are in a backing alignment.

Primary spotting will be from rolling material.

Expect the fires to remain active most of the night until the inversion sets in.

Specific:

Branch I: Expect surface fire burning in the heavier fuels. Single and group tree torching will occur with sun on the fuels. Fire progression will continue to the Northeast. Expect mainly active backing fire along the west flank. Intense runs possible in aligned drainages. Roll out and falling snags will challenge established line.

If fire crosses the 7N04 Rd. it will be backing fire. Rolling material will challenge the 7N04.

Branch II: Expect flanking fire in heavy fuels and surface litter. Single and group tree torching will continue. Spot fires will continue from rolling material. NE flank of the fire will continue flanking the ridges above Denny.

Fire to the SE around Big Mt. will continue to spread laterally along the drainages and on the slope below Iron Mt..

The fire is not expected to impact crews working on structure prep along the 299 corridor or in Denny. The fire that has crossed Quimby Creek has the potential to impact the Miller Ranch as active backing fire.

Air Operations: Inversion should clear by 1200 to allow for air ops.

Safety:

Rolling material means fire can ignite below you. Post lookouts that can see you the fire and below.

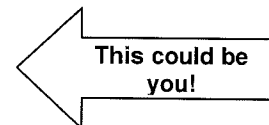


3. SAFETY ZONES AND ESCAPE ROUTES
NOT IDENTIFIED

Some possible mitigations could include:

- Heat/dehydration issues are avoidable, push fluids along with food, take care of your people, monitor fluid intake, allow breaks if overly exhausted. Stage extra water in your vehicle for use during the day.
- The 18 Situations were developed for a reason, they are part of our basic firefighting practices, review those that fit with your assignment prior to engagement. Use these tools to your advantage!
- Prior to engagement review the Medical Plan and know how to manage medical emergencies, including placement of Line EMT's and the REM Crews.
- Situational awareness- Know the fire location when going indirect and where your safety zone is! Have your lookouts in place and ensure they know the trigger points when to evacuate the crew.
- Vehicle operators use low ratio gears on steep descents.

What Happens When You Get It:

Once urushiol touches the skin, it begins to penetrate in minutes. It is completely bound to the skin within 8 hours. Urushiol is the oil inside the plant that caused the allergic reaction to 70% of the population

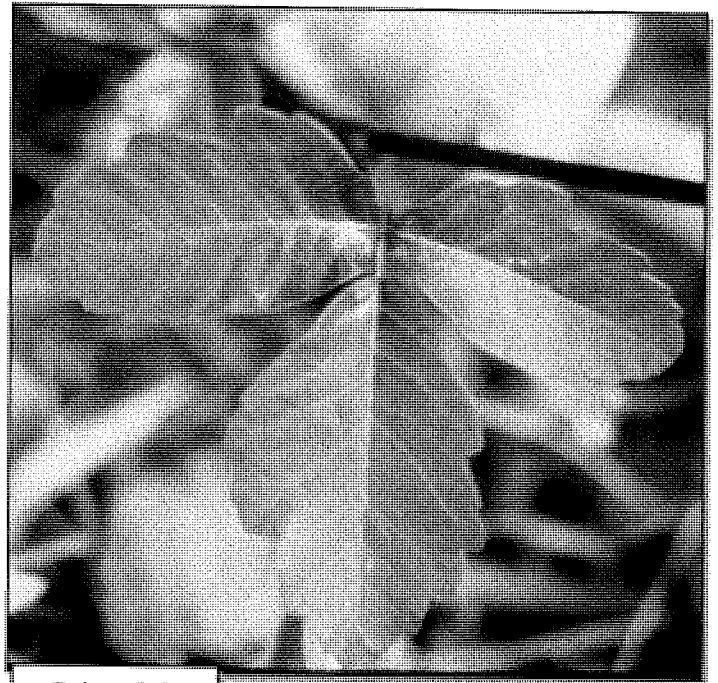
You may develop any or all of the following:

- Red Rash
- Blisters
- Swelling

What To Do When You Get It:

Stop the symptoms before they start. If you know you've been exposed, cleanse the area immediately with plain soap and water to remove urushiol before it has a chance to bind to the skin. To remove the oil from your skin, scrub the area for several minutes, but do not break the skin, then rinse with cool water for several minutes. Once the area has been cleansed you may need to apply a topic ointment or further medical treatment.

Be sure to wash all clothing that you were wearing at time of exposure. Wash any bedding that you may have slept on as you can spread the oil from your skin or clothing to other parts of your body or to others.

- Tecnu
 - ecnu Extreme
 - Zanfel
 - Poison Oak Soap
 - Cortaid Poison Cleanser
 - Dawn Dishwashing Liquid
- Oral medications that provide relief include:
- Benadryl (causes drowsiness)
 - Claritin
 - Famotidine

Topical treatments for the rash include:

- RhuliGel
- Cortaid
- Hydrocortisone Cream or Gel
- Calamine Lotion
- Caladryl Lotion
- Benadryl Cream
- ICP Clinic (Provided by Medical Clinic)
- Exam and if indicated:
- Oral Medication (Prednisone)
- Antihistamines
- Injected Medication (Depo-Medrol)

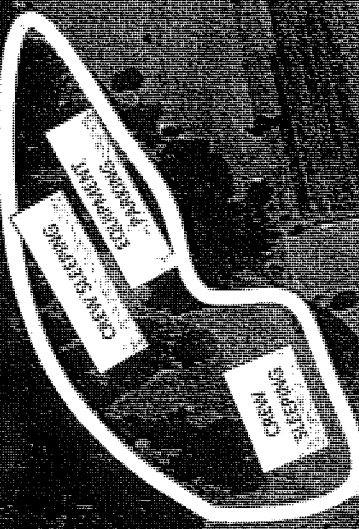
