<b>5. GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES</b>  <u><b>Incident Strategy</b></u> <p>The suppression strategy for the River Complex will utilize a combination of direct, indirect and point protection. A key element of the plan is flexibility and the ability to apply the right resource, to the right task, at the right time, for the right duration. It is understood fireline will be constructed only where it is feasible and safe to do so. It is the responsibility of the Incident Commander and their Staff to work with the Agency Administrator to ensure the plan is regularly reviewed and updated.</p> <u><b>Leader's Expectations</b></u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide the highest level of customer services to all involved with or impacted by the River Complex. # River Complex Fire Weather Forecast

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Upper low off the coast will finally begin to eject and move inland over Oregon by tonight into early Friday. This will keep southeast ridgetop winds blowing this morning...however by this afternoon the onshore flow should start to return with winds switching to southwest by late this afternoon and evening. Smoke from nearby fires will likely linger in the drainages for much of the day with switching winds keeping smoke along Denny Road and Div Q through the afternoon hours. Temperatures may cool a few degrees and humidity trend a few points higher today as the low begins to pass over the region. During the peak burn period from 3 to 8 pm the Haines is forecast to be a low 5 with some unstable air associated with the upper low overhead. By this evening valley and general winds will have completely shifted to an onshore or westerly direction. Expect good humidity recovery overnight with generally light winds under the inversion and the Divisions along Denny Rd.

**WEATHER FORECAST Thursday:**

**WEATHER:** Heavy smoke through early afternoon...otherwise mostly sunny. Locally breezy on the ridges.

**HIGH TEMPERATURES:** 82-87 lower portions of Branch I along Denny Road. 68-74 at 5000 feet.

**HUMIDITY:** 25-35% lower elevations below 2000 feet. 30-40% smoky areas above 4000 feet.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** Southeast 5-10 mph gusts 15 mph...turning West to Southwest by 1400.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Light til 1100 then afternoon up-canyon 3-6 mph gusts 10 mph.

**HAINES INDEX:** 5...unstable after 3 pm. **INVERSION:** Moderate to strong inversion through 1500.

**WEATHER FORECAST For Thursday Night:**

**WEATHER:** Smoke settling over the fire.

**TEMPERATURES:** 53-57

**HUMIDITY:** Moderate to good recovery. 80% lower slopes Branch II and 55-65% upper slopes Branch I.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** West 4-8 mph in the evening become 5 mph or less overnight.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Evening down-canyon 1-4 mph.

**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Friday will be the start of a transition as high pressure builds signaling the start of a warming and drying trend. Winds will be light north to northeast with diurnal winds dominating most of the drainages. Highs warming 80-90 Friday then mid 80s to mid 90s and near 100 over the weekend. RH values 18-28% with only moderate recovery at night. Smoke will be hard to mix out most days with strong inversion setting up over the area under strong high pressure.

## FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

### GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Clearing clouds and moderate winds will increase the chances that we will clear the smoke out over the fire around 1200hrs. When the inversion clears out, sun will heat the fuels increasing fire activity, expect torching trees. The fire will be fuels & topography driven. Falling snags will challenge containment lines and will increase the potential for fire spread over barriers that would normally hold the fire. Rates of spread will be from 1 to 6 chains per hour with flame lengths 1-7 feet in the timber. Most of the active areas of the fire are in a backing alignment.

Primary spotting will be from rolling material.

Expect the fires to remain active most of the night until the inversion sets in.

### Specific:

**Branch I:** Expect surface fire burning in the heavier fuels. Single and group tree torching will occur interior with sun on the fuels. Fire progression will continue to the Northwest and towards the Branch break. Roll out and falling snags will challenge established line.

If fire crosses the 7N04 Rd. it will be backing fire. Rolling material will challenge the 7N04.

**Branch II:** Expect flanking fire in heavy fuels and surface litter. Single and group tree torching will continue. Spot fires will continue from rolling material. NE flank of the fire will continue flanking the ridges above Denny.

Fire to the SE. will continue to spread laterally along the drainages and on the slope below Iron Mt.. The fire will continue to impact the 504 Rd and progress towards the wilderness boundary.

The fire is not expected to impact crews working on structure prep along the 299 corridor or in Denny. The fire is burning north of the Miller Ranch and will continue to actively back towards the ranches. The fire east of New River will impact Hoboken as backing fire during the burn period. New River should act as a barrier further north towards Denny

Expect the fire to remain active until midnight.

Air Operations: Inversion should clear by 1200 to allow for air ops.

Safety: **Rolling material means fire can ignite below you. Post lookouts that can see you the fire and below.**

- Preparing for changes-team transition


## Some possible mitigation could include:

- Risk –vs- Gain, is the assignment safe and worth the exposure
- Maintain situational awareness. Think LCES, if one piece is missing, should you engage?
- Listen closely to the IMET and FBA.
- As fire behavior picks up, let your Division Supervisor or Branch Director know.
- Drink lots of water with some other electrolyte drink, we are working at higher elevations, and dehydration can cloud your decision making or put you down.
- Transfer of command is coming. Make sure you know who your new leader is. Take extra time to ensure that everyone has the same understanding of leader's intent and work instructions.
- This incident is very dynamic; be prepared for changes. What you planned may not work. Have "Plan B" thought out and be proactive.

How much water should I drink? When should I start drinking? How do I know when I've drunk enough? How do I know if I'm overheated?

Dehydration is the lack of proper replacement of the fluids lost due to sweating while exercising or working. Signs and symptoms can include increasing thirst, dry mouth, weakness, dizziness, dark concentrated urine, and decrease in urine output. In the heat, this can also aid in leading to heat cramps, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke. These are serious medical emergencies!

As you work hard in the heat throughout the day, you need to take in more and more fluid to replenish the loss from sweating. Along with the loss of fluids comes the loss of electrolytes (salts). Electrolytes are essential for the proper function of muscles. Therefore, adding a sports drink along with water aids in replenishing crucial electrolytes to the body. We recommend a ratio of three bottles of water to one bottle of sports drink. Without adding these electrolytes and carbohydrates the body is not able to properly process the water being taken in. This can lead to electrolyte imbalance, commonly referred to as "water intoxication."

As a general rule, the average person requires a minimum of 4 glasses (32oz.) of water a day. This should be doubled or tripled for active people and especially in hot weather. Pre-hydration should begin the night before, continuing to hydrate throughout the day. You should be urinating "Clear and Often." When you are thirsty, you are already getting behind in fluid replacement, and if you stop sweating and have hot dry skin you are overheated and in danger of heat stroke.

**Rhabdomyolysis (often called rhabdo) is a medical condition resulting from the breakdown of damaged muscle tissue. Due to prolonged physical exertion, wildland firefighters are at increased risk for rhabdomyolysis. If not recognized and treated early, rhabdomyolysis can cause permanent disability and may be fatal.**

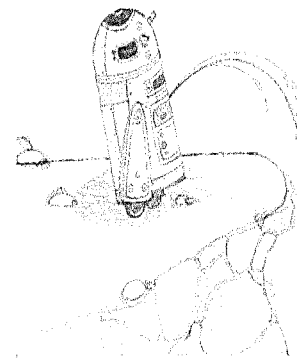
What can increase your risk for rhabdomyolysis?

- Over-the-counter medications such as decongestants and antihistamines
- Dietary supplements such as creatine
- Some weight loss products
- Cholesterol lowering drugs known as statins
- Excessive caffeine intake

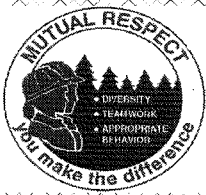
What are the signs and symptoms of rhabdomyolysis?

- Muscle aches or pains out of proportion for the amount of exercise done
- Muscle cramping
- Tea-colored or cola-colored urine

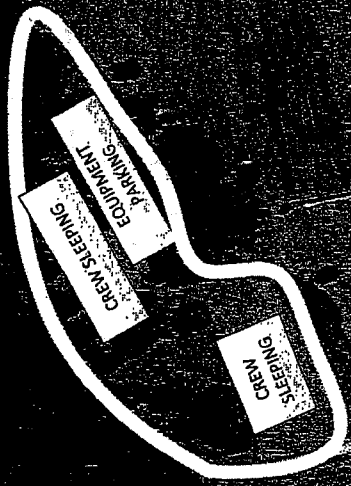
