# CIIMT4 INCIDENT EXPECTATIONS

#### **CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR**

This team is committed to "ZERO TOLERANCE" of careless, illegal, inappropriate and unsafe actions.

Alcohol and/or illegal drugs are **NOT** allowed within the incident environment or while actively assigned to the incident. Local Law Enforcement Officials will be called to deal with any suspected illegal activities. Each employee has the responsibility to be ready, willing, and able to perform the duties for which they are qualified.

<u>Sexual Harassment</u> inappropriate actions or comments will not be tolerated. Everyone is expected to act in a professional manner. It is your responsibility to stop inappropriate actions or comments immediately upon becoming aware of such. Sexual Harassment must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist or Incident Commander. When outside of your designated sleeping area, you are required to wear at least a shirt, appropriate shorts, and shoes or sandals. If you need clarification of these expectations contact the Human Resource Specialist or IC.

#### SAFETY

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

#### **EMPHASIS AREAS**

Work Rest Cycles - The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

<u>Position Qualifications</u>- Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any position. Operational contract equipment must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training. If not, this training must be received prior to going to work on the fire line.

<u>Engagement/Disengagement</u> - The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

<u>Debriefing</u> - All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or significant incidents that occurred during the operational period.

<u>Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets</u> - It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be <u>reviewed and signed</u> by the next level supervisor. A finance related, "Rules of Engagement" document may be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

<u>Injuries/Claims</u> - Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. <u>Contract claims</u> will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

<u>Social Media</u> - It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.

#### **WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

....Hot and Dry Weather Continues with a Haines of 5 Today....

A hot and dry airmass continues across the River Complex today with increased instability helping to produce a Haines index of 5. Given the good mixing and breezy ridgetop winds, expect any inversion to lift by 1200 on the midslopes and ridgetops. The breezy south to southwest flow will keep most of the southern portion of the fire smoke free again today. Wind will be highly depended upon terrain, aspect, elevation, and canopy with gusts between 15 and 20 mph expected in the exposed midslope and ridgetops after 1400. Much lighter winds are expected in the protected valleys and under the canopy.

#### WEATHER FORECAST Tuesday:

**WEATHER:** Areas of smoke, otherwise mostly sunny.

**HIGH TEMPERATURES:** 88-96 valleys. 78-84 ridgetops.

**HUMIDITY:** 18-25% elevations below 2000 feet. 25-32% above 4000 feet.

#### 20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – Southeast winds 8 to 14 mph, becoming south 10 to 15 with a few gusts up to 20 mph possible after 1400.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light until 1200 then up-canyon 4-8mph with gusts to 13 mph after 1400.

HAINES INDEX: 5. INVERSION: Lifting by 1200 midslope and ridgetops and partially lifting in the

deeper valleys near Denny.

#### **WEATHER FORECAST For Tuesday Night:**

**WEATHER:** Areas of smoke, otherwise mostly clear.

**TEMPERATURES:** 55 to 61 valleys, 57 to 63 ridgetops and midslopes.

**HUMIDITY:** Ridgetop and midslope relative humidity 28 to 38%. 80 to 90% lower slopes/valleys.

#### 20 FT WINDS:

**RIDGETOP** - Southwest winds 5 to 10 mph with a few gusts up to 15 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Evening down-canyon winds 3 to 6 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST: ....Cooler temperatures with increase chances for showers by late Friday.... Wednesday and Thursday will continue to be warm and dry with increasing southwest ridgetop winds. Some clouds ahead of a developing trough may produce slightly cooler and higher relative humidities on Thursday, with breezy southwest ridgetop winds. Our next weather system will impact the region with cooler temperatures, more clouds, higher relative humidities and a chance of showers late Friday into Saturday.

#### **WEATHER SUMMARY:**

Winds: Day, Ridges SE 8-14 mph, then south 10-15 gusting to 20 mph, after 1200.

Slopes/Valley: Light until 1200, then up-canyon 4-8 mph with gust to 12 mph after 1500

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR FORECAST

#### **GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR:**

Smoke will be hang over the fire for most of the morning, late morning and afternoon south winds will clear out the smoke. A stronger thermal belt will set up mid-slope at night creating an environment that could produce greater fire activity. Primary fire spread will be where fuels & topography align which could lead to single/group tree torching or more in the higher elevations. Rates of spread will be from 1 to 9 chains per hour with flame lengths 1-9 feet in the timber. Rates of spread will increase on steeper slopes due to roll-out. Most of the active areas of the fire are in a backing alignment outside the wilderness. Falling snags and rollout will challenge containment lines and will increase the potential for fire spread over barriers that would normally hold the fire.

#### Specific:

Branch I: DIV L may experience some surface fire burning in the heavier fuels and interior pockets will continue to burnout. Minimal fire movement in the old Corral Burn has been observed.

Branch II&III: Denny Group can expect burnout of unburned fuels, both on the line and internally, as a result of firing operations. Visibility will be limited due to smoke. In Division T, expect the fire to continue to impact the 5N04 Rd, especially from rollout in steep terrain. Expect flanking fire in heavy fuels and surface litter. Single and group tree torching may be observed. In DIV Q, Fire will continue to spread laterally. In the SE portion of the fire, expect active backing and flanking fire. Single/group tree torching may be observed and rollout will continue to challenge lines. Short range spotting (less than ½ mile) is also possible. Expect greater rates of spread in the grass found in the old burns.

<u>Air Operations:</u> Smoke will probably hold in the valley in the morning and start to clear by 1100. Smoke from the South Complex my hinder air operations on the southern end of the fire.

<u>Safety</u>: Maintain situation awareness with the uncertainty of atmospheric stability. **Strong** inversions will limit visibility until early afternoon.

- **Drought conditions:** Use all of the assessment tools; Heads up for fire behavior; Ensure **LCES** is in place; Take extra time to ensure it is safe to engage! Use extra caution all the time.
- All trees can be dangerous. They don't have to be leaning, dead, burned, or gnarly. Perform adequate assessments, minimize exposure and risk around all trees.
- **Line Construction:** Use all of the safety protocols concerning line construction. Watch the spacing, footing, and other firefighters below.

#### "SEE IT......SAY IT!"

If you see a hazard or a dangerous situation developing, tell your supervisor and those around you.

# **Make a Safety Difference**

- As a supervisor, provide constant and relentless oversight.
- Stay focused on the task at hand, all the time!
- Come up with a safer way to perform a risky assignment.
- Discuss the near miss.
- Never tolerate "Hey, watch this!"
- Discuss the effects of fatigue, and mitigate the effects of fatigue.
- While in the fire zone, wear your hardhat when you leave the vehicle.
- Have a purpose in what you do.
- Don't trust other drivers!

#### Take Five at Two!

- Around 2:00 in the afternoon is a good time to stop and reassess your situation.
- Take 5 minutes to determine what conditions have changed since you started work.
- Are your original objectives still valid considering current weather and fire behavior?
- How should you adjust your tactics to accomplish the original leader's intent for the day?
- Are your objectives still commensurate with values at risk, including the safety of you and the resources you are responsible for?




