


These are the hottest and driest conditions we've had since this fire began. Northwest winds will increase late in the afternoon. If we you get into clear air, the atmosphere will be unstable.

High pressure remains over the region with very hot, dry, and moderately unstable conditions. Smoke cover may inhibit instability, but any clear air will be unstable. Poor recoveries will occur in the thermal belts overnight.

## INPUTS

Very hot and dry conditions expected for today. Northwest ridgetop winds will increase late in the afternoon. Max Temps: 89-99 clear 79-89 if smokey. Min RH 9-15% clear 15-20% smokey. Ridgetop winds becoming northwest 4-8 mph after 1600. Slope/Valley upslope/upcanyon 4-8 mph

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

Dry air associated with high pressure has moved into the fire area and is responsible for poor overnight recoveries above 3500 feet. Fuels above 3500 feet will be available to burn earlier today if the smoke mixes out today. Smoke and haze over the fire will limit solar heating which will limit instability and fire behavior under the smoke. Fire behavior under smokey skies will be limited to slow surface spread with occasional torching. The *eastern flank* of the fire may be clear in the morning due to the overnight east-southeasterly winds. Smoke will probably pour into the southerly and easterly portions of the fire as the winds switch *from* the north and the northwest. On aspects with clear skies, expect active fire behavior in the afternoon. Clear to mostly clear skies will produce high instability. Single and group tree torching will be common during the afternoon. Active crown fire will require alignment of fuel, slope and wind. Drought mortality has added a significant amount of heavy dead fuel loading to the timber fuels. These heavy dead fuels are contributing to higher fire intensity. Running crown fire and group torching in timber fuels have produced spotting out to 1/2 mile. The same alignment of wind and slope in a clear, unstable environment will also produce active running fire in the mixed brush fuels commonly found in the old burn scars. Rate of spread up to 12 ch/hr has been observed in the brush on 45% slopes.

Combinations of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior:

**20' winds** over 5 mph, **RH** less than 20%, **Temp** over 73°, **ERC** above 62, **10HR** less than 5

**Probability of Ignition:** 90% unshaded 60-80% shaded

#### SPECIFIC:

**Blue and Barker Fires:** Minimal fire activity is anticipated.

**Branch IV:** N-NW winds and up valley winds will align with Tule creek drainage in Division O. This wind alignment could push smoke out of the drainage to the south and southeast that would result in fire behavior to steadily increasing in the afternoon at the slopover. The Division will probably be smoked in by around 1600.

**Branch II:** Smoke from north and northwest portion of the fire will likely cover Division N. Residual fire from burnout operations will move under the smoke today from last nights burnout operation. Division Q/T could have clear skies in the morning and fire will continue to back eastward.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:


Smoke inversion will continue to limit air operations on most portions of the fire today.

## SAFETY

As the smoke inversion lifts, expect a gradual increase in fire behavior.

## SAFETY MESSAGE

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INCIDENT: Fork Complex

DATE: August 17, 2015

**Rolling rocks/Snags/hazardous limbs/burned green trees**—all pose a serious threat. Assess conditions before going to work on or near the fire line. Flag and avoid trees or areas that cannot be mitigated. Keep at least a  $2 \frac{1}{2}$  tree length buffer between yourself and falling operations. Keep your spacing and avoid taking breaks in slide-prone areas. Hazard tree safety must be a part of your crew briefing.

**FIRING OPERATIONS SAFETY:** Conduct a thorough briefing for all personnel involved (inside rear cover IRPG). All personnel must be fully qualified for their assignments. Limit those present to only personnel necessary for conducting the operation. Trainees must have qualified trainers. Utilize Risk Mgmt. Process (IRPG p. 1) for implementing the plan. Required PPE to be worn by all personnel involved. LCES must be in place prior to implementing burning operations (IRPG p. 7).

**Roads** Remember Hwy 3 and Hwy 36 in our fire area are open to the public. Expect more traffic, folks are back to work its; Monday.

- ✓ **REMEMBER** Heat stress, dehydration, carbon monoxide can all add to your fatigue level.
- ✓ **Watch for hazardous attitudes**—complacency (just another routine fire), resigned (we can't make a difference), impulsive (do something even if it is wrong), invincible (it can't happen to us), and group think (afraid to speak-up or disagree). We could also add cocky, know-it-all, and "we have always done it that way"...



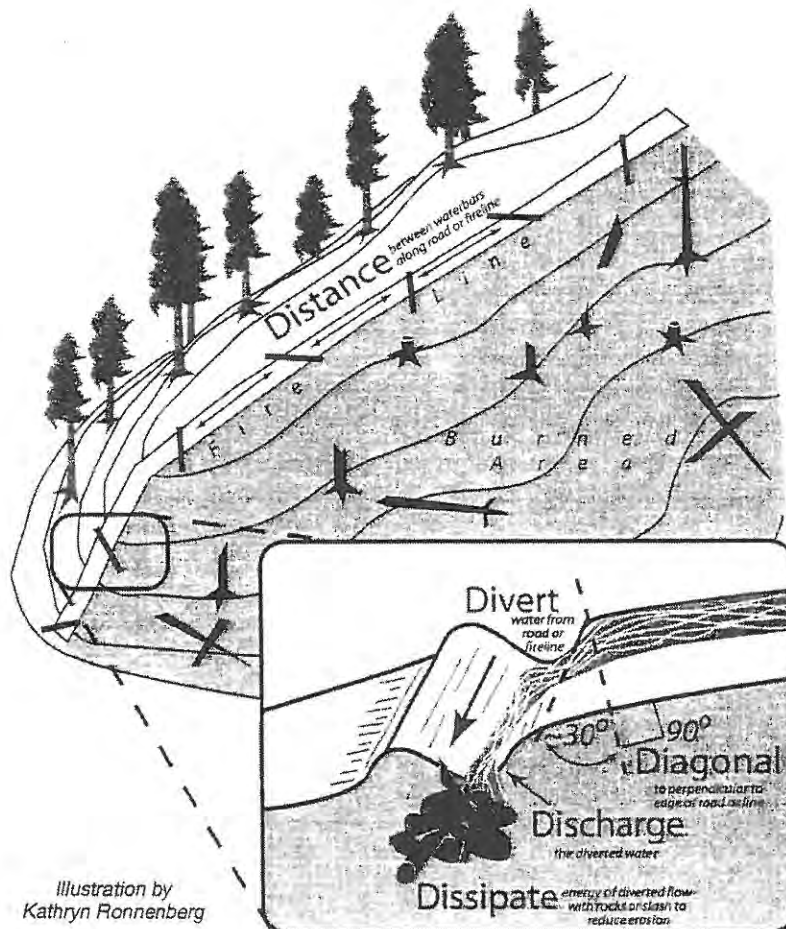
## Effective Waterbars

When locating and building water bars, place them the right **distance** apart, at a **diagonal** to the fireline, so that they **divert**, then **discharge**, then **dissipate** the energy of the flowing water. Be sure to make them deep enough so they'll be durable, and that soil does **not block** the water bar outlet.

### Recommended spacing for waterbars on firelines.

Fireline slope %	Maximum Distance Apart (feet)
1-5	200
6-20	125
21-40	60
41-60	40
>60	25

*Waterbars should be at least 2 pulaski (4-6 inches) widths wide and 12-24 inches high for handlines.*

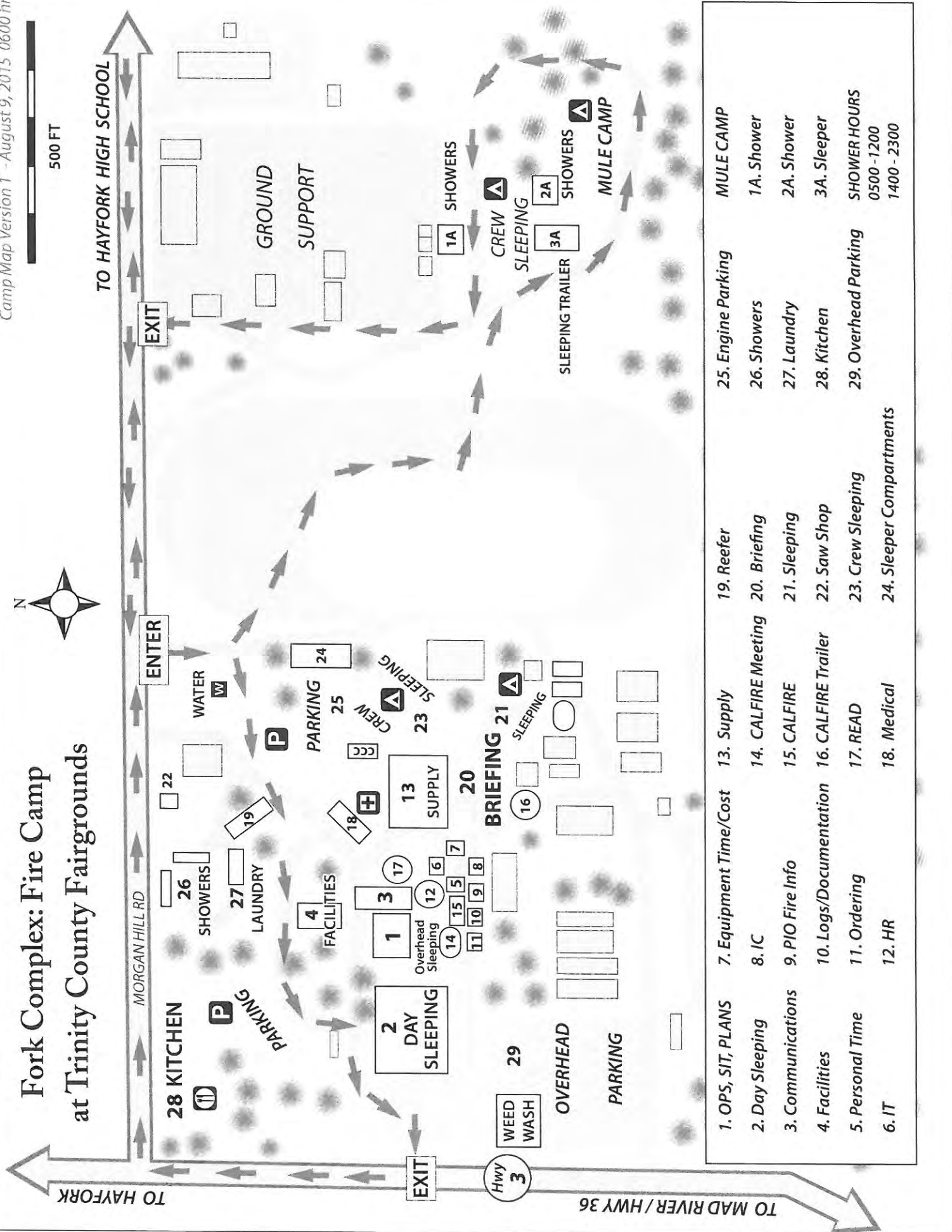
