


WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will persist over California and the eastern Pacific on Monday and will cause a thermal trough to position itself over the area. This will cause hot and dry conditions, and an offshore flow will keep skies clear. This will also lead to gusty northeast winds during the overnight and morning hours, and poor relative humidity recoveries in the mountains.

WEATHER FORECAST for Monday:

WEATHER: Clear, but smoky.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURES: 88 – 95 degrees valleys...80 – 87 degrees ridges.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 20 – 25 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – East 10 to 18 mph with gusts to 30 mph in the morning, becoming west 4 to 9 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Downvalley 10 to 15 mph, becoming upslope/upvalley 3 to 8 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 4 (low).


STABILITY/INVERSION: Mixing height 8500 feet msl.

OUTLOOK for Monday Night: Clear, but smoky. Low temperatures 60 – 65 degrees and maximum relative humidity 30 – 50%. East winds 8 to 15 mph with gusts to 25 mph. Haines Index: 4. Thermal belt 4000 – 5000 feet msl.

OUTLOOK for Tuesday: Clear, but smoky. Highs temperatures 80 – 91 degrees and minimum relative humidity 21 – 26%. East winds 4 to 8 mph, shifting west in the afternoon. Mixing height: 8500 feet msl. Haines Index: 4.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Warm and dry conditions will persist through next weekend. However, a low pressure trough to the north will bring better onshore flow Tuesday through Thursday, allowing overnight relative humidity recoveries to show some improvement.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Continued warming and drying brings excellent burning conditions. Inversion may delay the start to the burn period. Expect low to moderate activity under the inversion. Be aware of indicators that the inversion is lifting, air becoming clear, fire activity increasing. Once the inversion lifts, conditions are present to allow for a significant increase in activity. Steepening slopes above 35% will also provide an uptick in activity due to convection. Spotting becomes a concern as brush understory becomes involved.

With line construction in incomplete burns, be positive that you are exposing the black edge and getting all the hot ash and embers inside your line.

SPECIFIC:

Timber Understory: Fire behavior in the Understory models could begin early. Warmer and drier conditions will expand the burn window, once the inversion lifts. Expect more involvement of the understory brush and shrubs with increased intensity.

ROS: 10 to 16 ch/hr.

FL: 8 to 11 ft.

Timber Litter: Timber Litter fire behavior may be active early. Increased consumption of heavier fuels and understory may provide additional material for spots and roll out. Stay aware of rollout and upslope runs through incomplete burns.

ROS: 7 to 13 ch/hr.

FL: 4 to 5 ft.

Spotting becomes a concern with improved burn conditions. Know where your smoke is going and check for fallout.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Strong winds early may hamper aircraft. Strong winds may limit effectiveness of aerial assets.

SAFETY

Inversion breaks can lead to sudden increases in fire behavior. Pay attention to weather readings and other indicators that the inversion may be lifting or breaking.

2. If life threatening, then request that the designated frequency be cleared for emergency traffic.
3. Identify the on-scene Point of Contact (POC) by resource and last name (i.e POC is TFLD Smith).
4. Identify nature of incident, number injured, patient assessment(s) and location (geographic and GPS coordinates).
5. Identify on-scene medical personnel by position and name (i.e EMT Jones).
6. Identify preferred method of patient transport.
7. Request any additional resources and/or equipment needed
8. Document all information received and transmitted on the radio or phone.
9. Identify any changes in the on-scene Point of Contact or medical personnel as they occur.

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Incident within an Incident Action Plan

When the scope or complexity of the emergency exceeds division resource needs

This plan is designed to identify the initial actions that should be taken by the first arriving personnel on a serious accident. This person may be a single resource, engine boss, or a crew boss. Accidents or incidents within an incident happen rapidly and require sound, calm initial decisions to handle the problem, while still focusing on the main incident. The following checklist provides some key thoughts and actions.

The first arriving person to any accident should notify their Division Supervisor, or the Div Sup assigned to that location.

Advise of the critical information needed:

- Accident scene safety assessment and advise incoming personnel
- Number of injuries and their severity
- Special equipment needs (extrication, low/high angle rescue, fire protection or suppression)
- Assist the injured as necessary without endangering yourself or other personnel
- Do not move trauma victims unless their safety is in jeopardy
- Utilize PINK pages of the Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) for patient assessment/medical procedures

Remain aware of surroundings and delegate personnel to monitor the main fire

The Division Supervisor will assume command of the accident/incident scene upon arrival. The following list outlines the general duties and tasks that should be completed on most accidents/incidents.

1. Delegate division oversight to another Division Supervisor or other qualified person.
2. Request a clear frequency from Comm and consider switching to designated Emergency Tactical (Incident Comm will notify the MEDL who will initiate the medical plan for injuries)
3. Order/delegate resources appropriate for the accident/incident (crew EMT's, Line EMT's or Line Medics, rescue equipment, patient transport needs, manpower)
4. Notify Operations Section Chief and Safety Officer on all accidents/incidents.
5. Begin to document the event accurately and completely. Use ICS form 201 if the event is large or complex.
6. Protect the scene for Investigators

Division Supervisor

- See items 1-6 on page one
- If unable to access accident/incident location, delegate command to a closer qualified resource.

Medical Unit Leader

- Respond to Comm Unit as soon as possible
- Coordinate with Division Supervisor to ensure proper resources are rapidly ordered
- Assign a MEDL to the scene and other positions to support the response as needed
- Monitor condition updates of patient(s) and coordinate response with Operations

Communications Unit Leader

- Maintain clear radio traffic and monitor communications to support response
- Recommend appropriate security and investigative process
- Assess the need for critical Incident Stress Response

Safety Officer

- Provide for Safety personnel on scene as needed
- Recommend appropriate security and investigative process
- Assess the need for critical Incident Stress Response

Air Attack Supervisor

- Obtain coordinates of the emergency location
- Coordinate air-medical response
- Assist and support the designated Point of Contact with communications and coordination of the emergency response as necessary

IC, Command & General Staff

- Manage the emergency and direct specific responsibilities to individual positions to provide an appropriate response
- Notify the host unit and host dispatch center of the size-up information
- Constantly monitor and assess the appropriate response and adapt direction as needed
- Submit all documentation pertaining to the emergency to the Plans Chief
